MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT:

Amendment to SCAPIN 1875, 1 April 1948

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (1 Apr 48)CPC/CD, SCAPIN 1875, 1 April 1948, subject, "Gold, Silver, and Platinum Family Metals for Domestic Consumption in the Second Quarter of 1948," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Allocations of precious metals for use in maintaining transportation facilities are approved as detailed. The metals approved for release by this amendment will be allocated and used in implementing programs approved by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. These metals are authorized for use from the date of publication of this memorandum to 30 September 1948.

Subscription to New Shares of Stock

1. The Japanese Government is directed to transfer ¥ 25,000 in free yen from the "Custody Account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers," in the Bank of Japan, head office, Tokyo, to the Teikoku Bank, head office, Tokyo, as deposit against subscription for new issues of one hundred (100) shares of stock of Keio Teito Dentetsu K.K., two hundred (200) shares of stock of Odakyu Dentetsu K.K., and two hundred (200) shares of stock of Keihin Kyuko Dentetsu K.K., which are allotted against five hundred (500) shares of stock of the Tokyo Kyuko Dentetsu K.K., presently registered in the name of Mr. T. Kawaji.

2. The Japanese Government is further directed to obtain from Mr. T. Kawaji power-of-attorney required for the transfer of the above mentioned shares to the name of K.K. Irisu Shokai, and submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, a complete report of the transaction, together with the new certificates and power-of-attorney by 1 June 1948.

SUBJECT:

Disposition and Payment for "Adalin"

1. The Japanese Government is directed to release to the Welfare Ministry for sale or distribution approximately 5,600 packages of "Adalin", which are presently deposited with General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian as directed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Public Health and Welfare Section.

2. The Japanese Government is further directed to deposit the amount of ¥38,024, which will constitute payment in full, in the Yen Custody Account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Bank of Japan, to the credit of Bayer Yakuhin Gomi Kaisha. Report of action taken to implement this memorandum with a duplicate deposit slip, will be submitted within thirty (30) days from date of this memorandum to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander //2 for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

: Japanese Government

1. Reference is made to following memoranda from the Japanese Government, subject as above:

- C.L.C.O. No. 1342(IG) of 19 April 1948. b. C.L.C.O. No. 1815(IG) of 19 May 1948.
- 2. The lists of Australian civilians inclosed with referenced memoranda have been forwarded to the Australian Mission in Japan.
- 3. The Mission has informed this Headquarters that several of the individuals listed possess dual nationality, and has requested that the following information concerning the status of such dual nationals be transmitted to the Japanese Government:

"Persons born in Australia of Japanese parents would become British subjects under the Nationality Act 1920-1946 of the Commonwealth of Australia. They would retain that status provided they have not taken any action which would result in their forfeiting their British nationality. If they are also Japanese nationals in contemplation of Japanese Nationality Law, they would not be granted any protection or assistance by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia whilst they are in Japan".

Action Taken on Central Limison and Coordination Office Memoranda

1. No objection is offered to the following Central Limison and Coordination Office Memoranda:

- a. No. 524 (LO 767/204) of Mitsubishi Mining Company, Ltd., and four (4) other coal mining companies to borrow a total of \$31,056,400. to purchase additional machinery for implementing their respective mine rehabilitation projects for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1947.
- b. No. 969 (LO 1169/258) of Japan Coastwise Steamship Company, Ltd, for permission to borrow \$3,133,000, for its share of the costs of repair to a cargo vessel, NAGATA MARU, provided the final agreement between Sempaku Kedan and the applicant is executed to conform to the applicable policy as established with the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- c. No. 973 (LO 1167/256) of Seika Mining Company, Ltd, for permission to borrow \$2,005,000. to cover added costs of previously authorised construction of coal cars for the six months period ending 30 September 1947.
- d. No. 1017 (LO 1166/255) of Sanyo Oil and Fat Industry, Ltd. for permission to borrow \$1,001,952.98 to cover added costs of previously authorized construction at its Penicillin plant in Nagoya.
- e. No. 968 (LO 1168/257) of Japan Automobile Company, Ltd., for permission to sell government bonds at their current market value of \$181,851. and borrow an additional \$2,258,993. to renovate the third floor of an office building, repair a garage and transfer machinery from the office building to its Kunitachi plant.
- 2. Funds will be released and withdrawn in accordance with the Emergency Financial Measures of the Japanese Government and amendments thereto. No specific financial institutions will be identified as the lending agencies.
- 3. Materials and equipment purchased for construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation authorized by this memorandum will be purchased at official prices.

