1. In the pre-war time the Mitsui Warehouses at Onohama, the  
Mitsubishi warehouses at Takahama and the Mitsubishi warehouses  
at Daini Shinko were used exclusively for raw cotton in the  
port of Kobe. All of these warehouses, however, have been  
requisitioned by the Allied Forces, leaving no warehouse for  
storage of the raw cotton expected to be imported.

2. However, the storage space of 5,000 to 7,000 tsubo (1 tsubo  
is equal to 3.3 square meters) will be required when the monthly  
import is calculated at 50,000 bales. In consequence, it is  
absolutely necessary to have some of the above-mentioned ware-  
houses released and for that purpose the Japanese authorities  
concerned have approached the American authorities in Kobe on  
several occasions. No progress, however, has been made so far.

3. Under the above circumstances, it is requested that the  
General Headquarters be good enough to take up the matter and  
see to it that part of the subject warehouses be released for  
the storage of raw cotton to be imported shortly.

4. Various information concerning the conditions on the spot  
is herewith submitted, as per the enclosed explanatory notes,  
which may be of help to your investigations.

SUBJECT: Baggage for Korean Repatriates.

1. Reference: Memorandum AG 370.05(11 May 46)GC, dated 11 May 1946, subject as above.

2. The Japanese Government has carefully investigated the method of transporting the baggage of Korean repatriates and has reached the conclusion that the separate shipment of such baggage is inevitable for the following reasons:

a. If no separate shipment of baggage is to be made, the repatriates and their baggage must be transported together from their present place of residence. But:

(1) To place 250 lb. baggage for each repatriate aboard a passenger train together with their owners is technically impossible.

(2) The number of baggage cars are extremely short at present and to attach the necessary number of baggage cars to each repatriation train is difficult.

b. Repatriation vessels can only transport 35% of its passenger capacity if each of the repatriates carries 250 lb. baggage.

c. If each of the repatriates has to arrange for all his baggage at the ports of embarkation, there will inevitably be great confusion.

3. On the other hand, it is inadvisable at present to reduce the weight of each repatriates baggage as it would only strengthen the unwillingness of Koreans to repatriate.

4. In view of these circumstances, the best plan which has so far been worked out is as follows:

a. The baggage will be transported by goods-waggons to Hakata independent of the repatriates, and then shipped to Fusan aboard cargo boats. From Hakata to Fusan several representatives of the repatriates can be on board the cargo boats to take care of the baggage.

b. In order to avoid confusion at Hakata and Fusan as in the case of Choki-maru mentioned in the reference Memorandum,

it has been found advisable to meet the desire of the League of Korean Residents in Japan and to invite that organization to participate in the handling of baggage at both places in the following manner:

- (1) The Hakata Branch of the League of Korean Residents in Japan will assist the Japanese authorities in checking and loading on ships the baggage arriving at Hakata.
- (2) The Fusan Office of the League of Korean Residents in Japan will be charged with the responsibility of storing and sending to ultimate destinations the baggage arriving at Fusan from Hakata.

The League of Korean Residents in Japan has declared that its office can handle the baggage at Fusan if the above-mentioned procedure is approved of by the U.S. authorities.

5. As no other adequate method can be found to handle the baggage of the Korean repatriates, the Japanese Government submits the method mentioned in paragraph 4 above to the General Headquarters for their approval and requests that the U.S. Military authorities in Korea be notified of this plan.

1. Reference:

- c. SCAP Memorandum AG 091(4 Apr 46)GS (SCAPIN-912-A), dated 4 April 1946, subject: "Control of Formosans and Koreans Using Railways".

2. The Japanese Government informed the General Headquarters by reference a. and b. Memorandum of the illegal acts committed by Koreans, Formosans and Chinese in connection with railway transportation, and requested for approval of the Government's policy to prevent and suppress such conducts, at the same time asking for assistance and cooperation in the enforcement of these measures. Upon the receipt of the approval by reference c. Memorandum, the Japanese Government issued warnings about the matters to the representatives of various associations of the nationals in question, and published the said policy in the press and others in order that its purport might be made thoroughly known thereby to insure the prevention of further occurrences. From 25 March onwards, with the cooperation of the Allied Occupation troops, the suppression and prevention of obstructive conducts have been enforced simultaneously throughout the country.

3. As is shown in the appended report of the Ministry of Home Affairs, such illegal conducts have since shown no tendency of decreasing; on the contrary, there have been even cases of resistance to the police control and of concerted assaults causing injuries. In view of the gravity of the situation, it has been decided that enforcement of the preventive and repressive measures be continued till 13 April with the intention of exterminating these conducts.

