#### NEW OLYMPIC STADIUM PLAN FINALLY DECIDED

It has been decided that the main stadium for the XIIth Olympic Games, Tokyo, 1940, will be newly constructed at Komazawa, as stated in the previous issue of "Olympic News." The task of designing the stadium and surveying the site are being carried on speedily. The Tokyo Municipality has officially approved the plans for this construction at their municipal assembly held on May 23rd, 1938. The final step before the start of the construction has been thus completed by this unanimous consent. The budget alloted for the various projects are as follows:-



The start and finish of the construction have been planned as follows:-The Main Stadium:---To be started October 1938 and completed during July 1940.

Olympic Gymnasium :--To be immediately started and completed during September 1939. Cycling Stadium :--To be started January 1939 and completed during March 1940. Olympic Village:--

The Olympic village being located near the main stadium will not arouse the complaints that were experienced during the XIth Olympic Games, Berlin, 1936, but some people may think its location will not be suitable for the quiet rest of the athletes. So the Olympic Organizing Committee has taken these points into full consideration to ensure undisturbed rest for the participating athletes by allowing a spacious area for the village and planting large trees to isolate it from all the commotion of the crowd.

#### Extensive Publicity Programme Resolved

It has been decided to work out large scale Olympic propaganda through the publicity department of the Olympic Organizing Committee with the agreement of the advisory committee for Olympic Publicity. The achievements of the publicity department to this date are listed as follows:-

#### Scientific Equipment Research Committee.

Monthly meetings have been held under the leadership of Dr. Ishimoto, and is composed of forty-nine authorities in the various fields of scientific research for the organization of the XIIth Olympiad Tokyo and the Vth Olympic Winter Games Sapporo. The Committee work is divided into the following special lines of research:

- 1. Broadcasting Department.
- 2. Distance Surveying Department.
- 3. Sound Department.

During the eight meetings of this Committee, all questions referred to it by the various Sport Federations, have been studied and carefully discussed. These questions include the following:

- 3. Motion picture device to be used for facilitating close decisions at the finish line.
- 4. Announcement Board facilities.
- 5. Type of turf to be used for the Stadium field

- 7. Apparatus to prevent waves in the swimming pool.
- 8. Apparatus to facilitate decisions in fencing.
- Measuring the effect of the wind velocity on the runner.
- Details of the Main Bulletin Board- names,
   number, nationality, records and other notices.
- it. Rapid reporting device for use in the field.
- 12. Timing apparatus.
- 13. Device for recording the time during the course of a race.
- 14. Study of the white line.
- 15. Best kind of sand for the jumping pits.

- Desirability of applying "Cathetometer" for the High Jump measure.
- 17. Desirability of applying a "Range Finder" on the Javelin throw measure.
- Installation of apparatus for measuring atmospheric pressure; also anemometer and hygrometer.
- Best methods of illuminating the field, dressing rooms and stands.
- 20. Loud-speaker installation-amplifiers for both track and stands, for the athlete's and officials' rooms. Also an investigation of the best position for the transmitter and loudspeakers.
- 21. Investigation of increasing the visibility of the marks on the steel measuring tapes.
- Installation of an electric recording device connecting the start and finish of the Bobsleigh Course (about 200 meters difference in altitude).
- 23. Installation of electric time measuring device connecting the start and finish of the Downhill Ski Race Course. The special conditions to be considered include:
- a. The temperature at the start is considerably colder than at the finish. At the start is may be 20 degrees below zero Centigrade.

#### Support from the Principal Cities.


In order that every possible effort may be exerted for the ultimate success of the XIIth Olympic Games Tokyo 1940, the City of Tokyo has recently taken a more positive attitude and has sent representatives to Yokohama, Osaka, Kyoto, Kobe, Nagoya and Hiroshima to negotiate with and secure the assistance of these six principal cities.

The delegates from the Tokyo Municipal Office included Mr. E. Isomura, General Secretary of Tokyo City, Mr. S. Kuwahara, member of the O.O.C., and Assembly members Abe and Kato, who left Tokyo on February 19th to visit these various cities where they gave detailed information concerning the progress of preparations for the coming Olympic Games and enlisted further support of the Games from these cities. The municipal offices of each of the cities have sent words of encouragement and reassurance of their support to Prof. Kano, I.O.C. member and representative of the O.O.C., and Mr. Nakatsuka of the Tokyo Municipal Office, who are attending the Cairo Session.

#### Japan's Winter Sports Candidates Selected.

The 1938 Ski, Skating and Bobsleigh National Championship Meets, which were held in Sapporo on the site of the Vth Olympic Winter Games, proved that the site will be very satisfactory. It is felt, therefore, that with the present facilities, the Vth Olympic Winter Games can be carried out without any difficulty. Further preparations, however, are being steadily carried on in order to assure a most successful celebration in 1940. Furthermore, the plans for the coming year include sponsoring the Ski, Skating and Bob-sleigh contests from February 3rd to the 14th, a period of 12 days which correspond to the schedule set for the Vth Olympic Winter Games Sapporo in 1940. The Ski Association and the Skating Union of Japan selected their Olympic candidates immediately after the National Championship Meets as follows:--

#### The Cycling Stadium Construction to Start.

The construction of the Cycling Stadium in preparation for the XIIth Olympic Games Tokyo 1940 will be started in April, at Shibaura by the Tokyo City with an approximate budget of 600,000 yen. The proposed Cycling Stadium with a 500 metre track will surround a Track and Field ground with a 400 metre track, the general seating capacity of which is estimated at 10,000. The Cycling Road Race course is located on the Nakasendo Course (National Highway No. 9) in Saitama Prefecture. The de-tails of the Cycling Stadium and the Road Race Course are as follows:—


#### Ministery of Welfare Established.

#### Tokyo Bay.

Yokohama, the main gateway of Japan will become a famous yachting center of the Orient. The harbour will shelter about three hundred boats. A crane for measuring purposes and two slipways for making repairs will be provided. For administration and press service a clubhouse will be erected on the shore.

### Summary of General Secretary's International Broadcast Speech.

Recent news dispatches from this part of the world seem to have been giving a more or less militant and provocative impression abroad, and we greatly regret that, consciously or unconsciously, the public abroad may have been persuaded by some of the alarming and inaccurate information that the Japanese people are no longer interested in anything which has to do with the peaceful attainments of mankind.

Our people are ready to respond to any call, no matter how hard it may be, which will help in the restoration and establishment of a durable and equitable peace in the East, and they are determined not to suspend the present movement till the final solution of the problems involved is reached. At the same time, it will be of interest to realize that one notices but few changes, if any, in the ordinary life of the people at large from that of ordinary times. Foreign visitors are, without exception, impressed by the order and tranquillity which characterizes the everyday life of our people. Commerce and industry are proceeding in a normal way, trade shows no tendencies of depression, agricultural needs are being provided for, and recreational resorts and places of wholesome amusement are being frequented by the people as usual. Sports of all kinds are continuing to provide health and vigor to multitudes of our youth, while the spectators at the numerous athletic contests are as eager and responsive as ever to the thrill of physical competition and friendly

The spirit and enthusiasm with which our people are looking forward to the XIIth Olympiad Tokyo 1940 gives ample testimony to this fact. The Xth Olympiad in Los Angeles was followed by that of Berlin, and it is but natural perhaps that, as Europe followed America, Asia should come next. In 1932 at Los Angeles, Japan expressed the hope of being


host to the Games in 1940, and at Berlin in 1936 the final decision to hold the XIIth Olympiad in Tokyo was made by the International Olympic Committee. The attainment of this great desire in so short a time is a sign of the general confidence in Japan by the whole athletic world, and we fully intend to prove ourselves worthy of that honour and confidence. In awarding these Games to Tokyo, due recognition has been given to the conviction that the spirit of the modern Olympics must expand and permeate to the four corners of the earth, thus benefiting and elevating the ideals and lives of all the peoples concerned.

With regard to the sporting facilities and equipment, Tokyo even today is not lacking in structures adequately and appropriately fitted for international competition. These include the Stadium for Track and Field contests at the Meiji Shrine Outer Gardens, the Swimming Pool which is considered the best in the whole Orient, the Baseball Grounds with a seating capacity of over 60,000 people, as well as the indoor athletic gymnasiums. In case of necessity, all these would provide sufficient facilities, as they are, for holding the Olympic Games. In order, however, to fully meet all expectations, a budget of fifteen million yen is now being raised to adequately prepare in a larger way. The Japanese government has already granted its first annual installment of Yen 750,000. toward the preparatory expenses, and the City of Tokyo has likewise shown its hearty support by definite financial assitance. With this definite financial assurance, plans are being pushed for the enlargement of the Stadium to accommodate 80,000 spectators, and the Swimming Pool will be enlarged to provide a seating capacity of 30,000.