 - (2) Percent of project completed.

Action Taken on Central Liaison and Coordination Office Memoranda

1. No objection is offered to Central Liaison and Coordination Office Memorandum No. 1078 (IO 1186/267) of Toa Metal Industry, Ltd. for permission to sell 3,718 tsubo of land, buildings and fixtures located at Uozumi-mura, Akashi-gun, Hyogo Prefecture for \$2,500,000. provided that proceeds from the sale will be deposited immediately in the applicant's bank account and will be disbursed in accordance with the plan, submitted by the applicant under the law concerning the emergency measures for the account of companies, as finally approved by the Japanese Government. That part of the application requesting permission to sell 3,590 tsubo of agriculture land is not favorably considered.

2. No objection is offered to Central Liaison and Coordination Office Memoranda No. 706 (LO 1112/233) of Yamashita Mining Company, Ltd. and No. 1077 (LO 1184/265) of Special Overhead Cable Metal Fixtures Trade Company, Ltd, (High Tension Wire and Tools Cooperative Sales Company, Ltd) for permission to dissolve provided:

a. The applicant files a petition for liquidation pursuant to the provisions of the Commercial Code of Japan.

- b. The income, less current liquidating expenses, will be deposited promptly by the receiver until final liquidation of all assets has been completed and such deposits utilized for payment of remaining debts.
- c. Upon completion of liquidation the Japanese Government will submit promptly to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, a full report concerning the liquidation.
- d. Distribution of the proceeds will not be made to any shareholder and payment of any retirement allowance will not be made to any executive officer without prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- e. Liquidation of securities shall be made under Fair Trade Commission jurisdiction by submitting reports and plans to the Fair Trade Commission as required by Cabinet Order No. 43 of 1948.

Distribution of Surplus United States Army Clothing as Incentive Goods to Coal Miners

1. The Japanese Government is authorized to distribute the following items of surplus United States Army clothing, now in custody of the Japanese Government, as incentive goods to coal miners to encourage coal production:

13,819 work suits
50,000 prs of trousers
40,000 cotton jackets
60,000 wool coats
70,000 shirts
180,000 prs of drawers
130,000 undershirts

- 2. Each piece of clothing will be clearly and distinctively marked to indicate that these articles are authorized for legal release and to distinguish them from clothing used by Occupation Forces.
- 3. These articles will be distributed according to the plans submitted by the Economic Stabilization Board at prices established by the Price Board, and no import duty or commodity tax will be levied on them.
- 4. The Japanese Government will take all necessary action to insure that this clothing will be distributed only through official channels and does not appear in public unauthorized sales.
- 5. Records of receipt and distribution of the goods by regional or prefectural distributing agencies and by the mines are to be submitted as soon as feasible.
- 6. Direct communication between the Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the responsible agencies of the Japanese Government, regarding the distribution of the above clothing is authorized.

- 5. The Japanese Government will require all handlers of these goods to keep accurate records of the goods received and distributed by them.
- 6. The Japanese Government will submit monthly reports on shipments, arrivals and distribution to fishermen of these goods. These reports will be submitted on the 10th of each month for the preceding month.

- e. SCAPIN 1862, file AG 311.1 (20 Feb 48)CCS, dated 20 February 1948, subject: International Mail Service.
- f. SCAPIN 1884, file AG 311.1 (25 Apr 48)CCS, dated 25 April 1948, subject: International Mail Service.
- 2. International postal service between Japan and all other countries will operate in accordance with the instructions embodied herein. This memorandum neither adds to nor abrogates any of the International postal services which have been authorized to date.
- 3. Letters and Post Cards. Letters and post cards containing personal and family messages; and business, financial, commercial and transactional correspondence are mailable to and from Japan, subject to the following prehibitions:
- a. Wessages which transfer currency, checks, drafts, payment orders, or other credit or financial instruments.
- b. Messages which relate to the conversion, transfer, or disguising of any Japanese external assets by powers of attorney, proxies, instructions, or other means intended to defeat SCAP regulations regarding foreign exchange or the conversion of external assets.
- c. Messages which grant or transfer translation, reproduction, 6 9 performance or other rights concerning books, articles, plays, music,

motion pictures, or other media of information and expression, and messages relating in any way to patents or copyrights except for description and explanation of the authorized channels and procedures for handling such matters and except for acknowledgment of rights arranged through the authorized channels.