4. A report of similar incidents and the steps so far taken is submitted hereunder. It would be greatly appreciated if the General Headquarters would extend further assistance and cooperation in this connection.

5. a. Collective Violence with Injuries to the Policeman on Duty.

(1) On 26 March, at Niizu Railway Station in Niigata Prefecture, 32 Koreans committed violence on 3 policemen on duty causing each one of them injuries taking 3 weeks to heal completely. Two of the culprits were captured on the spot, while the rest were arrested at this and that station during their flight by train.

(2) On 30 March in Toyama Prefecture, while some policemen were guarding a railway train No. 514, about 20 of the Korean passengers committed violence on a police sergeant giving him an injury requiring 2 weeks to heal. Realizing the situation, a policeman drew his sabre to intimidate them, and in the ensuing confusion a Korean was stabbed through his abdomen to death.

(3) On 3 April, at Tokyo Station, there was found a Chinese boarding a coach without a proper ticket, and the railway men and two policemen from the Metropolitan Police Board were intercepting him, when three Chinese came to his help and dealt blows at the policemen. One of them snatched away the short sword of a policeman and with it wounded both officers to the extent that they would not recover completely within 3 weeks. Another policeman on duty on the same platform, witnessing the incident, fired his pistol by way of intimidation and then together with an M.P. succeeded in arresting all the three.

b. Groups Boarding Trains without Tickets.

(1) On 27 March at Tokyo Station 30 Chinese without tickets forced their way through a platform wicket and boarded a second class coach. With some M.P.'s help an examination of the passengers' tickets was conducted and most of the Chinese were made to alight.

(2) On 28 March at Tokyo Station some 60 Chinese arrived in a group at a platform wicket as a train was on the point of starting. The policeman on the watch tried to prevent them, but on their presenting their repatriation certificates they were allowed to pass. The incident delayed the departure of the train by about 30 minutes.

(3) On 29 March at Tokyo Station about 30 Chinese without tickets forced their way through a platform wicket, but with the cooperation of an M.P. the officials in charge succeeded in getting them under control.

(4) On 29 March at Ichigaya Station on the Central Line several groups of Koreans tried to get on a train without tickets. But they were checked and persuaded to pay their fares. Altogether there were 39 of them.

c. Dishonest Acts in boarding Railway Trains.

(1) On 27 March at Tokyo Station about 60 Koreans were detected riding on a second class coach with third-class tickets and they were properly dealt with.

(2) On 30 March at the same station about 50 Chinese were detected in the same act and were similarly dealt with.

(3) On 31 March at the same place about 40 Formosans were caught doing the same and the same measure was taken.

d. Groups Purchasing Rice and Other Cereals in Black Market.

(1) On 27 March at various stations in Toyama Prefecture Koreans of vicious character who were on their way to Osaka carrying rice bought in the black market in Niigata Prefecture were made to alight. There were 23 of them, and they have been under examination since then.

(2) On 31 March at Toyama Station a group of about 200 Koreans carrying 30 koku of rice bought in the black market, were discovered exclusively and illegally occupying the last two coaches of a train from Aomori for Osaka and arrested.

(3) On the same day, in Ishikawa Prefecture a group of 54 Koreans who had 8 koku 3 to of rice purchased in the black market were detected and arrested.

(4) On 27 and 28 March, at various railway stations in Yamagata Prefecture about 300 Koreans in several groups who had come from Osaka with an intention to make purchases in the black market were discovered and forbidden to alight. They were sent back to the station of departure. Three of them of vicious character, were arrested.

e. Security Committee of the League of Koreans Pretending to Aid the Police.

On 25 March at the west entrance to Ikebukuro Station on the Yamate Line, ten members of the Security Committee of the Itabashi Branch of the League of Koreans in Japan were engaged, on the pretext that they were requested to aid police activities by the Itabashi Police Station, in examining the contents of passengers' baggage from 6 a.m., confiscating whatever rice and other cereals were found therein. They would not obey the warning of the policeman on duty. Thereupon, the policeman reported to the chief of his police station, who at once came to the spot and put an end to the illegal action, restoring the confiscated property to their owners.