There have been occasional rumors to the effect that, because of the present disturbances in this part of the world, Japan might have to abandon her responsibility at the last moment. But, as I stated at the outset, the people of Japan are leading an ordinary and tranquil life, and there is no reason, why Japan should even consider stopping the active preparations for 1940. Some pessimists may consider that the financial difficulties which may appear as an aftermath of the troubles in China will cause unsurmountable hardships for our nation and people. In reply, I would say that every possible precaution is being taken by our financers and statesmen to ward off any such emergency. Already their efforts in this direction have been effective, as is seen in the normal financial and economic conditions of the country at the end of the year which has just come to a close. These serve to encourage us as we whole-heartedly proceed with the preparations for a most successful Olympiad in 1940. But, some may ask finally, what if the situation in China develops in an even worse way? Our answer is, as already indicated above, that even our present equipment, with certain comparatively modest but necessary alterations and improvements, would be quite sufficient for holding the Olympic Games in full keeping with the true spirit of the modern Olympics.


GENERAL RULES AND PROGRAMME PUBLISHED.

The first edition of the book containing the General Rules and Programme for the XIIth Olympic Games Tokyo 1940, on which the Olympic Organizing Committee has been hard at work, was completed by the end of January. This edition is printed in English, German and French, and follows the general size, style and color of the standard set at the Xth Olympiad in Los Angeles. The present edition has been printed on a special Japanese paper and its beautiful binding combines to give it a very attractive appearance.

Copies have been sent to the various Sports Federations and to the National Olympic Committees of the different nations. The Japanese representatives to the Cairo Session of the I.O.C. have also taken copies of this preliminary edition for presentation to the members of the I.O.C. and for the purpose of securing their reaction to this edition.

Preparations for the publication of a second edition have been started, and present indications are that an even better edition than the first will be completed in the near future.

The delegates to the I.O.C. meeting have also taken with them a number of special pamphlets which will be of help in showing the members the preparations which have been made for holding the XIIth Olympiad. Among these is a general pamphlet describing the actual conditions of the preparations for the Games. This constitutes a worthy example of Japan's artistic beauty and printing. The cover design was painted by one of Japan's well-known artists. The booklet contains 31 pages and is fully illustrated with descriptive and artistic photographs. A copy of this pamphlet, which is entitled, "We call the youth of the world—XIIth Olympiad Tokyo 1940," will gladly be sent upon request.

#### REDUCTION IN RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP FARES

For European athletes participating in the Tokyo Olympic Games, there are the following three routes by which to reach Tokyo:

By boat via the Mediterranean Sea and Indian Ocean.

Across the Atlantic Ocean by boat, across the North America by train, and again by boat across the Pacific.

(3) By the Siberian and Manchurian railways.

For participants from countries other than European, there are the South American, Australian

and other lines.

As the railway and steamship fares for the athletes and officials will amount to a considerable sum, and will be a great burden on the organizations who are responsible for sending the representatives to the XIIth Olympiad Tokyo, the Organizing Committee is negotiating with various railway and steamship companies concerning the reduction in fares on their respective lines. Mr. Klingeberg, technical adviser to the Todyo Olympic Games, has also conferred with various organizations on this question on his way to Japan, and the Nippon Yusen Kaisha is also carrying on regentiations with other steamship companies. negotiations with other steamship companies.

As the result of these efforts, the following reductions were decided to be placed in force for

the benefit of Olympic participants.

European steamship lines (via Mediterranean Sea and Indian Ocean) Single ticket, 20% reduction; return ticket, about 21% reduction.
 For through tickets via Atlantic Ocean, America and Pacific Ocean

A. Atlantic Ocean

Single, about 40% reduction;
Round Trip, about 40-45% reduction
B. Railway lines across North America Single, about 5% reduction; Round Trip, about 5% reduction.

C. Pacific Ocean

Single, about 32% reduction; Round Trip, about 37% reduction.

(3) South American lines

Single, about 15% reduction; Return, about 21% reduction.

On the Siberian route, for passengers travelling in groups of over ten members, reductions ranging from 25 to 50 per cent—i.e. 25% for 10-24 persons, 30% for 25-49, 40% for 50-99, 50% for over 100—are in force on various lines participating in the through transportation of passengers from Europe to Japan and vice versa. As regards reductions on the Australian steamship lines, a reduction similar to those on the European lines will be placed in force. As soon as all the negotiations are settled, the Organizing Committee will publish a pamphlet giving detailed lists of the reductions.

Beside the reductions in railway and steamship fares, the Organizing Committee is considering various other measures to lighten the financial burden of the participating athletes and officials.

#### Olympic Games arouse interest in Hellenism

Since the selection of Tokyo as the site of the XIIth Olympic Games, keen interest has been aroused in Japan on Hellenism, and studies on ancient Greece in general, and on old Olympic Games in particular, have become extremely popular. Many Japanese sportsmen have made special trips to Athens to visit the Delphi Temple and other places reminiscent of the aucient Marathon races. Many books, too, are being published in Japanese on the subject of Olympic Games of old.

Among noted persons who have visited Greece recently are Professor Osamu Miyabara of the Peers' School and Isamu Kawai, formerly Honorary Secretary of the Amateur Athletic Federation of Japan. Professor Miyabara's visit was made several years ago, and Mr. Kawai's visit was made immediately prior to the Berlin Games when he was a special

prior to the Berlin Games when he was a special correspondent of the Tokyo Asahi. More recently, Professor Shinjiro Honryo of Waseda University

(captain of the Waseda rugby team in 1927) who is now in Germany, made a tour of Greece in October, 1937, and his travel diary which appeared serially in the Tokyo Nichi Nichi received favourable comments from vorious quarters. The Organizing Committee plans to send a representative to Greece shortly before the I. O. C. Session at Belgrade in 1939 to visit the site of the ancient Olympic Games.

Among the most recent publications on the subject of Olympics are the translation by Professor Miyabara of Captain E.A.M. Webster's "Evolution of the Olympic Games"; translation of Barton Pierrede Coubertin's "Souvenir de l'Olympique" prepared by the Japan Amateur Athletic Association; and the reports on the Berlin Olympic Games, also published by the same Association. Mention must also be made of the three widely read publications of be made of the three widely read publications of Mr. Yoshinori Suzuki on the staff of the Sports Department of the Organizing Committee: "An Introduction to the Olympic Games"; "History of the old and modern Olympic Games"; "Guide to the Olympic Games".

# GAMES TOKYO OLYMPIC XIIth THE OF PROGRAMME

The programme of the XIIth Olympic Games Tokyo 1940, which had been drawn up by the Sports Department of the Organizing Committee was completed early in December. This programme is based mainly on that of the XIIth Olympic Games Berlin, at the same time taking into consideration suggestions made by international sport federations. It will be submitted to the I.O.C. Session to be held at Cairo next March for official approval.

According to the programme, the Opening Ceremony will be held on 24th of August, the Games will be held over the period of fifteen days commencing on 25th, and the Closing Ceremony on 8th of September.

At the I.O.C. Session, held at Warsaw in July 1937, the question of including Canoeing and Handball was left undecided, However, as the participation of over five countries in these two items was guaranteed by two international sport federations by the middle of December, they are expected to be included in the programme of the Tokyo Olympic Games with the approval of the Cairo Session of the I.O.C.

The Track and Field events will be held at the Olympic Stadium, Swimming at the Olympic Pool nearby, Wrestling, Weight-lift and Boxing at Kokugi-kan Amphitheatre, Fencing at two places, namely Kokumin Taiikukan (Education Gymnasium) and Ocha-no-mizu, Stocking at Kokugi-kan Amphitheatre, Fencing and Arakawa rowing courses, Football at the Olympic Stadium on Ath and 6th of September, Memorial Gymnasium and Meiji Jingu Basketball court (outdoor), Handball at the Olympic Stadium on 4th and 6th of September, and Rowing on Toda course in Saitama prefecture. For track races in Cycling, Shibaura cycling stadium will be used, and Nakasendo course for road races. The dressage tests in the Equestrian Sports will be held at Setagaya Equestrian Stadium.

#### Art Exhibition Reflects Physical Culture


The First National Art Exhibition under the auspices of the Department of Education opened on October 16th and lasted till November 20th, in the Tokyo Art Gallery in the

RINTED IN JAPAN PRIMÉ AU JAPON N JAPAN GEDRUCKT Radio Broadcasting at the XIIth Olympics

The Berlin Olympics was the first occasion on which radio broadcasting was employed extensively to convey abroad the general atmosphere of the Games and the actual proceedings of the events. The favourable results of broadcasting and advantage of radio must be plain to those who listened in to the broadcasting from Berlin.