- l. Commercial Papers. Commercial papers as defined by the Universal Postal Union standards and limitations are mailable to and from Japan, with the following exceptions:
 - a. Scores or sheets of music in manuscript.
 - b. Manuscripts of works or newspapers sent separately.
 - c. All papers of legal precedure.
 - d. Documents of all kinds drawn up by Ministerial officers.
- 5. Prints. The mailing to and from Japan of books, magazines and all other printed matter under the classification of "Prints" is authorized, subject to the provisions and limitations of the Universal Postal Union Convention.
- 6. Samples and Small Packets. These classifications of mail matter, as defined by the Universal Postal Union Convention, are mailable to and from Japan.
- 7. Parcel Post. a. Mailing is permitted by parcel post of trade samples weighing more than eighteen (18) ounces, and ordinary commercial items of merchandise, to and from Japan, subject to the following regulatory provisions:
 - (1) Weight limit will be in accordance with limitations provided by the Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement and/or applicable bilateral agreements, but not exceeding twenty-two (22) pounds per parcel.
 - (2) Parcels originating in Japan containing trade samples will require licenses approved by Boeki Cho, and must have Customs Declaration tags attached indorsed "Trade Samples Only". Parcels containing trade samples originating elsewhere and destined for Japan will have attached thereto Customs Declaration showing character of articles and that they are trade samples.
 - (3) Parcels containing ordinary items of merchandise in commercial quantities, to and from Japan, must be accompanied by a certified or photostatic copy of a license validated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers permitting such importation or exporta-

tion. The words "Import License Inclosed" or "Export License Inclosed", whichever is applicable, must be indorsed on the wrapper as well as the words, "This Package may be Opened for Customs Inspection."

b. Mailing of "Relief" parcels, to Japan only, is permitted, subject to a weight limit of twenty-two (22) pounds. The contents of parcels are restricted to relief items such as non-perishable feeds, mailable medicines in non-commercial quantities, soap, clothing and other relief items, in quantities which reasonably can be used by the addressee and/or his immediate family. The following specific limitations apply to each parcel:

(1) Only one of the following tobacco items can be included in a single percel:

Cigarettes - not more than two hundred (200) pieces.

Cigars - not more than fifty (50) pieces.

Pipe tobacco - not more than one-half (2) pound.

(2) Not more than one thousand (1,000) saccharine tablets in a single parcel.

c. Gift articles, as distinguished from relief items, such as watches, fountain pens, etc., will not be permitted entry.

d. Only one relief parcel per week may be mailed by or on behalf of the same sender to or for the same addressee.

e. Undeliverable relief parcels will not be returned to senders, but turned over to designated relief agencies for disposition.

f. Excessive quantities of permitted items; that is, quantities in excess of the reasonable needs of the addressee and/or his immediate family, will be extracted by the Japanese Customs Service and delivered to the appropriate agency of the Eighth Army for distribution to recognized relief agencies.

g. All parcels entering Japan will be subject to examination by Japanese Customs Service. All parcel post packages (including "relief" parcels), samples and small packets and other articles entering Japan through International mail channels and submitted to Customs examination are subject to a customs clearance fee to be collected from the addressee upon delivery. Fee to be collected will not exceed the amounts specified by the Universal Postal Union Convention or applicable bilateral parcel post agreements. Importation of dutiable articles will be subject to prevailing laws and regulations governing examination, appraisal and assessment of duty (items in authorized quantities in "relief" parcels will continue to be duty free).