1. The Central Liaison Office submits hereunder a report on a case of manslaughter committed by a Formosan in Okayama Prefecture. The culprit was prosecuted on 6 May by the prosecutor of the Okayama District Court, who made prompt contact with the Occupation Forces on the spot.
2. A summary of the case is stated below:
  - a. Offender: Kyu Kan Ryo, aged 20, an unemployed Formosan.
  - b. Circumstances: A quarrel arose between Kyu and the brothers Kataoka, when one of the brothers stepped on the former's foot on the crowded platform of the Innosho Station on the Himetsu line in Tsuyama City, Okayama Prefecture, about nine o'clock on the night of 25 April 1946. The quarrel developing into a fight, Kyu stabbed Masami Kataoka (aged 21) to death with a dagger which penetrated into the heart, further inflicting injuries on Noboru Kataoka (aged 19) on his head and face, which would take several months to heal completely.
  - c. Measures taken: Demand for a preliminary examination of the case was made by a prosecutor to the Tsuyama Branch of the Okayama District Court, on charges of inflicting injuries resulting in death and of inflicting bodily injuries.

The Nippon Agricultural Leaders Training School was established at Sugaya Mura, Saitama Prefecture, in April 1931, having as its aims the training of farmers' sons for future leadership in promoting the development of agriculture and in elevating the standard of self-government and culture in farming communities.

Being possessed of fields, 70,000 tsubo in extent, it attends mainly to the research work concerning the cultivation of rice, wheat, barley, vegetables, medicinal herbs, and the raising of live-stock. It gives lessons in science and technic necessary for such purposes, in addition to which etiquettes, morals, philosophy, etc., indispensable to social and cultural life, are also taught.

This institution not only enjoys high credit among intellectual circles, but has also attained a nation-wide fame.

It is a matter for grave concern whether notwithstanding the fact that it was in no way connected with militaristic movement, or with any military persons, before or during the War, the school may be ordered to dissolve only because of its nominal connection with the Kinkei Gakuin, which was recently directed to be dissolved. The same feeling of concern thereat is shared by the learned section of the people, and moreover, as it will affect seriously the planned increase of foodstuff production and live-stock raising, which is the most urgent problem today, petition is hereby submitted for permission to continue the School, as an entirely separate entity from the Kinkei Gakuin, at the earliest possible date.

The total value of commodities so far exported to Korea amounts approximately to one hundred ten million yen (¥ 110,000,000) when calculated on the basis of their official prices in Japan, while the imports from Korea, which consist mostly of salt (the value of which is computed on the basis of the tentative sale price for agencies of home distribution fixed by Board of Trade), have aggregated only eight hundred eighty-eight thousand yen (¥ 880,000) up to date. In consequence the balance of trade between the two countries appears exceedingly in favor of Japan.
3. The Japanese Government hereby requests that the General Headquarters be good enough, taking the above circumstances into consideration to expedite the importation from Korea of anthracite, graphite, magnesia clinker and rice, for which applications have been made repeatedly.
4. The Government also wishes to be informed of the view of the General Headquarters as to whether arrangements could be made so that the above favorable balance may be utilized as the funds for importation from third countries to Japan.

- a. Expediting of the repatriation of overseas Japanese.
- b. Efforts for insurance of the lives of Japanese internees abroad.
- c. Arrangement and enlargement of reception centers.
- d. Aid for livelihood of the bereaved families of overseas Japanese.
- e. Realization of their desires to stay permanently in their present places abroad.
- f. Unification and direction of relief work.

4. A financial statement:

The revenues of the Association are derived from membership fees and contributions. As membership fees, its member political parties, the Liberal, the Progressive, the Socialist, the Cooperative, and the Communist, have each paid two thousand yen, and as contributions, Mr. Hideyuki Miyoshi contributed seventeen thousand yen. Out of these incomes, the Association disbursed ten thousand yen as expenses of the national mass meeting held under its auspices on 20 February 1946, and about thirteen thousand yen as its business expenses, the amount of funds on its hand as at 18 May 1946 being about four thousand yen.

The compendium of their discussions at the meeting is as follows:-

Premier Shidehara.

It is my desire that the Japanese nation will accord sympathetic treatment to all those repatriates from overseas including demobilized servicemen, and that you will make further studies about the means of carrying out such treatment.

Chief Cabinet Secretary Narahashi.

The relief work for the repatriated Japanese and those still remaining abroad cannot be carried out successfully either by the hands of the government, or private people alone. The government and people should alike collaborate to deal with the matter as the national and social problem.

Association Members.

Our people generally are concerned deeply about the safety of the Japanese nationals in North Korea and Manchuria under the occupation of the Soviet Forces. As repatriation from these places has not yet been started. Our special efforts should therefore be directed for their realization.

Foreign Minister Yoshida.

(The Minister described the living conditions of overseas Japanese and the shipping arrangement for their repatriation, and then stated:) We are grateful for the Allied authorities who have been taking very sympathetic measures in this matter. The present state of shipping arrangements indicates that a fairly large number of Japanese will be repatriated in the course of this year. What we are most seriously concerned about, however, is the condition of our nationals in North Korea and Manchuria under the occupation of the Soviet Forces, but we are in receipt of information that the repatriation from these places, too, will possibly be started about the middle of March through such places as Gensan and Fusan.