Twenty-one countries sent their representative

announcers to the Winter Games at Garmisch-Partenkirchen, and about one hundred announcers and their assistants representing thirty-two countries from all over the world attended the Berlin Olympics in order to broadcast the news to their home

As soon as the decision was made to award the next Games to Tokyo, the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan set about making preparations for the overseas broadcasting at the coming Olympics. Members of the Corporation who were then in Berlin were given orders to make investigations, and the Preparatory Committee of Olympic Broadcasting has been established composed of the heads of the Bureaus and Departments concerned in the Corporation. At the same time, the Corporation has been keeping a close touch with the Preparatory Committee established in the Department of Communication, the governmental department which superintends radio broadcasting, and preparations. tions and researches are rapidly proceeding to fulfil

Meanwhile, the Broadcasting Corporation dispatched letters, in May 1937, to sixty-two broadcasting corporations all over the world enquiring whether they would send representative announcers to the Tokyo Olympics to broadcast the proceedings of the Games to their respective countries. By the end of September, replies have arrived from the N.B.C. and C.B.S. in the United States and N.B.C. and C.B.S. in the United States and broadcasting corporations in Canada, Holland, Dutch East Indies, Hungary, Poland, Switzerland, Germany, Finland, Italy, England, Roumania, Australia and others, expressing their wish to take part in the broadcasting and send their announcers to Tolky. At a recent meeting of the Cabinet, the Government decided to include the sum of Yen 750,000 in the next year Budget to be approved by the Imperial Diet so that the government's share of the expenses required during the next fiscal year in preparing for the Tokyo Olympics be met. The same amount was given last year by the Government as its share of the expenditures of the current fiscal year. These sums are portions of the total of Yen 4,300,000 which the Government had indicated as its subsidy for the 1940 Olympics.

As Japan is surrounded by sea on all sides, the short-wave radio system must be used for the broadcasting from Tokyo, unlike Berlin and other European cities. Accordingly, the transmitter and antenna of the Nazaki Transmitting Station in Ibaragi prefecture, owned by Kokusai Denwa Kaisha (International Telephone Service Company), which is at present used for short-wave broadcasting, must be improved and enlarged by the time of the Games.

The details of the proposed plans of improvement will be made known to all the countries concerned, as soon as they are decided upon, in collaboration with the Organizing Committee of the Tokyo

For queries concerning the overseas broadcasting, the Overseas Section of the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan, Tokyo, is ready to give prompt

The Broadcasting Corporation is also planning to give notices concerning the Games and a series of lectures on Japanese to the rest of the world by the present system of overseas broadcasting starting half a year or a year before the holding of the XIIth Olympic Games.

REDUCTION IN RAILWAY FARES FOR PARTICIPANTS IN THE TOKYO OLYMPICS

The attitude of the Japanese Government Railways towards the problem of reduction in fares on the government railway lines for the participating foreign athletes and officials and spectators from abroad on the occasion of the XIIth Olympic Games has long been attracting the attention of all concerned. The decision has now been reached as follows:

For foreign athletes and officials, 50% reduction will be made on all lines of the Government Railways during and a month before and after the Games. This reduction will cover all classes and all kinds of ticket (single, return and circular-tour tickets). Their hand baggage, parcels and goods will be transported free of charge. No provision will be made, however, for delivery. The reduction tickets will also be sold at the Japan Tourist Bureau, Thos. Cook & Son, Ltd., and American Express Co. at the same rate of reduction.

The athletes and officials will be provided, as at the Berlin Olympics, with free railway passes (2nd and 3rd class) valid on all electric trant lines in the Tokyo Region of the Government Railways during the Games. For foreign spectators, the following four kinds of special week-tickets, valid on all government lines excepting Shimonoseki-Fusan ferry-boat, will be sold between January 1st and October 31st in 1940.

Second-class fares will be twice the fares above quoted.

These tickets must be signed by the owners, and will be sold in connection with passports. They will also be sold at the Japan Tourist Bureau, Thos. Cook & Son, Ltd., and American Express Co. as well as at

Considerable reduction will be made on private lines for passengers who possess the week-tickets.

The Government Railways will further negotiate with Siberian Railway and various European railways concerning the connection and reduction in fares on their respective lines.


Dr. Ishimoto to leave for Italy as Exchange Professor.

Dr. Mishio Ishimoto, director of the Institute of Seismological Research in the Imperial University, Tokyo, has been chosen as exchange professor to Italy. Dr. Ishimoto has held important positions not only at the University but in organizations outside the university. He was the chairman of the Scientific Equipment Research Committee for the Olympic Games. He has long been a member of the council of the Amateur Swimming Federation of Japan. The Japanese swimming circles owe a great debt of gratitude to Dr. Ishimoto, for without his untiring efforts Japan would have never attained the eminent position she now holds in swimming.

. Dr. Ishimoto will leave Kobe on January 8th on the Yasukuni Maru, arriving in Napoli on February 7th. He will stay in Rome for a period of about three months during which time he will give lectures on seismology at the University of Rome. His plan includes also a field study of Italian volcanos. After his sojourn in Italy, he will tour various countries of Europe and is expected to return to Japan towards the end of June via the U. S. A.

#### General Wallenius visits Japan

Major General Kurt M. Wallenius, retired, of Finland visited Japan on his way to Shanghai. He was sent to this part of the world as a special war correspondent of the three largest newspapers in Finland, to despatch war news which would impartially depict the activities of the Japanese forces in China. While in Tokyo, he visited the office of the Olympic Organizing Committee. General Secretary Nagai of the Organizing Committee described to him the various preparations being made for the coming Olympics, and took him to see the various athletic fields in Tokyo. The General gave an interview to reporters in Tokyo, in which he denied the rumour that Finland had started to exert its efforts to have the XII Olympiad held in Finland on receipt of news which

The post of the presidency of the Japan Amateur Athletic Association, which has been vacant since the resignation of Lieutenant-General Matahiko Oshima, was filled on November 29 when the Council of the association recommended and ap-Council of the association recommended and ap-pointed Dr. Hiroshi Shimomura as the new presi-dent. Simultaneously with the appointment, Dr. Simomura assumes the vice-presidency of the Organizing Committee of the XIIth Olympiad Tokyo 1940.

The newly-elected President Hiroshi Shimomura, LL. D., a member of the House of Peers, was born in Wakayama Prefecture in 1875, and is now 63 years of age. Specialising in jurisprudence at the Tokyo Imperial University, Dr. Shimomura was even then a great lover of track and field events and swimming. After graduation, he found a position in the Departmet of Communications. He gradually rose in his official status, and was at one time Civil Governor of Formosa.

After retiring from official service, he toured through American and European countines. He was then made the Vice-President of the Asahi Shimbun, one of the foremost vernacular newspapers in Japan. He was in the post till 1936 and contributed much toward the progress of journalism in Japan.

Dr. Shimomura was one of the closest friends of the late Dr. Seiichi Kishi, ex-president of the J.A.A.A., and, on that account, was early connected with the association; in 1915 he was appointed a member of its Council; in 1921 was appointed a member of its Board of Directors; in 1924 he became its general secretary, and in the following year was appointed its superintendent when the Association underwent a thorough reorganisation. In February this year he became an adviser, and now he assumes his office as the new president of the association.

Dr. Hiroshi Shimomura is a recognised authority on financial and population problems. Under the pen name "Kainan" Dr. Shimomura has published many essays as well as collections of his "waka' (Japanese poem) pieces.

The task of celebrating the XII<sup>th</sup> Olympic Games will be the greatest ever given to a country, for it does not mean merely to pursue the Olympic Torch through the universe and to unite the whole of Asia with the modern Olympism in a most cordial manner, but also to combine Hellenism, the most precious civilization of ancient Europe, with the refined culture and art of Asia.

It is a most enjoyable thought to me to be able to promote the rapprochement of world interest.



#### Olympic Mark for Commercial Use

It has been decide, however, to specify a separate design to be used on commercial goods, such as souvenirs, associated with the Games, and the newly selected mark, which is a modification of one of the three which were awarded honourable mention at the competition, has recently been licensed at the Patent Bureau as a registered design of the Committee. The use of the registered mark is not open to public, and it is expected that the permission will be given to the applicants upon inspection of the goods.



#### Mr. W. Klingeberg Arrives in Japan

Mr. Werner Klingeberg who had charge of sport events at the Berlin Olympics, has accepted the position of technical adviser to the Tokyo Olympic Games. He was recommended to the post by the LO.C. After visiting the LA.A.F. headquarters in the various parts of Europe to confer with the different countries on matters relating to the Tokyo Olympics, Mr. Klingeberg travelled via the United States and arrived at Yohohama on October 29 on the N.Y.K. liner Chichibu Maru. Two foreign secretaries, Miss Hartmann and Miss Knoller, travelled via Suez and arrived at Kobe on October 13 on the Hakusan Maru. After a sightseeing tour through Osaka, Kyoto, and Nara, they arrived in Tokyo on October 20.

