1. Military court of inquiry was constituted to investigate and report on certain happenings which occurred on Saturday, 5 August, 1944, at camp 12 b situated at Cowre, New South Wales, in which 1104 other ranks Japanese POW were held.
2. Members of court were as follows: President: Colonel F. H. Christison, members: Lt-colonel. D. T. Moore, Major P. F. Dawson, Major H. S. Williams.
3. Court assembled at Cowre on Monday 7 August, 1944, and sat continuously until Tuesday, 15 August, 1944, during which time evidence of sixty witnesses

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- was taken.
4. At direction of court notice in Japanese was promulgated to Japanese POW group inviting attend before court and give evidences should they wish to do so.
 - As result of this action 7 Japanese POW tendered evidences to court.
 5. Circumstances of happenings, as disclosed by evidence before court, are as follows: 1. At approximately 0150 hours on Saturday, 5 August, 1944, unauthorised bugle call was heard in camp b and immediately there after upwards of ninehundred POW rushed with loud shouts from their huts and attacked fences of their compound.
 2. Large parties of them broke through fence on perimeter of camp in two places. Another party broke through fence separating their compound from internal camp road.
 3. Before reaching from their huts POW set fire to them.
 4. POW had armed themselves with large assortment of weapons,

Including knives, (among them more than 1000 mess knives, many of which had been specially prepared for use as weapons of offense by being ground down, pointed and sharpened or serrated), swords fashioned from dismantled bread cutter, baseballbats and improvised clubs.

5. Pow wore baseball and other specially prepared gloves, towels and pads of toilet paper with which they protected their hands while negotiating barbed wire fences, and three blankets over wire to facilitate making breaks therein. Many of pow were wearing 2 or 3 sets of clothing, had towels wound round their bodies, and were carrying lengths of rope which they has manufactured from rice sacks.

6. Party which broke through into internal road divided into groups, one of which rushed gates at north end of road, other attempted to overpower guard at south end of road, forced open Gates on internal road of compound containing POW of Korean and Formosan races and also Gates of compound containing Japanese officers POW. Approximately 50 multineers

succeeded in entering officers' compound, and remained there until apprehended at daybreak.

7. Attacks on Gates at each end of road were resisted and frustrated by fire. As a result some POW remained hid in storm drains beside road until daybreak when they were apprehended and marched back to their compound.

8. Of POW who broke through outside perimeter fence, one group attacked and killed Australian crew of Vickersgun outside camp and attempted to infiltrate lines of guard company to north of camp. These were fired on and were thus prevented from using gun.

9. Others attacked lines of guard company to south of camp. They were prevented by fire from effecting their purpose.

10. Other, to number of approximately 70 took up tactical position on a hill overlooking military headquarter, and still others dispersed across countryside.

11. As soon as it was light the wounded found in internal road and outside,

- camp were taken to camp hospital and received immediate medical attention.
12. At daybreak also inspection of interior of camp was made. Twenty buildings had been burned to ground and only two sleeping huts, together with messhuts, kitchens and ablution huts remained. Eight POW were found hanged in buildings and incinerated remains of 12 others were found in ruins.
13. After daybreak deceased POW were gathered and laid out for identification on a mortuary ground outside camp.
14. During these days 5 August patrols of Australian military forces personnel armed only with side arms and commanded by officers entirely unarmed moved into surrounding country side to search for escaped. At approximately 1730 hours a party of escaped POW brutally attacked an Australian military forces officer with knives and clubs and murdered him. Thereafter these patrols were provided with firearms.
15. During ensuing 9 days, 354 escaped POW were retaken, of whom 25 were

- dead. Of these latter, 11 were found hanging from trees, 2 had committed suicide by placing themselves before a railway train, and others bore signs of having been stabbed by knives carried by POW.
16. On morning of 9 August, 1944, body of POW Yoshi Oshimoyama who died of strangulation, was carried out of camp by other POW, with a rope round his neck.
17. At 0900 hours on Monday, 14 August, 1944, total casualties sustained by Japanese POW were as follows: 1 officer killed, 230 other ranks killed or died to wounds or died by suicide, 1 officer wounded, 10 other ranks wounded.
18. Funeral of deceased Japanese officer was attended by Australian military forces officers of senior rank, by 2 Japanese officers and 4 Japanese other ranks acting as pallbearers. The Japanese dead were assembled in mortuary field for examination by Australian Government medical officers as to causes of death. Every care was taken to identify bodies with official records and photographs. Confirmation of every

Identification was made by one or more of a party of Japanese POW who assisted in preparing bodies of burial. The dead were buried with all due respect and reverence in war cemetery, Gowra.

19. Casualties suffered by Australian military forces personnel were as follows: 1 officer killed, 3 other ranks killed, 4 other ranks wounded.

20. On 5 August Japanese officers in camp 12 D submitted to group commandant a letter/stating that they had assist in incident amongst other ranks and requesting death by shooting. On other hand, as evidenced by a note found in the detention cell occupied by Sgt. Major Kanazawa, former camp leader of camp 12 B, five other Japanese officers then held in detention conspired together to instruct Sgt. Major Kanazawa as to statement he should make subsequent inquiry into circumstances surrounding incident.

After considence before it court submitted its finding, which is summarized below: 1. Conditions obtaining at camp prior to the mutiny of

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which the course and details have been set out above were exemplary and fully in accordance with the provision of the Geneva International Convention relative to treatment POW of 1929.

