The equipment shall be permanently affixed to the vessel in such a manner that it will be impossible to direct soundings in any direction other than vertical.

SUBJECT: Baggage Held in Bombay Customs Belonging to Japanese Subjects.

TO: Japanese Government

- 1. Reference is made to Central Liaison Office memorandum No. 9580 (RJ) of 15 December 1947 concerning baggage belonging to former Japanese diplomats repatriated from Iraq, Egypt, and India. Information has been received from the government of India that of the 112 packages belonging to Japanese personnel in Egypt, 110 were delivered to the Custodian of Enemy Property, Bombay, and that two of these were destroyed in the Bombay dock explosion in 1944. It is agreeable to the Government of India to release the 110 pieces of baggage subject to the payment of storage charges being deferred for later settlement.
- 2. Information has also been received that baggage belonging to Japanese personnel formerly in Iraq was not delivered to the custodian. The latter is now inquiring of the transportation office Bombay regarding the whereabouts of this baggage.
- 3. As regards the property of the Japanese Consulate in India, this Headquarters has been informed that the Custodian of Enemy Property, Bombay has taken over such property from the Swedish Consulate, Bombay. The question of its disposal is still under the consideration of the Government of India.
- 4. This Section originally anticipated that United States naval vessels might transport the baggage from Bombay to Japan, but it has now been found that no such vessels are expected to call at Bombay in the near future. The Government of India has therefore been requested to arrange shipment, but to defer payment of shipping charges for later settlement between the governments of India and Japan, as in the case of storage charges.

- 2. Reference lc above, is hereby rescinded and the procedures detailed herein will be used. These procedures are designed to implement the policy of General Headquarters, Supreme > Commander for the Allied Powers.
- 3. Effective upon receipt of this memorandum, the following procedures will govern the release of precious metals for domestic use and consumption:
- a. The Japanese Government will consolidate precious metals requirements for domestic use and consumption for each three-months period into a paper to be called the "Quarterly Allocation of Precious Metals." This paper will be submitted

to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, at least two months prior to the first day of the three-month period during which released metals are required;

- b. No other requests for the release of precious metals for domestic use and consumption will be submitted except emergency requests, which may be submitted only after informal approval by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The responsible Ministry of the Japanese Government will obtain this informal approval. After such approval, the request will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian:
- c. The "Quarterly Allocation of Precious Metals" will be presented in such form as may be prescribed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Except where companies or juridical persons have firm names properly registered in English or other languages using the Roman lettering, names of all juridical persons will be given in Romaji-Hepburn. Requests not properly submitted will not be favorably considered:
- d. In the submission of requests for approval for the release of precious metals, and in the use and consumption of precious metals authorized, each Ministry of the Japanese Government, having jurisdiction or authority will be responsible for:
  - (1) Reviewing, screening and giving initial approval only to proper requests falling within their jurisdiction;
  - (2) Determining that the end use for which the metals are requested is proper and that only required amounts are given initial approval;
  - (3) Disapproving all requests which do not conform to policies established by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:
  - (4) Disapproving all requests which are not of a nature essential to the national requirements of the Japanese people;

- (5) Controlling the proper use of released precious metals.
- e. Metals released for domestic use and consumption will be fabricated, or processed for use or consumed in producing the articles, equipment or supplies, during the authorized three-month period, except as itemized below. The extended use herein authorized does not diminish the responsibility of the Japanese Government detailed above. Responsible Ministries of the Japanese Government will continue to exercise supervision and control over released metals so that they are not misused, wastefully used or diverted to unapproved uses:
  - (1) Where the recipients of precious metals are municipalities or institutions dedicated to religion, charity and education, the arts and sciences; or where released metals are to be used in producing articles or commercial forms for such institutions or municipalities; the period of use will, without further approval from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, be one of sufficient duration to enable the accomplishment of the objective for which the release was approved. In the case of educational institutions, this use may extend for a school year or more;
  - Where precious metals are released for public health purposes, the forms and alloys, prepared for medical and dental uses and forms and alloys in distribution channels or in rationed stocks supervised or controlled by the Ministry of Welfare, may be used or consumed without further approval from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;
  - (3) Metal processors, fabricators and other juridical persons who have received allocated metals may, without further approval from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, hold or use these metals

- (a) Enable the most economical fabrication and processing of precious metals;
- (b) Make repairs requiring the use or consumption of precious metals;
- (c) Remodel commercial and manufacturing equipment or articles;
- (d) Manufacture samples for export or display in sales exhibits in Japan or abroad.
- (4) Where, through no fault of the Japanese Government, released precious metals are not received by the actual consumers or processors until after the beginning of the quarter during which their use and consumption is authorized, the Japanese Government without further approval from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, may license the use of such metals for periods of time which will enable proper fabrication or use and consumption. This delayed use of precious metals will be reflected in reducing subsequent requests.
- 4. Effective upon the receipt of this memorandum, the following procedures will govern where precious metals are required in the production of items for export, and when items are produced in fulfilling contracts with the Central Purchasing Office, Far East Command:
- a. A copy of inclosure number 1 will be properly filled out by each manufacturer. This inclosure will be attached to each copy of the application to prepare for export (Specimen Form IE 100). At the time form IE 100, with inclosures, is submitted to the Economic and Scientific Section, Foreign Trade Division for validation, the forms will have attached or stamped thereon, a certificate, statement or stamp which shows that the Ministry of Finance, Japanese Government approves the use of the precious metals required in manufacturing the products itemized therein, and that the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for the use of proper amounts of precious metals is requested;

b. Commercial forms from the pool of precious metals, established by authority of reference 1d above, will be released for use as authorized by paragraph 4a above except that specific

requests for use of these forms may be included in the Quarterly Allocation where metals are required for domestic use and consumption.

