

His Britannic Majesty's Embassy present their compliments to the Imperial Japanese Minister for Foreign Affairs and with reference to the Embassy's Note No. 138 of the 19th October, 1925 respecting the permanent establishment of the period of summer time in Great Britain, North Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, has the honour to state that the information contained therein should be amended to read as follows:

"The Summer Time Acts 1922-25 provide that summer time shall begin each year at 2.00 o'clock Greenwich mean time, in the morning of the day following the third Saturday in April or, if that day is Easter Day/