Communist Party Members.

There is a tendency to circulate anti-Soviet propagandas relating to miserable conditions of the Japanese in North Korea and Manchuria. It is desirable that such a tendency be wiped out and our efforts be directed towards gaining the goodwill of the Soviets. According to communist party members who have come back home through the said districts, there is no such fact of miserable conditions ruling.

Foreign Minister Yoshida.

As regards the conditions ruling in regions under the Soviet occupation, the government is giving information gathered from all sources. As regards, for instance, the conditions in Dairen which are reported to be good, we made public to that effect, and as regards places where, according to the reports made by persons coming home, undesirable conditions prevailed, we told the public as they were. In view of the present international situation, we are especially cautious not to make any sort of remark which is liable to be taken as an anti-Soviet propaganda.

Association Member Tsuneo Kanemitsu proposed establishment of a committee composed jointly of government officials and private people to deal with the relief work of overseas Japanese.

All present at the meeting supported the proposition.

Under the circumstances stated above, they have decided to establish a Joint Committee for Relief of Overseas Japanese, and that the Cabinet will deal with the business of the Committee, and the members of the Committee will include all the members of the said Association who were present at the above meeting, Vice-Ministers of Foreign Affairs, Home Affairs, Welfare, Finance, Commerce and Industry, Agriculture and Forestry, Education, and Transportation, Vice-Director of the Communications Board, and Chiefs of the Bureaus concerned.

2. The Japanese Government submits hereunder the report required by paragraph 3d. of reference Memorandum.

3. The following measures have been taken in order to provide adequate supplies for repatriation shipping utilizing the port of Nagoya.

a. On 18 May 1946 the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry directed the Governor of Aichi Prefecture to increase the supply of vegetables and pickles for the repatriation ships.

b. Between 20 and 21 May the same Ministry took the necessary steps to deliver to Aichi Prefecture the following foodstuffs:

bean-paste (3,375 kg.), soy sauce (234 lit.),  
canned food (30,000 lb.), edible oil (3,375 kg.),  
canned milk (100 cans), fresh fish (18,750 kg.),  
whale-meat (187,500 kg.).

c. The Ministry of Finance, having been informed that the main cause of the delay in provisioning the repatriation vessels existed in the lack of new currency, gave special permission on 20 May for paying the necessary amount of money in new currency.

d. The Ministry of Public Welfare ordered the Local Repatriation and Relief Bureau at Nagoya to take immediately the necessary steps to facilitate the provisioning of the repatriation ships. The Ministry of Transportation instructed the Maritime Bureau to cooperate in every way with the Local Repatriation and Relief Bureau for the same purpose. In consequence, there is no ship at present delayed at Nagoya due to inadequate supplies of food.

4. Though it is exceedingly difficult, under the present circumstances of the shortage of food, to build up stocks of sufficient provisions at ports used by repatriation shipping, the Japanese Government will do its best and has already taken steps as follows:

a. On 21 May the Bureau of Staple Food Administration, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, directed all the chiefs of the local Bureaux of Staple Food to build up in the port areas stocks of the estimated amount of staple food necessary for a ten day period.

It is also expected that adequate quantities of other subsidiary food shall be stored in so far as possible with regard to the food conditions of the respective localities,

b. Up to the present, the Civil Merchant Marine Committee has been effectively in charge of the supply of food to repatriation shipping because of its wide practical experience. In order to avoid any ambiguity of responsibility, however, it was confirmed at a recent conference of the Ministries concerned that the Ministry of Public Welfare (consequently, the Repatriation and Relief Board and local Repatriation and Relief Bureaux) would assume the whole responsibility for provisioning repatriation vessels and the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and the Ministry of Finance would supply the Ministry of Public Welfare with the food, spirits and tobacco required.

5. The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry is making a nation-wide readjustment of the demand and supply of food and other subsidiary articles of diet. It will make more efforts to insure that the supplies of food for repatriation ships are levied proportionally on all Prefectures of Japan.

2. Details concerning the representation of Japanese interests to date are as per annex. At present, Sweden continues to function as protecting power in countries where she represented Japanese interests prior to the termination of the war. Only the minimum routine functions are being carried out apparently because of the lack of funds and pertinent documents, as well as the lack of direct communication between the Swedish Diplomatic Mission and the Japanese Government.