### Transportation Facilities to the Main Stadium

The site selected for the Main Stadium of the XIIth Olympic Games, Tokyo, is the Outer Garden of the Meiji Shrine, which is dedicated to Meiji Tenno, the most reverenced Emperor of the Japanese nation, and is situated in the western part of the city of Tokyo. As Japan's important athletic meetings are mostly held there, transportation facilities are well developed in its neighbourhood, radiating in all directions. From the Tokyo Station, the main entrance of the metropolis, the Stadium may be reached in 20—30 minutes by government or municipal electric lines, or by buses run by the municipality or private concerns, and 10 minutes by taxi.

With these traffic facilities, the maximum transportation capacity to accommodate visitors to athletic meetings held in the Outer Shrine is at present estimated at 136,000 persons per hour. In order to provide for a greatly increased number of visitors both from abroad and from the provinces expected on the occasion of the Olympic Games in 1940, however, all the transportation facilities concerned are taking active measures to meet the situation.

Of the above facilities, the government electric lines have the greatest transportation capacity, and can convey the largest number of passengers not only from various parts of the city, but also from that international port Yokohama and its vicinity. It is natural, therefore, that these government lines will bear the main burden of transportation in 1940, and plans of extending and reconstructing the two stations situated closest to the Main Stadium, Shinanomachi and Sendagaya, are well under way, so that by the time of the Games, they will be ready to accommodate with ease a far greater number of passengers. It is expected that an increase from the present 72,000 to 140,000 persons per hour will greatly improve the transportation capacity.

Alongside these extension plans of the governmental lines, other train and bus lines, municipal or private, are also making plans to increase the number of direct routes to the Stadium from various important points of the city by increasing the number of cars and altering certain operation systems. Moreover, a new underground railway between the centre of the city and the Stadium will shortly be opened. There are also plans of constructing new roads, eighteen in number, and 7,000 metres in their aggregate length, between the termini of the transportation systems and the Stadium, and from the Stadium on to the suburbs.

It should be plain, from the above plans, that by the time of the Olympic Games three years hence, means of communication to the Stadium will be in excellent order, and will provide every facility for the visitors to this great national event.

#### Statement of Dr. Takashi Goh, Chief of the Sports Department



I wish to take I wish to take this opportunity to reiterate our pre-vious statement to all those concerni-ed with or inter-ested in the Olym-pic Games who may be under the impression that, in view of the present impression that, in view of the present China Incident, the Tokyo Olym-pic Games stand in danger of aban-donment. #### Tokyo Olympic Posters chosen


The judging of posters for the Tokyo Olympics submitted in the competition held under the auspices of the Organizating Committee took place at the Committee's offices on September 24th at 2 o'clock p. m. in the presence of Baron Morimura, President of the Japan Association of Arts in Physical Culture. the members of the jury of award, Dr. Nagai, General Secretary of the Organizing Committee, and others. Out of 1992 entries, one for the first place, and two and three for the second and third places respectively were selected after an elaborate judging.

What great expectations are entertained of the Tokyo Olympic Games may be conjectured from the enthusiasm shown by the entrants, one of them having sent in his work from Paris, and from the characteristic features which marked the designs of the posters entered for this competition.

As the year 1940, the year in which the Olympic Games will be held, will coincide with the 2,600th anniversary of the founding of the Japanese Empire, the exaltation of national spirit and the international comity through the Olympic Games are admirably harmonized, while World Peace and the elevation of national health are equally stressed.

The design which won the first prize portrays a warrior dressed in ancient Japanese costume symbolizing the national spirit and the great many years which have elapsed since the founding of the Empire. He stands under the branches of an oak tree with a bow in his hand, and behind him is seen a distant view of Mt. Fuji. The whole picture is done in relief style in gold and the background is dark blue. It is the work of Mr. Norio Kuroda, a young artist living in Kyoto.



#### Planning of the Field

For the convenience of spectators, it is desirable to place the jumping fields in the Field proper, that is to say inside the Track. But, as Football matches will be played there, the two jumping fields are placed outside and on either side of the Track parallel to the stands. The one nearer to the Main Stand will be used for the final, and the other for climinating trials.

There are sand-pits at both ends of each of the jumping fields to provide for a change in the direction of the wind. The distance between the sand tion of the wind. The distance between the sand pits is 60 metres, allowing 40—50 meters as the standard length of a runway. The whole width of the runway is 7.20 metres, allocating 2.40 metres to each of the three events to be held there, namely, Pole Vault, Broad Jump, and Hop, Step and Jump. As the take-off broards used in the Broad Jump, and Hop, Step and Jump, are 1.22 metres wide, 2.40 Hop, Step and Jump are 1.22 metres wide, 2.40 metres, or about twice this width, were calculated sufficient for the width of a runway, providing for the shifting of the take-off boards, and taking into consmitting of the take-off boards, and taking into consideration the mental condition of the jumpers on a run. The width of the sand pit is 9.20 metres, or 2 metres more than that of the whole runway, and the length is 8 metres, assuring the jumpers absolute safety, taking 8 metres as the mark at which the Broad Jump will be won.

Fields for the High Jump are situated inside the Track facing the Main Stand, one close to the starting-line of the 100-metre race, and the other in a corresponding place close to the finish-line, in order to afford the spectators an unobstructed view of the competition, and at the same time taking into consideration the position of the sun, and, as in other cases, the mental strain of the participants. The sand-pits measure 7 metres by 5 metres, giving sufficient safety for any of the various methods of jumping such as roll-over and others. For the run-way, 18 metres are taken as the standard length.

Runways for the Javelin Throw are provided at both ends of the Field, and are 8.60 metres in width, the maximum available because of the presence of the High Jump runway. The length of the runway ought to be over 30 metres, and from the standpoint of the participating javelin throwers, it is desirable not to place the runways inside the Main Track. In order to comply with these conditions, however, the goal-posts to be used in Football matches must be removed. After a discussion on this point, the Athletic Federation conceded, and the runways for the Javelin Throw were placed inside the Main Track. This disadvantage on the javelin throwers will have to be relieved as much as possible by a suitable schedule in the programme.

For the elimination trials of the Hammer Throw and Discus Throw, circles and cages placed in the four corners of the Field will be used for the sake of safety and spectators' convenience, and in the finals those placed at the centre of the Home Stretch will be used for the convenience of both participants and spectators.

Circles for the Shot Put are placed at both ends of the Field and parallel to the Main Stand. In the finals, however, the circle for the finals of the Hammer Throw will be used. It was at first suggested to use the spaces left in the semi-circles, opposite the High Jump fields, at both ends of the Field as the circles for the Shot Put. But, as they proved to be too narrow for the purpose, sandpits of 5 metres square were installed there for the warming-up of the participants and as provision for

The Field is provided with watering equipment to keep the lawn and tracks in good condition, and with a drainage system to carry off the rain.

#### Yoshioka equals record of 10.2 seconds in 100 metre dash

📐 The American track and field team which visited Japan during the summer participated in meets held at Tokyo, Nagoya, and Osaka. One of the most notable achievements of these meets was the winning of the 100 metre race at Osaka by Yoshioka who took 6th place at the Los Angeles Olympics. Assisted by a strong wind which registered a velocity of 15 metres, Yoshioka showed excellent speed from the start, and ran the 100 metres in 10.2 speed from the start, and fait the for metre in 10.2 seconds, out-distancing Tolmich and Weierhauser. Tolmich, the all-American junior 100 metre dash champion, came second, running the distance in 10.3 seconds. The third place was taken by Taniguchi whose time was 10.4 seconds.

In the Nagoya meet, Yu Hai Wei of Manchoukuo, who participated by special invitation, created a sensation by winning the 800 metre race, defeating Woodruff, the undefeated champion since the Berlin

In the pole vault, Sefton, who was Oe's rival when Oe visited America last spring, won the Osaka meet, clearing the bar at 4.35 metres. However, he yielded to Oe in Tokyo and to both Oe and Adachi at the Nagoya meet. Meadows was injured during the Tokyo matches.

Other notable records registered during these matches were the 14.3 seconds made by Tolmich in the high hurdles, and 1 minute 55.0 seconds made by the American team in the Swedish relay.

#### Bado Raymond, noted wrestling coach, arrives in Japan

Wrestling organizations in Japan are making extensive preparations for the Tokyo Olympics. As a part of the training, international matches were held and a team of American wrestlers specially invited to come to Japan to participate in them. With the close of this series of matches, no time was lost in providing for a second training programme. Taking advantage of the visit to Tokyo of Bado Raymond, the former Hungarian heavyweight champion in the Greco-Roman style wrestling, an arrangement was made for a month's training period during which time Japanese wrestlers received training in the Greco-Roman style wrestling in the Waseda University gymnasium.

Bado Raymond's experience in wrestling extends over a period of nineteen years. He is a graduate of a physical culture college in Budapest. He won the third place in the Greco-Roman style and fifth place in the free style at the 1924 Paris Olympics; and second place in the European championship meet in 1925. Two years later, he won the coveted championship. In the 1928 Olympics at Amsterdam, he was placed fifth. His appearance at the Berlin Olympics was made in the capacity of coach to the Egyptian Olympic team.