- 5. Where the Japanese Government is directed to deposit precious metals into the custody of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, such deposits shall be made in the forms of bars of mint or near-mint fineness and in cases where deposits total an amount which cannot be filled by the where deposits total an amount which cannot be filled by the use of bars of standard size, one small or finger bar will be added to make up the total required. Each bar and finger bar shall be accompanied by four (4) copies of "Precious Metals Weight and Fineness Certificate," inclosure 2, written on paper eight (8) inches by eleven (11) inches in both Japanese and English and properly completed. No mutilated bars will be deposited. All bars will be marked with standard markings as generally used by the refinery or mint making the casting. These standard markings will in all cases, include trade-mark, fineness and weight.
- 6. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is not concerned with the repairing, remodeling, or remaking of purely private personal property composed of or containing precious metals, where such private property is owned by juridical persons not otherwise restricted, unless such actions taken with regard to this private property will:
- a. Consume precious metals previously licensed for use or consumption by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;
- b. Require the future release of precious metals to replenish articles or stocks destroyed or consumed by such

3. The following information will be transmitted to Mr. Egge:

Investigation discloses that personal property in the name of Marianne Beling is stored in the United States Eighth Army Ware-house in Tokyo. This property has been vested under the terms of the Allied Control Council Germany Law No. 5, "Marshalling and Vesting of German External Assets," dated 30 October 1945 as amended by Regulation I dated 5 May 1946, Article 2 of which reads as follows:

"All rights, titles and interests in respect of any property outside Germany which is owned or controlled by any person of German nationality inside Germany are hereby vested in the Commission."

Miss Beling's claim to diplomatic immunity would have no effect on the vesting of her property, inasmuch'as upon arrival in Germany she lost all right to claim such privileges. The rules and regulations governing the repatriation of diplomats from Japan extended only to those persons in Japan who qualified thereunder. There was no retroactive provision to include persons who no longer remained in Japan. Miss Beling's property has already been vested and release thereof is precluded.

SUBJECT:

Disposition of Garbage and Waste

- 1. The responsibility of the Japanese Government for the collection of garbage and waste from Occupation Force installations was set forth in Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers Memorandum AG 720 (27 Feb 47)GD (SCAPIN 1548) subject "Disposition of Garbage and Waste", 27 February 1947.
- 2. The development of practices contrary to the objectives of the foregoing SCAPIN have become increasingly evident. These practices include:
- a. The donation of money or presents to personnel of Occupation Force installations by authorized collectors of waste and garbage ostensibly in payment for the privilege of making such collections.
- b. The collection of garbage and waste materials by unauthorized individuals or agencies.
- 3. It is desired that the Japanese Government derive maximum revenue from garbage and waste collection contracts. The ability of some contractors to make unauthorized contributions in money or material gifts indicates the ability of these contractors to pay more for the privilege of making these collections and at the same time operate at a profit. It is, therefore, desired that immediate steps be taken to prohibit all donations and/or payments by authorized collectors of waste and garbage to any agency, organization or individual, private or governmental, for the privilege of making such collections, except those sums paid the Japanese Government and specifically set forth as a charge for the collection franchise. It is further desired that all outstanding contracts for collection of garbage and waste be reviewed, and in those instances where it is apparent that the Japanese Government is not receiving fair return for a particular contract a prompt upward revision of charges be made.
- 4. It is further directed that the Japanese Government report any instances involving solicitation of money or gifts by personnel employed at Occupation Force installations in connection with the collection of garbage and waste and, in addition, promptly report evidence of unauthorized collections of garbage and waste by unauthorized individuals or organizations.

Subj: Disposition of Garbage and Waste

- 5. It is considered incumbent upon the Japanese Government that action be taken to prosecute those Japanese nationals who tender or receive bribes or gratuities in connection with the collection and disposal of trash and garbage from Occupation Force installations in compliance with SCAPIN 1548.
- 6. The reporting of tendering or receipt of money or gifts for unauthorized collection of garbage and waste as outlined in preceding paragraph will be submitted to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, for all areas outside Tokyo, and to the Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Group, General Headquarters, Far East Command for the Tokyo area. Information copies of such reports will be forwarded to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at the time they are submitted to the commanders designated above.