- h. Each parcel post package must have securely attached thereto a "Customs Declaration" on which must be shown full and precise details.
 - i. Neither insurance, registry nor C.O.D. service is included.
- j. Undeliverable parcels (except "relief" parcels) will be treated in accordance with the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement, or applicable bilateral agreements.

k. Prohibited articles:

- (1) Items included under Article 16, Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement.
- (2) Articles prohibited in Japan's International regular-
- (3) Any book, paraphlet, paper, writing, advertisement, circular, printing or drawing containing any matter advocating or urging treason or insurrection against any government.
- (4) Articles prohibited under terms of bilateral parcel post agreements between Japan and other countries.
- 8. International Air Mail Service. a. Japan's authorized International air mail service will embrace all mailable matter authorized now or later in the International regular-mail service to and from Japan.
- b. Transportation of International air mail both to and from Japan will be by commercial carriers only. Air mail destined for Japan will be dispatched in pouches labeled to Tokyo only.
- 9. Registry Service. Registration is permitted of all mailable matter authorized in the International regular-mail service, including air mail, to and from Japan, in accordance with the following:

a. Charges:

- (1) Registration fee of seven (7) yen per article, except that a domestic registration fee of five (5) yen will apply to each registered article destined for Korea.
- (2) A fee of five (5) yen for a return receipt requested at time of mailing of an article and seven (7) yen when request is made after the mailing of the article.

b. Extent of responsibility:

(1) Provision for the payment of indemnity is not included and cannot be considered until an International exchange rate for Japanese yen is established.

Restitution of Receptacles for High Pressure Gas Locted from the Philippine Islands

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property Being Restored to Claimant Nations Under the Restitution Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

- 2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore the 94 receptacles for high pressure gas, CPC No. 3781, which are at present in protective oustody at the Kizugawa Kanpon Looted Property Warehouse, Osaka, to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines.
- 3. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for delivery of the property to the designated port in Japan and stowage on board the claimant nation's craft at that port are outlined in reference above.
- 4. Major C. R. Velasco has been designated by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for the subject property.
- 5. 1. The French Mission in Japan has requested the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to transmit an invitation from the French Government to the Japanese Government to participate in the Ninth General Convention of Weights and Measures to be held in Paris next October. A copy of the memorandum from the French Mission embodying the invitation is enclosed together with a copy of the preliminary program for the Conference.

2. Careful consideration has been given to attendance at the conference by a representative of the Supreme Commander accompanied by a Japanese National as a technical adviser. While some benefit to Japanese industry would undoubtedly result, this Headquarters does not believe that the use of Japan's limited foreign credits for this purpose is sufficiently urgent at this particular time. This information has been conveyed to the French Mission. At the same time, the Mission has been requested to express the appreciation of the Supreme Commander and the Japanese Government to the Director of the International Bureau of Weights and Measures for the invitation.

Reference is made to the Universal Postal Convention and the related arrangements, adopted by the 12th Congress of the Universal Postal Union in Paris, France in 1947, and contained in Volume III of the Documents of the Paris Congress as published in French and distributed by the International Bureau of the Universal Postal Union at Berne, Switzerland. Copies of Volume III have been furnished to the Ministry of Communications of the Japanese Government.

2. It will be noted that Section XVII of the Final Protocol of the Convention, as translated into English, reads in part as follows:

"XVII

"Protocol left open to countries for the moment prevented from adhering to the Convention and its arrangements.

"l. (Omitted).

"2. Germany, Japan and Korea, for the time being prevented from adhering to the convention and to its arrangements can, without undergoing the formalities prescribed by Article III, adhere to these Articles at a time judged opportune by the responsible authority.

"3. Notice of the adherences referred to in Paragraph 1 & 2, should be presented in diplomatic form by the interested governments to the government of the French Republic and by this latter to the other states of the Union."

3. With reference to the Final Protocol of the Convention, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers considers the time opportune for Japan to adhere to the Universal Postal Union Convention and to such of its related arrangements as the Japanese Government may determine.

4. If the Japanese Government desires at this time to avail itself of such authority, appropriate notification of adherence should be communicated to the Diplomatic Section, General Headquarters, 23.6.15

With respect to Articles III and IV of the Protocols, signature or acceptance of the Protocols on behalf of Japan is not a matter for consideration at the present time.