The day after his arrival in Sapporo, he conducted a careful examination of possible sites near the Olympia Schanze. Sankaku-yama and the grounds surrounding the Silver slope, were also studied. On the 22nd and 23rd, a survey was made of a stretch of land about 200 metres between Horomitoge and Ban-kei-toge where removal of shrubbery will be necessary, and a course about 800 metres long between Kamiji Yama and Horomi-toge was selected.

Aside from surveying and other field work, Mr. Zentzytzki is expected to be kept busy with conferences with the Mayor of Sapporo and the Governor of Hokkaido, in addition to his social obligations at the various parties to be given in his honour.

#### PLANS FOR THE MAIN STADIUM OF THE TOKYO OLYMPICS

Construction plans for the Main Stadium of the XIIth Olympic Games, Tokyo, have been drawn up by the Sports Department of the Organizing Committee with the co-operation of the Amateur Athletic Federation of Japan, member of the I. A. A. F., and will shortly be sent to the International Amateur Athletic Federation for official approval.

The plans call for a reconstruction of the existing Meiji Shrine Stadium. In drawing up the plan, the Main Stadium of the Berlin Olympic Games was taken as a model, and stadiums at Amsterdam and Los Angeles were also referred to.

In this issue, only the plans of the Track and Field will be described. The Stand and other plans will appear in later issues.

Special underground passages are provided for participating athletes entering and leaving the Track and Field ground. Pits are provided at several important points for photographers in order revent them from getting in the way of athletes and spectators.

The foremost part of the Main Stand and the jumping field are separated by 6 metres, the maximum distance obtainable on the site allotted for the Stadium in the Outer Garden of Meiji Shrine, to ease the congestion expected at the Opening Ceremony and for the smooth running of the programme. On the opposite side of the Track, 4 metres separate the Stand and the second jumping field in order to relieve the mental strain of the jumpers during the climination trials.

Mr. C. Hunter, coach, and Mr. W. Sefton, captain of the U. S. Track and Field Team which visited Japan this summer, expressed their satisfaction with these plans.

#### Planning of the Track

The Track measures 400 metres a lap, and the curves are mono-centric semi-circles of 36.50 metre radius. The number of lanes is nine on the Home Stretch and eight on the Back Stretch, adding one each to the numbers provided in the Stadium of the Berlin Olympics. The width of a lane is 1.25 metres, conforming to the rules of the International Amateur Athletic Federation and the Amateur Athletic Federation of Japan, and taking into consideration the width of the newly-adopted hurdles.

For the 100-metre, 110-metre hurdle, women's 100-metre and women's 80-metre hurdle races, six of the lanes on the Home Stretch, omitting two on the inside and one on the outside, will be used, and for the 200-metre, women's 200-metre, 400-metre, 400-metre hurdle, 400-metre relay and women's 400metre relay races, six lanes, omitting the innermost and the outermost, will be used. As the innermost lane will be continuously used in various races of over 800 metres, and will naturally get cut up, it was considered advisable not to use this lane for races of less than 400 metres for which separate lanes are provided.

The Home Stretch is made 5 metres longer than that at the Stadium at Berlin at the starting-end, and about 10 metres longer at the finish end. This will give the starter ample space for carrying out his mission, since, with this extension, a space of 10 metres in length is available behind the starting-line of the 110-metre hurdle race. The corresponding extension at the other end of the Stretch is made in order to give symmetry in the construction of the Track, at the same time taking into consideration the momentum of the sprinters after passing the finishing line.

The water-jump of the 3,000-metre Steeple-chase is apt to cause trouble when placed close to the startingline, so it is placed on the opposite side, that is, on the side of the starting-lines of the 100-metre and 110-metre hurdle races. It may, however, be moved to some other point if it happens to interfere with the holding of ceremonies. At the point where the water jump is to be situated, a space of about 100 metres wide between the Track and the Main Stand will serve to relieve congestion. There is a corresponding space of equal width on the opposite side to provide for symmetry.

#### U.S.A. Swimming Team Invited to Japan

Japan is making elaborate preparations for the Olympic Games to be held three years hence.

Even in swimming, in which Japan's supremacy is generally acknowledged, it is considered advisable to give impetus to the Japanese swimmers from time to time and give them chance to study various foreign methods. It was from this point of view that the Amatuur Swimming Federation of Japan decided to invite the following five American Olympic swimmers to the Championship Meet held at the Meiji Shrine Pool on August 14, 15 and 16.

The visitors were, Adolf Kiefer, back-stroke; Jack Medica, free-style; John Higgins, breast-stroke; Elbert Root, diving; and Miss Katherine Rawls, diving, who also participated in free-style and back-stroke events.


In the 400-meter free-style,—an event in which Japan had been unable to place a winner since the time antedating the Los Angeles Olympic Games in 1932—Makino managed to beat Medica. Higgins

showed his famous "butterfly stroke" but he was no match for the Japanese breast-stroke swimmers, and it was with some difficulty that he managed to pass the semi-final. He even lost to two or three Japanese swimmers who adopted the "butterfly strokes." Hamuro, who represented Japan in the Berlin Olympic Games, won this event. His time, 2:40.2 minutes, betters the world's record.

In diving, Shibahara did very well against Root, and lost only by a narrow margin. Root also beat him in the high dive.

Miss Rawls was unbeatable in women's events, but the number of promising women swimmers and divers in Japan is rapidly increasing, and it is generally believed that by 1940 several of them will approach the standard now set by Rawls.

As regards the water polo, it has been decided to select promising players to form a national team, and make them undergo a systematic training over a long period in order to turn out a first-class team for the coming Olympic Gemes.

## American Wrestling Team Presented with Japanese Short Swords

· At the Berlin Olympic Games, champions were presented with young oak trees. The problem of what to present at the Tokyo Olympics is now being studied. The Japan Amateur Athletic Association has put the question before the readers in its official periodical "The Olympics." From the vari-Yous expressions of opinion received by the Association, it appears that many are in favor of presenting swords to men champions and mirrors (ancient Japanese-style) to women champions. The Kamakura Amateur Athletic Association took up this idea and presented a Japanese short sword 19 cm. long (blade length 11 cm.) to each of the members of the American wrestling team when they visited Kamakura. These swords were forged by Tsunahiro, the 23rd master swordsmith in the famous Masamune family of Kamakura.

In some quarters it is proposed that the *icho* (gingko) tree should take the place of oak at the Tokyo Olympics. The Japan Bonsai (fancy dwarfed potted trees) Association is strongly supporting this proposal. As an experiment, several gingko trees were planted in the gardens of Mr. Ryozo Hiranuma (chief of the Japanese delegation to the Berlin Olympics and O.O.C. member) in Yokohama.

Mr. M. Zentzytzki, famous designer of bob-sleigh courses, will leave Germany accompanied by his wife and, travelling by way of Canada, is expected in Tokyo on September 19, when he will take up his duties as technical adviser for the Sapporo Winter Games. The bob-sleigh courses at Lake Placid and at Garmisch-Partenkirchen, as well as that at Cortina d'Impezzo, Italy, reputed to be the finest in the world, were all designed by Mr. Zentzytzki. With respect to topography, temperature, ice, snow, and other natural conditions, Sapporo qualifies as an excellent site for

#### Japan-American Track ank Field Meet

The Second Japan-American Track and Field Meet was held at the Meiji Shrine Stadium on August 28th and 29th, approximately the same time of the year as that scheduled for the Olympic Games in 1940. The first meet, it may be recalled, took place in 1934 at Tokyo and Osaka and resulted in a draw.

The U.S.A. team visiting this year, which is in charge of Mr. Charles F. Hunter who acts as coach and manager, consists of the following fifteen athletes; William Sefton (captain), Earle Meadows, David Albritton, John Woodruff,—these four hold world records,—Robert Young, Allan Tolmich, Thomas Moore, Jack Weiershauser, Charles Fenske, Floyd Lochner, Kermit King, Richard Ganslen, James Reynolds, William Reitz, and Irving Folwartshny.

Japan was represented by Tsukamoto (captain), Murakoso, Oye, Yoshioka and twenty others.

At 2 o'clock on 28th, the playing of the Army and Navy bands opened the meet. The opening ceremony was immediately followed by the first of the events, the 1,500 meter race, before a capacity crowd.

Many outstanding performances were witnessed, and four new records were established. The Americans finally won by 94 points to 84, winning 14 out of 19 events.

#### PREPARATIONS FOR TOKYO OLYMPIC GAMES MAKING RAPID PROGRESS

On August 6th, the Army officially announced that seven officers, including well-known Captain ) Takeichi Nishi, had been chosen for the Equestrian events of the XIIth Olympic Games to be held in Tokyo in 1940, and that these expert horsemen were to devote their time to practice and training of their horses for three years prior to the Games.