Request by the Procurator General for Access to Records of the Disposition of Captured or Surrendered Japanese Supplies and Material

- 1. Reference is made to Central Liaison and Coordination Office's letter CLCO Number 1851 (2PA), dated 20 May 1948, subject, "Request for 'List of Arms and Munitions' to Expedite Investigation on Disposal of Arms and Munitions".
- 2. The Procurator-General is authorized to examine those records which pertain to the disposition of captured or surrendered Japanese supplies and equipment as were maintained by the Occupation Forces, and which are now in the custody of units of the Eighth Army. Since these records indicate the quantities of supplies and materials returned to the Japanese Government by area, the Procurator-General should be able to obtain therefrom the information requested.
- 3. It is desired to emphasize that in many cases the quantities of supplies and materials received by the Occupation Forces were accounted for on inventories prepared at the time of the surrender by officers of the former Japanese armed forces, and that subsequent release of the major portion or all of these supplies and materials to the Japanese Government was often accomplished by using the same inventory.
- 4. The Japanese Government is also informed that in a few instances the field reports maintained by some units of the Occupation Forces were returned to the United States at the time those units were withdrawn from Japan. It is believed that ample data exists to serve the purpose the Procurator-General has in view; however, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will endeavor to have those records returned in the event any should prove vital.
- 5. The Japanese Government will furnish identification cards to the designated representatives of the Procurator-General. The identi-

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.3 (6 Dec 47)CCS, SCAPIN 1830, dated 6 December 1947, subject same as above, as amended.

- 2. Effective OOOl hours, 1 August 1948, incoming calls to any person or organization in the Tokyo and Yokohama areas, from the United States or points beyond the United States, via the United States, will be handled as follows:
- a. Incoming calls to any person or organization in the Tokyo-Yokohama area will be routed to the addressee at one of several places, in the following order:
  - (1) To the Tokyo or Yokohama area telephone number supplied by the calling party when given.
  - (2) To the office or residence telephone number listed in a telephone directory for the Tokyo or Yokohama areas, when the number is not supplied by the calling party.
  - (3) When a called person is found not to be available to answer a telephone call over the telephone of his known office or residence every reasonable effort will be made by a locator operator at the overseas switchboard to complete the call to a telephone in the Tokyo or Yokohama area where the called person may be found.
- b. In the event the transmission quality of the telephone line on which the called person is located is deemed unsatisfactory to receive the overseas call the called person may be required to go to the nearest Overseas Business Office to receive the call during normal business hours, or to one of the foreign trade hotels during other hours.
- 3. Incoming calls addressed to other than occupation force personnel have been routed experimentally to the addressee's office or residence telephone number in any one of the ten (10) cities in Japan where overseas service has been provided. Authorization for the above was issued informally in connection with SCAPIN 1830/1, dated 6 February 1948. Informal provisions for such routing are hereby rescinded and the following will apply in lieu thereof:

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BASIC: Memo for Japanese Government, SCAPIN 1830/7

- a. Incoming overseas calls for other than occupation force personnel may be routed by the Hinistry of Communications to any telephone number at any location in Japan where the addressee may be located.
- b. If an incoming call cannot be completed in accordance with 3a above the addressee may be informed that in order to receive the call he must report to the nearest Overseas Booth, in one of the cities in Japan where overseas telephone service is provided.
- c. For distribution of incoming calls throughout Japan to other than occupation force personnel the Ministry of Communications may, if desired, utilize the wire circuits known as Overseas Short Period Talking Service, connecting Tokyo with certain cities in Japan, to convey the call to the Japanese city thus served, nearest the point where the addressee may be located.
- d. Incoming calls may be received and outgoing calls may be placed by other than occupation force personnel, within the provisions of this and any other existing applicable rules and regulations, during any period of the day or night when the overseas radiotelephone circuit is in operation and available.
- 4. All provisions of reference 1 not changed by this memorandum, remain in effect.
- 5. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, regarding matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

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

SUBJECT: Report of Mission on Social Security in Japan,

l. Pursuant to the request of the Japanese government and various private groups in Japan for advice and guidance with regard to social security, a special mission from the United States composed of individuals with considerable experience and knowledge in that field was invited by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to visit Japan to survey, evaluate, and submit a report of conclusions and recommendations as would aid in achieving a sound social security program for the Japanese people.

2. A copy of the Report of the Social Security Mission is submitted herewith as a document of reference and guidance to the Japanese people in formulating and effectuating plans for reformation of their present social security structure. The maintenance of a comprehensive and adequate social security program based on democratic precepts and within the limits of the nation's resources is believed to be a desired goal for the Japanese nation.

3. The recommendations contained in the Report with reference to organizational structure and delegation of administrative responsibilities represent one possible approach to the problem. As a result of extensive study and experimentations, other approaches as well as the one contained in the Mission's Report have been developed and successfully applied in various parts of the world.

4. The specific procedures and programs for implementation of social security should be determined in the light of existing conditions in Japan and the needs of those groups in the Japanese community primarily interested.

5. Direct contact is authorized between the interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and agencies in the Japanese government concerned with implementing plans of fundamental reformation of the program.