Japanese Whaling Operations in the Antarctic in the 1948-1949 Season

- 1. Reference is made to:
- a. Memorandum for Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217 (3 Nov 45) NR (SCAPIN 233), 3 November 1945, subject, "Whaling Industry".
- b. Memorandum for Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217 (24 Aug 46) NR (SCAPIN 1154), 24 August 1946, subject, "Whaling Industry".
- c. Memorandum for Japanese Government from General Headquarters. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217 (27 Sep 47) NR (SCAPIN 1785), 27 September 1947, subject, "Whaling Industry".
- d. Memorandum from Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, C. L. C. O. No 1638 (2P), subject, "Japanese Whaling Operations in the Antarctic for the 1948-1949 Season", 7 May 1948.
- 2. Japanese whaling operations in the Antarctic are hereby authorized for the 1948-1949 season. Such operations will be conducted only in the areas, during the period, and under the conditions set forth by the International Whaling Conventions or modifications thereof adopted prior to the season.
- 3. Within thirty days of the receipt of this memorandum, the Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval a plan for the organization and operation of the Antarctic Whaling Expedition. The expedition will consist of two fleets. The plan will include a list of the names and gross tonnages of the factory ships, catchers, and auxiliaries to be used and the names of the personnel who will manage each fleet. Subsequent to the approval of the plan or modification thereof, any substitution of vessels or personnel for those named must be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
 - 4. Vessels participating in the whaling expedition will comply with

the following:

- a. Each vessel will be marked and operated in conformity with directives from the Administrator, Naval Shipping Control Authority.
- b. Each vessel will display in the prescribed manner only the International code flag "E" (Easy) modified. At no time will the flag of the Japanese Merchant Marine be flown.
- c. The master of each of the participating factory ships will maintain a duplicate of the ship's log which will be available for inspection at all times and upon completion of the expedition will be submitted, properly certified, to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. In addition, a log will be maintained in English containing the text of all radiograms received from the catcher boats reporting the killing of whales.
- d. The master of each of the participating factory ships during the periods enroute to and from the whaling area will forward daily radiograms to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo listing the position of his ship at 1200 hours local time on the date the radiogram is dispatched.
- e. The master of each of the participating factory ships during whaling operations will forward a daily radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo containing the following information:
 - Position of his ship at 1200 hours local time on the date the radiogram is dispatched.
 - (2) Number and kind of whales processed during the previous 24-hour period ending at 2400 hours local time, output of whale oil and other products, and raw material weights of meat, blubber and other materials processed as food stuffs.
- f. The senior Japanese Government Inspector aboard each of the two participating factory ships will personally verify all information forwarded to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo by radiogram as required in paragraphs d and e above.
- g. Applications for frequencies for radio communication by the whaling fleets will be made to Civil Communications Section, General Head-quarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- h. Each vessel will proceed to and return from the whaling area by the most direct route and without approaching land nearer than 12 miles.

BASIC: Memo for JG SCAPIN 1913

The route to be followed by each vessel will be supplied to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East, by the Japanese Government 15 days prior to the departure of each vessel from Japan and from the whaling area.

- i. The master of each of the two factory ships will, upon conclusion of whaling operations, dispatch a radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo stating the date of departure of his ship from the whaling area.
- 5. The Japanese Bureau of Fisheries will maintain at its office in Tokyo a file of all communications between the whaling fleets and Japan for reference by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers when desired.
- 6. The whale oil produced by operations in the Antarctic will be transported to Japan and as quickly as possible after its arrival will be suitably stored and safely guarded. Within ten days of storage, the Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the place or places of storage, the amount stored, and the quality of the oil.
- 7. The Japanese Government will verify the cargo of each vessel arriving in Japan from the whaling area, and within ten days of discharging of cargo will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the exact cargo of each vessel and the condition of the cargo.
- 8. Thirty days prior to the departure of the first units of the expedition, the Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the allocation of petroleum products to the participating companies. The Japanese Government will also verify the amount of petroleum products aboard each vessel immediately prior to its departure from Japan and upon its arrival in Japan from the whaling area. Within ten days of the departure and arrival, the Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the exact amounts of petroleum products aboard each vessel.
- 9. The attention of the Japanese Government is directed to the memoranda referred to in paragraphs 1 a, b, and c, above. Reports required by the referenced memoranda will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers prior to 1 June 1949.
- 10. This authorization does not establish any precedent for whaling operations in the Antarctic or in any other area for any subsequent period