2. Housing, bedding, sanitary and washing arrangements were completely satisfactory being similar to the facilities provided for Australian troops. Rations were on a liberal scale, being equivalent to those supplied to guards, but commuted to meet dietary preferences of POW.

3. Camp was at all times open for inspection by representatives of protecting power and International Red Cross who have had access thereon and freedom to interview POW without presence of officers of detaining power when they so desired. Occupants of camp were all members of Japanese forces who had been taken. No civilian Japanese was interned in camp.

4. No complaints concerning their treatment had been made by or on behalf of POW to camp commandant immediately prior to mutiny.

5. Mutiny was carried out according to plan premeditated and concerted

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- by POW in camp B. Objective of plan was to overthrow security of group of POW camps and to sell their own lives in suicidal combat.
6. Time at which plan was to be put into execution was decided at approximately 2400 hours on 8 August, 1944, at a meeting secretly held in camp.
7. Leaders of meeting were camp leader of camp B Sgt. Major Kanazawa, assistant camp leader Sgt. Kojima Masao (deceased) former camp leader Sgt. pilot Minami (deceased) and other camp or hut leaders of names unknown.
8. Firing began immediately after POW commenced to escape across fences surrounding camp.
9. a. Firing was directed on A. POW who had mutinied and were in act of escaping across camp fences; b. POW having escaped were advancing to attack guards; c. POW who having escaped were forcibly breaking into or had broken into POW officers compound.
10. Fire was not directed on huts in officers' compound, and no casualties

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- occurred therein.
3. Fire was not directed on any POW who remained in camp B of whom there were at least 118 during course of mutiny.
10. Firing was necessary. But for its use, overwhelming numbers escaping and escaped POW armed with lethal weapons would have been able quickly to overpower guard, secure garrison weapons and fire arms and use them against garrison troops with considerable loss of life to military personnel and possibly civilian population of the nearby township of Coitra. Fanaticism evidenced by suicidal mass attacks on garrisons armed posts rendered firing necessary while escaped POW continued to attack and having regard to nature of these attacks casualties among POW cannot be considered excessive.
11. Firing was controlled and not excessive. Firing ceased at earliest possible moment after control of camp was assured.
12. In no case was an escaped prisoner of war fired on after recaptured

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nor is there any evidence of illegitimate use of force ^{during the} during the capture of escaped POW by Australian military forces patrols.

13. Of 231 dead Japanese it is found that 20 died by hanging and strangulation inflicted by Japanese on themselves or on one another, 9 by suicide from stabbing, 2 by suicide under a train, 5 from combination of self-inflicted wounds and gunshot wounds and 12 from cause unknown but whose bodies were found in huts burnt by Japanese. 16 of the wounded showed evidence of attempted suicide.

14. Arrangements for medical treatment of casualties sustained were entirely satisfactory. Wounded Japanese received earliest possible attention and great credit is reflected on British medical staff.

15. Damage caused to buildings, clothing and equipment at camp amounted to 19000 pounds.

Reporting on the attempted escape, the government in Canberra issued today a statement by Prime Minister Curtin. Here is his full statement:

JAPANESE LOSSES: GIVEN IN COMMUNIQUE

(First part missed) 54,379 abandoned dead, 19,400 are estimated dead or buried by the enemy, 493 prisoners, 20,000 estimated troop losses at sea, and 9,890 naval (losses or mortals). The communique said that in the course of the campaign, 41 enemy transports of the total tonnage of ---- tons, 27 warships were sunk, 2,728 Japanese planes destroyed, 1,515 by land-based planes and anti-aircraft fire and 1,232 by carrier-borne from the Sulu Sea.

Admiral Sir Bruce Fraser, commander of the British Fleet in the Pacific has returned to Australia, after interviewing Admiral Nimitz. He said today that the meeting was most (cordial), and had resulted in complete agreement. He added that General MacArthur would make further arrangements. He has travelled a 1,000 miles per day for the past 15 days.

BRITISH FIGHTING PERSONNEL: EXCEEDS MILLION

The British High Commissioner in Australia, Sir Ronald (Crock), disclosed last night that the total strength of the British and Empire forces now engaged in the war, was approximately 1,250,000 men. If all who have engaged in the war since its outbreak were counted the figure would exceed 10 million. Of this number, more than seven million have been equipped exclusively by Britain.

During a tour of Australian training centers and prisoner of war camp at the week end Army Minister, Frank Forde, inspected the camp in which 900 Japanese recently mutinied and where 231 of them were killed.

In all prisoner of war camps he visited, Mr. Forde found conditions fully in accordance with the International Convention. Accommodation and rations were provided on a same scale as the Australian troops, and the camps were at all times open for inspection by the protective power and the International Red Cross delegates.

Mr. Forde said that inspections were made at frequent intervals. The commanding officers and their staffs treated the prisoners of war justly but firmly.

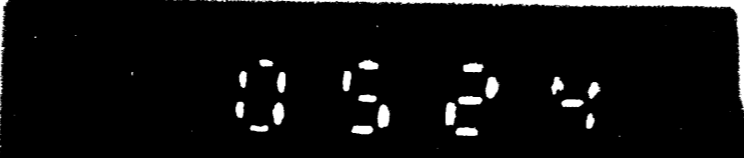