Unfortunately, however, on account of the recent Sino-Japanese incident the Army authorities are of opinion that it is undesirable, in the circumstances, for those officers in active service to devote themselves entirely to preparations for the Olympic Games.

This aroused much comment in all quarters, and some people even suspected that it meant the abandonment of the whole of the Olympic Games. The Organizing Committee is anxious to clear up such a misunderstanding, and declared its intention to make a greater effort for the preparation for the Games without being disturbed by the present state of affairs.

#### Official designation for the Winter Games at Sapporo

The Olympic Organizing Committee held a meeting at its offices in the Mantetsu Building on August 24, and deliberated on the rules relative to the committee in charge of the Winter Games at Sapporo.

After the meeting, the Organizing Committee announced the following.

- (1) The "Vth Olympic Winter Games Sapporo 1940" shall be the official designation for the international competition to be held at Sapporo in
- (2) The committee in charge of the event shall be known as the "Vth Olympic Winter Games Committee,"

#### The Question of Languages to be used at the Olympics

In accordance with the Olympic Rules, French, English, and German will be used in correspondence with the I.O.C., the N.O.C., and the International Sports Federation.

For the Olympic Games heretofore, the regulations for the sports events were printed in French, German, English, and Spanish. Starting with the Tokyo Olympics, an edition in Italian will be issued in addition, under a decision of the the I.O.C. made at its Warsaw session

It is expected, however, that Japanese and English will be the principal languages to be used at the time of the Olympic Games. All printed matter as well as every notice issued by the Organizing Committee to the general public will be printed in both Japanese and English.

#### Japan Deplores Passing of Baron de Coubertin

It is with profound regret that we announce the passing of Baron Pierre de Coubertin, founder and life Honorary President of the Olympic Games, who died on September 2, 1937. Baron de Coubertin's death is a great loss to the Olympic Games, with which he had been so intimately associated ever since their foundation in 1896. Japan had hoped that it might be possible to see him at the 1940 Games, and to give him a cordial welcome in appreciation of his loyalty to the cause he had sponsored for so many years, the cause which has proven and is proving to be so beneficial to the welfare of mankind. Baron de Coubertin's name will live forever in history as a world benefactor. forever in history as a world benefactor. Organizing Committee of XIIth Olympiad, Tokyo, 1940



Baron de Conbertin was horn at Paris on New Year's Baron de Conbertin was horn at Paris on New Year's Day 1863. After graduating from the Normal School in Paris where he studied history, he went to England for further study. It was in 1894, when he was still ayoung writer and educator, that the Baron first presented his plan to revive the Olympic competitions of ancient Greece. Many difficulties were met and overcome by his noble love of sport, and two years later, the first Games were held at Athens.

the first Games were held at Athens.

The Baron fittingly became the first President of the International Olympic Committee and served actively in that capacity from 1896 until 1925, when he retired in favour of his collaborator, Count Henri de Baillet-Latour. From then until his death he remained honorary president of the organization which he had founded. He was the author of a number of books of which he "Reminiscences on Olympia" is the most famous.

Statement of the General Secretary of the Organizing Committee of the XIIth Olympic Games Tokyo 1940



For the past several days various rumours were noted to have been in circulation, some of them even appearing in Tokyo's vernaculars, that Japan will decline the scheduled holding of the 1940 Olympiad in Tokyo. It must be stated here that all these rumours had no ground whatever to attest to their authenticity. They were entirely contrary to the actual circumstance in which the matter at issue now stands.

Although there is no doubt that the international situation in the Far East is strained at the present moment, the fundamental stand as maintained by Japan has undergone no change whatever. It has always been the sole desire and determination of Japan to strive toward a firm establishment of the

peace in the region and the belief that the ominous cloud now overhanging will soon pass away is entertained by the nation.

Under the circumstances, Japan sees no reason why she should decide on the abandonment of the forthcoming international athletic meet to be staged in Tokyo three years aliéad.

On September 8, the Olympic Committee of the Municipality of Tokyo, the host to the 1940 Olympiad, passed a resolution to continue preparations with a view to holding as scheduled the 12th Olympic Games in 1940 here. Nor do the athletic organizations concerned in Japan alter their unswerving resolve to hold it. The Japanese Government, too, let it be clearly stated here, has on no occasion in the past shown any gesture indicative of its inclination toward declining the 1940 Olympiad.

While taking fully into account the gravity of the current situation confronting Japan, the Organizing Committee will not relax its efforts and appropriate measures so that all requirements for the realization of the plan for the coming international event will be

We hereby wish that all the misunderstandings on the matter be wiped away both at home and abroad so that the foreign nations as well as the Japanese nation may not be misled concerning the question at issue.

#### COUNT SOYESHIMA'S REPORT ON WARSAW CONFERENCE

Immediately following their return to Japan on August 6, Count Michimasa Soyeshima, Japanese delegate to the I.O.C. Session held at Warsaw in June of this year, and Mr. Sohaku Ri, a member of the Sports Department of the Organizing Committee, who also attended the I.O.C. session, submitted their formal report on the proceedings of the Session at a meeting of the Organizing Committee called on August 12 and 19, and the report was accepted unanimously at the

The principal decisions of the Warsaw Conference covered the Programme of the XIIth Olympiad Tokyo 1940, and the nomination of Sapporo as the site for the Vth Olympic Winter Games. The Organizing Committee is showing a renewed vigour in taking up the task of preparing for the events on the basis of Count Soyeshima's official report. With the appointment of Mr.

Nagai to the post of General Secretary, the Committee is entering upon a period of great activity. Preparations for the Winter Games will proceed under the control of the O.O.C. for summer events, with Prince Tokugawa as President. A special committee known as the Vith Olympic Winter Games Committee, however, has been organized at Sapporo, with Mr. Hidehiko Ishiguro, Governor of Hokkaido, as Chairman. This committee has begun to function already, with a resolve to realize the proposed plans for the Games as described in the "Olympic News" No. 3.

# CLIMATIC AND OTHER CONDITIONS IN JAPAN IN RELATION TO FOREIGN HORSES TO BE USED IN THE OLYMPIC GAMES

The following information about Tokyo is given for the benefit of those participating in equestrian events in the Olympic Games.

Tokyo is situated at Lat. 33°30′ north, midway on the southern coast of the main island of the Japanese archipelago. Its climate is mild but the rainfall is heavy, measuring as high as 1557 mm. per year. This heavy rainfall makes the water soft, and enables animals and vegetation to grow with vigour.

Most of the principal breeds of horses from Europe do well in this climate, as do Holstein cattle, Yorkshire hogs and leghorn poultry.

In July and August, the weather conditions are fairly stable, most of the days being clear with refreshing breezes.

Both well and tap water are soft and the temporature is between 14° and 18° C. in the summer. The surface of the soil is rich in humus.

Water is obtainable at a depth of from 4 to 6 metres below the surface of the soil. Unpayed

roads are thus resilient.

Oats, com, and barley, as well as timothy hay and soy-bean hay are available for fodder. On account of the damp climate, fodder easily becomes mouldy, and grasses are somewhat difficult to dry, but with due care these difficulties can easily be overcome.

Radishes used for livestock feed are not available but Japanese carrots, green grass, and bamboo-grass leaves are plentiful throughout the year. Imported horses take well to these foods in one or two weeks. Rice hay is used both as fodder and straw for the bedding down of animals.

Stables are wooden structures. The climate being damp, stone and concrete structures are not suitable.

All in all, foreign contestants will not find it difficult to familiarize themselves with local conditions, and when they do, they will find that climatic and other conditions in Japan compare favorably with those in Europe.

The city's plans include new thoroughfares for both vehicular and pedestrians traffic. Until the final plans for the Stadium were completed this project was naturally difficult to effect. Now that plans have been formulated, however, the City of Tokyo has decided to speed up its scheme to effect the making of new roads in order to eliminate all danger of the slightest congestion in either reaching or leaving the Stadium.

Early obstacles have now been removed, and it is therefore much easier for the Organizing Committee to go ahead with its plans in order to guarantee that nothing shall be left undone to house the Games in a fitting manner and to make it easy for those attending to find all that they would wish in 1940.

#### Mr. Nagai appointed General Secretary

On July 2nd, Baron Keiichi Kubota, General Secretary of the Organizing Committee of the XII th Olympiad, tendered his resignation to Prince Tokugawa, Chairman of the Committee. Baron Kubota was appointed to the post at the meeting of the Organizing Committee held on the 9th of last March. The Committee did their utmost to persuade him to retain his post, but the Baron felt

that his failing health would not permit him to continue in office; and the Committee, voicing the strongest sentiment of regret, accepted his resignation at its meeting held on July 8 th.

At the 17th session of the Committee held on August 12, Prince Tokugawa recommended the appointment of Mr. Nagai to succeed Baron Kubota. The recommendation was unanimously approved. Mr. Nagai was formerly Japanese Ambassador to Berlin and the news of his appointment is being received with enthusiasm and gratification in all quarters.

#### Scientific Research for the Olympic Games

The Organizing Committee for the 12th Olympiad, Tokyo, has established a Committee for scientific research in its Sports Department. This research committee is composed of some forty members, including leading scientists in Japan. Professor Mishio Ishimoto of the Tokyo Imperial University has been appointed chairman. A regular meeting of the committee will be held each month to study problems of a scientific nature arising in connection with the facilities for conducting the various games,

Among the studies that have already been taken up by the Committee are the following: a substitute -for gunpowder to be used in firing pistols to start the races; various kinds of stop-watches; an installation to minimize the waves in the swimming-pool. Various materials for surfacing the track in the stadium have been studied, and it is probable that the material used at the Berlin Olympics, described commonly as "En-tout-cas," will be selected. The selection of the kind of lawn to be laid on the field within the stadium is another problem that is being studied. The lawn must be the kind that will be able to withstand heat in summer and frost in winter. Korai lawn will probably be selected, as it is stron recommended by Dr. Suehiro, President of the Japan Swimming Association, who served for many years on the Greens Committee of the Kasumiga-seki Golf Club. Studies are also being made to improve the steel tape-measure so that the markings can be more easily read. Improvements in cameras for photographic records of contests are also being made.

#### Design for Tokyo Olympic Mark Selected

12,113 designs were submitted for the competition conducted by the Organizing Committee. The judges awarded the first prize to the design reproduced on this issue, and honorable mention to three others. The prize-winning design will be used on the publications and official stationery of the Organizing Committee.

### International Sports events to be Held

The various National Sport Federation in Japan are doing everything possible to improve the performance standards of their members. As participation in contests provides good opportunity for training, international meets have been arranged and foreign teams have been invited to participate in them.

The first team to come to Japan under this invitation was a wrestling team from the United States. The team took part in various mat competitions during July. These wrestlers will be followed by a team of American swimming stars headed by coach Stanley Brauninger. The team is composed of Medica, Kiefer, Higgins, Root, and Miss Katherine Rawls. The swimmers will participate in the All-Japan Swimming Championship Meet to be held on the 14th, 15th and 16th of August at the Swimming Stadium in the Shrine grounds.

The wards the end of August, an American track and field team of 16 members headed by Coach Hunter will arrive in Japan and Japan-American contests will be held at the Meiji Shrine stadium on the 28th and 29th. Among the members of this team are Meadows, champion polevaulter at the Berlin Olympics; Sefton, who won fourth place in pole-vaulting at the Berlin Olympics; Woodruff, Berlin Olympic champion in the 800 metre race; Albritton, running high-jump champion; and others. On Ausust 28th, the opening ceremony will be held on a grand scale as a sort of rehearsal for the similar ceremony at the Olympic Games in 1940. A chorus of a thousand voices will participate in this ceremony.

#### Lodging for Foreigners in Tokyo and its Vicinity

One of the most serious problems that arise in connection with the 1940 Olympic Games is the question of providing lodging quarters in Tokyo for foreigners. This problem is being studied in earnest, and the government has decided to encourage the construction of hotels by advancing the necessary capital at low interest out of the National Treasury.

Hotels in Japan have improved greatly in recent years, and many of them now offer accommodation equal to that of the best European and American hotels. A considerable number of these Westernstyle hotels are to be found in Tokyo. These, together with hotels in Yokobama, Kamakura, Zushi, Atami, Hakone, etc., which are within easy reach from Tokyo, may all be used by foreigners at the time of the Olympic Games. Besides these, Tokyo has quite a number of apartment-hotels, clubs, and lodges. Though clubs and lodges are operated by various organizations for the convenience of their members and are not ordinarily available to the general public, they will be open to foreigners during the Olympic Games. A number of new hotels are now under construction, and enlargement of the premises is being planned by several hotels. When these are completed. Tokyo will be able to accommodate at least twice the number of foreigners that can be accommodated at present.

There are innumerable Japanese inns in Tokyo. Facilities at these inns have improved greatly of late, and some of them can new be said to offer accommodation satisfactory to foreigners. The operators of these inns are taking a lively interest in the movement to modernize their establishments. By 1940 quite a number of them will have become suitable for foreigners.



#### OLYMPIC SITE PLAN APPROVED

- As the proposed site for the Olympic Games in Tokyo was the Outer Gardens of the Meiji Shrine, approval first had to be sought for holding the Games there. This is because the Meiji Shrine and its Outer Gardens enjoy, as it were, a sort of sacred extraterritoriality in the Japanese nation.
- Since the demise of the illustrious Emperor Meiji, both the Shrine and its Outer Gardens have been considered a sort of sacred reserve, to which the whole nation regularly makes pilgrimages. Both the Shrine and the Outer Gardens, therefore, have been administered independently of the Department of Home Affairs. But as the Outer Gardens and the object to which they have been dedicated since their construction have always been in harmony with the very ideals which the Olympic Games foster, it was thought fitting, not only geographically but also sentimentally, to hold the Olympic Games there. However, it was first necessary to ask for formal permission to hold the Games in the Outer Shrine. This the Meiji Shrine Supervising Committee readily gave, so that the Department of Home Affairs is now able to announce that the site has been officially



used. At one time it was planned to construct a new Schanze on the slope of the Sankaku-yama but tests proved that this site was not ideal because of strong winds and the Okura Schanze has been chosen for the Olympics. The record on this Schanze at the present is 71 metres made by Shunji Tatsuta but with improvements that will be made at the site it is expected that at the time of the Olympics, a record approaching 80 metres will be established. The present stand will be enlarged to seat 30,000 and to provide standing room for 10,000. Parking space for automobiles will also be enlarged. By the time of the Olympics, it will have become possible to maintain a belt-line bus service from the city. The walking distance of 40 minutes from the terminus of the trainway line will also be shortened.

Down-Hill Races: The course for these races has its start on the summit of the Mt. Te-i-ne-yama which has an altitude of 1,023 metres. The course descends in an unbroken straight line towards the Garu-kawa station, and it has a grade of over 800 metres. Before it can be used, however, shrubbery will have to be removed and a cable car line installed

to facilitate climbing to the summit.

Slalon Race: For this race San-kaku-yama will be used. Both the eastern and western slopes have been tried and found to be somewhat beyond the skill of Japanese skiiers. Contestants from central and southern Europe who excel in this branch of skiing are expected to find this course quite to their liking.

#### SKATING CONTESTS

Indoor Rink: This will be newly constructed in the municipal ground at the Maruyama Park terminus of the street railway line. The rink will measure 25 by 60 metres and stands will accommodate 8,000. Figure skating and ice hockey, matches will be held here.

Outdoor Contests: Municipal athletic ground in the outer compound of the Sapporo Shrine will be turned into a skating ground with a circular course 13 metres wide and well over 400 metres in circumference. Speed skating contests will be held here, and the area circumscribed by the course will be used for ice-hockey matches.


#### BOB-SLEIGH RACES

Plans are under consideration to invite foreign experts, perhaps from Germany, to come to Japan to supervise the necessary construction work for the course for these races and also to train Japanese athletes in the art of bob-sleighing. 
#### LODGING

A special village to house contestants has never been built for any of the Winter Olympic-Games. But conditions are different in Sapporo,

> for Japanese inns and private residences can hardly be regarded as offering accommodation suitable to visitors, although at the Sapporo Grand Hotel, excellent western-style accommodation is available. Various plans are thus being studied to solve the problem of lodging. One solution is to approach the Hokkaido Government and other public authorities who are planning to build sanatoriums and the like, and to have these built in time to be used as lodging places during the Olympic Games.

### WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES

At the Warsaw Conference of the I.O.C., Sapporo was selected as the site for the Vth Olympic Winter Games. Sapporo is a modern city with wide and elegant boulevards; it is the seat of government and the centre of commerce in Hokkaido, a northern island in the Japanese archipelago. The latitudinal position of this city corresponds to that of Rome, Italy, or Chicago, U.S.A.

To the northeast of Sapporo lies the plain of Ishikari, and in the opposite direction are the Maru-yama and Mo-iwa Mountains. The Olympic Winter Games will be held in the neighbourhood of this city where fine and powdery snow covers the whole landscape in winter and where the temperature falls well below zero but never to a point that may be called severe. The countryside is covered with accrose trees, and is easily accessible from Sapporo. All in all, this district has the best qualification as the site for the skiing races. The present skiing grounds lie in the mountain range which embraces Mt. Te-i-ne-yama, Mt. Sankakuyama, Mt. Okura-yama, Mt. Mo-i-wa-yama, and Mt. Maruyama. The Okura Schanze, said to be the Olympics.

Sapporo lies about 1,140 kilometres north of Tokyo, and can be reached in 24 hours by express train from Tokyo to Ao-mori, thence by ship to Hakodate where connection is made from the ship to the train for Sapporo. Street railway and the bus provide transportation within the City of Sapporo. Taxi rates range from 80 sen to one ven within the city limits. The Okura Schanze at the centre of the skiing grounds is about 6 kilometres from the Sapporo Railway Station, within 30 minutes' ride by automobile.

The Sapporo Grand Hotel has 40 Western-style rooms accommodating 62 guests, and 11 Japanese rooms accommodating 24 guests. There are many Japanese inns, where accommodation is available for a considerable number of guests.

The average depth of snow in Sapporo is 50 centimetres in January, and 122 centimetres in February. The snow is dry and powdery, and falls during the four months from December to March. The average temperature during January is 5.8 degrees below zero, and 5.1 below zero during February.

#### VTH OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES, SAPPORO, 1940


Sapporo having been selected as the site for the Vth Olympic Winter Games, the organizers in Japan have begun to exert strenuous efforts in preparation for it with the hope that it will surpass the games held in Chamonix, St. Moritz, and Lake Placid, and will at least equal the games at Garmisch-Partenkirchen.

As in the case of the Tokyo Olympics, an organizing committee will be established for the Sapporo Olympics. This committee is expected to make preparations along the lines described below.

SKI CONTESTS

Distance Races: There will be no difficulty in deciding upon the courses for 18 and 50 kilometre races around the outer compound of the Sapporo Shrine. The depth of snow, temperature, and undulations in the land surface are ideal. With thirteen ski huts already in existence, it is expected that no renovations will be necessary on the grounds so far as these distance races are concerned.

Ski Jump: The existing Okura Schanze will be

. Toda in Saitama Prefecture, just outside Tokyo, will be the site for the rowing course, which is to run parallel to the north bank of the canal just above the Toda bridge. This project is a tremendous undertaking, involving the excavating of a large area of agricultural land adjacent to the present canal and an expenditure of some Yen 2,800,000. The Japan Race Club has agreed to construct an equestrian course in Setagaya Ward, Tokyo, for the Olympic contests, provided the Organizing Committee shall appropriate at least Yen 150,000 toward its

#### CONSTRUCTION OF THE ROWING COURSE BEGUN

The inauguration with Shinto rites of the construction of the rowing course at Toda Bridge in Saitama Prefecture, which took place on May 30, 1937, marks the beginning of actual construction work for the 1940 Games. Following the signal fired by President Shiosawa of the Rowing Club, the contractor began operations, and the first excavated soil was carried off. Then followed the program of greetings and speeches. Different members of the Tokyo Intercollegiate Crew Association, rowing up the Arakawa in their eightshells, added much in making the whole ceremony more impressive and significant.

The course will be 2,500 meters long and 80 meters wide, and will be located just above the Toda Bridge. A road seven meters wide will run parallel on either side of the course. A space of seventy thousand tsubo (56 acres) will be used for grass lawns, a grandstand to accommodate tens of thousands of spectators and for parking room. The plan has been designed by Mr. Kanamori, an engineer in the Ministry of Home Affairs, and the whole project is to cost approximately two million yen. The work will be finished by the summer of 1939, and when completed will constitute a great scientific achievement of modern engineering.

#### CONSTRUCTION OF THE YACHT HARBOR TO BE STARTED SOON

The decision having been made to locate the yachting harbor in Yokohama, Director Kurihara of the Yokohama Athletic Association has indicated the readiness of all concerned to cooperate in the harbor construction, which will be developed according to the plan of Mr. Samejima, formerly a government civil engineer. It is expected that a budget of Yen 700,000 will be sufficient for this enterprise. The Yokohama Olympic Games Committee, which is soon to be organized, in cooperation with government officials, will start work as soon as practicable. Adequate facilities for spectators will be provided on the cliff which overlooks the harbor.

#### OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES TO BE HELD IN JAPAN

At its Warsaw general meeting held on June 8, the International Olympic Committee took up the question of the Vth Olympic Winter Games and, giving cognizance to the wishes of Japan, decided that it should be held in Hokkaido (Sapporo), Japan. The difficult problem pending since the summer of last year has thus been decided at last in Japan's favour.

On receiving the news of this decision, the Olympic Organizing Committee in Tokyo sent telegrams from its President, Prince Tokugawa, to Count Baillet-Latour and Viscount Soyeshima, expressing its gratification at the decision and its appreciation of the efforts of these men and other members of the LO.C in bringing about a decision in favour of Japan.

#### THE ART CONCOURS

The Japan Association of Arts in Physical Culture has mobilized the country's specialists in the various fields of art to prepare for the 1940 Olympic Art Concours. These experts, numbering sixty-four, have been made members of the Association's Board of Directors and will supervise the Association's work after the budget is approved by the Organizing Committee. The following outline of the projects has been published by the Association:

1. Art Contests. Count Soyeshima is expected to propose at the Warsaw Conference that the industrial arts and photography be recognized as independent branches of the Art Exhibitions on the same basis as Japanese paintings, color prints, sculpture, architecture, music, and literature. Starting this fall, the Association will hold elimination contests in each of these nine branches, a wide publicity to obtain as many entries as possible is being planned..
2. Japanese Cultural Exhibitions.

Exhibitions are planned by the Association to inter-duce to Olympic visitors both ancient and modern Japanese art and culture. 3. Ceremonies.

The Association will study the problems involved in planning for the opening and closing ceremonies of the Olympic Games

4. "Drama and Music Week."

The Association plans to hold a "Drama and Music Week" during the Olympic Games, which will include Kabuki, modern plays, and music concerts. These will all center around a theme that harmonizes with the aims of the Olympics. 5. Decorations.

The Association will strive to co-ordinate the schemes of various authorities and organizations in the decoration of the streets and the athletic grounds during the Olympic Games.

The Association will co-operate with the Publicity Section of the Olympic Organizing Committee in giving publicity throughout the world to the Olympic Games,

The duties of the General Affairs Department shall consist of matters relating to:

Safe-keeping of official seals; appointment and dismissal of staff members; husiness or official trips of the staff; supervision of the work of office employees, porters, etc.; other personnel matters; conference and committee meetings; rules and regulations; despatch and receipt of mail, documents, etc.; keeping of records, editing and compilating of reports; safe-keeping of books and do-

cuments; budget and balancing of accounts; purchasing, renting and disposal of goods; income and disbursements; disbursements and safe-keeping of cash and goods; salaries and wages; other treasurer's duties; all matters outside the competence of other departments.

Article 111

The duties of the Sports Department shall consist of matters relating to:

Supervision ot grounds and dressing-rooms; planning and supervision of the making of articles and equipment used in the games; torch marathon; communications with the International Olympic Committee; direction and supervision of contestants; receiving applications for participation in the contests; ceremonies; drawing up programs carrying out contests; recording and publishing contest records; art contests; exhibitions and meetings; referees; communicating with visiting teams; plans for meeting and sending off visiting teams; practice and training-fields; drawing up of programs for practice and training; other matters relating to contests.

Arlicle IV

The duties of the Publicity Department shall consist of the following:

Preparation of guide-books, and publication and distribution of publicity matter; publicity through motion-picture films and radio; release of records and news to newspapers and others; attracting spectators; other matters relating to publicity.


Article V

- 6. South Manchurian Railway—agreement for reduced rates on all railway lines under their jurisdiction.
- Japan Hotel Association—agreement for reduced rates by all the member hotels to those connected with the I.O.C.





The following are the rules governing Sub-Committees and Secretariat, as provided by the Constitution of the Organizing Committee which appeared in the first number of the "Olympic News."

RULES REGULATING THE SUB-COMMITTEES

O Article 1

Members of the Finance, Construction and General Affairs Committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Organizing Committee.

Members of the Finance, Construction and General Affairs Committees shall organize their respective Committees.

The Chairmen of the Committees shall be elected by the members of the respective committees from among their number.

The secretarial work of the committees shall be undertaken by the Secretariat.

Article 11

The Finance Committee shall manage the financial affairs of the Organizing Committee, and shall answer the President, when questioned, on financial matters.

Article III

The Construction Committee shall act as a consultation body to the President and the General Secretary

on matters relating to the construction of grounds, living quarters for the participants, etc., and shall direct and supervise the construction of the same.

ORGANIZATION OF THE SECRETARIAT

Article I

. The Secretariat of the Organizing Committee of the XIIth Olympiad, Tokyo, 1940, shall undertake all the administrative and secretarial work of the Organizing Committee.

Article 11

The officers of the Secretariat shall consist of General Secretary, several departmental managers, secretaries, engineers, clerks, and assistant engineers.

The Secretariat may commission additional officers pro tem, and employ subordinate employees not listed in the above paragraph.

Article III

The General Secretary and departmental managers shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Organizing Committee.

Secretaries and officials under them shall be appointed or dismissed by the President. Subordinate employees, however, shall be appointed or dismissed by the General Secretary.

Article IV

The General Secretary shall direct the Secretariat's