3. In countries, other than those in which Sweden is acting as protecting power, there are no provisions for the routine care of Japanese nationals. Consequently, they are unable to complete the fundamental legal procedures such as marriage, divorce, adoption, etc. Japanese nationals both abroad and at home are also unable to inherit property or to deliver last testaments to their families. Moreover, since the individuals abroad and their relatives in Japan are unable to communicate with each other, all parties concerned are in an unsettled state of mind.

4. In view of these legal and humanitarian considerations, the Japanese Government desires to take such steps as may be approved of by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to regularize this situation.

5. The Japanese Government, therefore, desires to obtain the approval of the General Headquarters for either of the following two proposals:

- a. The Swiss and/or the Swedish Governments be requested, through the good offices of the General Headquarters, to represent Japanese interests. In this connection, the Japanese Government requests that authorization be granted to

- (1) communicate with the Protecting Powers,
- (2) pay necessary costs to the Protecting Power,
- (3) release from custody of the Allied Powers to the Protecting Powers such documents as may be necessary for the protection of Japanese nationals.

The Japanese Government, in view of former relations, proposes that Sweden and Switzerland represent Japanese interests in the following countries respectively, but has no objection to any alternative grouping:

Switzerland

Salvador, Panama, Cuba, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Argentine, Spain, Egypt, Afghanistan, Eire, Portugal and Sweden.

Sweden

Mexico, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Peru, Brazil, Bolivia, Paraguay, Uruguay, Chile, Denmark, Finland, Belgium, Rumania, Bulgaria, Turkey, Syria, Iraq, Iran, Switzerland, Italy and Siam.

In countries other than those enumerated above, excepting those mentioned in paragraph 6, it is requested that the countries be allotted to the Protecting Powers by the General Headquarters as it may deem fit.

- b. Should the above-mentioned two powers decline to represent Japanese interests in spite of the anticipation expressed in the reference b. and d. Memoranda, the Japanese Government desires to be authorized to appoint agencies at least in localities where a large number of Japanese nationals reside, to perform limited functions. In this case, permission is requested to

- (1) maintain minimum communication facilities between the agencies and the Japanese Government,
- (2) pay necessary funds to the agencies,

(3) receive pertinent documents now in Allied custody.

The functions of the agencies are to be limited to the following:

- (1) Protection of Japanese nationals.
- (2) Relief of indigent Japanese nationals.
- (3) Ascertaining of desire of repatriation to Japan.
- (4) Receipt of reports on registration of Japanese nationals.
- (5) Facilitation of correspondence between individuals abroad and their families or relatives in Japan.
- (6) Receipt of reports concerning the liquidation and custody of Japanese business firms abroad.

Should the General Headquarters approve the above proposal the Japanese Government is prepared to submit details concerning it. It may be added that it will not be necessary for Japanese nationals to perform the functions, and therefore the nationals of the country in which the agency is located or a third power national may be selected for this purpose.

6. In view of the legal and humanitarian hardships mentioned in paragraph 3 above, it is requested that steps similar to those outlined in the previous paragraph be considered at the earliest possible opportunity in the case of the countries mentioned in B, paragraph 1 of the reference B. Memorandum. The Japanese Government desires that the representation be fixed as follows on the basis of former practice, but there is no objection to any alternative grouping.

Switzerland

U.S.A. (excluding Hawaii), East Samoa, Canada, United Kingdom, British East Africa, Australia, British West Indies, New Zealand, West Samoa, New Caledonia, New Hebrides and France.

Sweden

Hawaii, India, Ceylon, South Africa, and USSR.

As for China and other countries in East Asia, the Japanese Government expresses no preference as to which of the two neutral powers acts as protecting power.

2. Regarding the subject case, the outline of which was re-  
ported by reference Memorandum, the Public Procurator's  
Office of the Osaka District Court conducted further inquiries  
and, in consequence, six persons out of the detained, as named  
in subparagraph a. below, were indicted on the charge of  
violating the "Law concerning the Punishment of Acts of Violence  
and Others", an application for his trial being made to the  
Osaka Local Court. The circumstances surrounding the suspected  
crimes are stated hereunder:

a. Suspected persons.

Formosan	Ko En-sen (27)
Do.	Go Ten-fuku (28)

Korean	Ri Ei-fu (32)
Do.	Kanamoto Ichiro (25)

b. Suspected facts.

On 13 March 1946, about at 00:30 p.m., the Sonezaki  
Police in Osaka Prefecture launched a wholesale arrest of  
staple food dealers and apprehended a Formosan, Kakuro,  
and ten others, who were keeping open-air Chop-suey stalls  
and the like at the so-called Umeda Free Market in Osaka  
City in violation of the regulations. The above suspects,  
indignant over the police action, rallied their comrades  
and, resorting to threats and violence, attempted to take  
back the arrested, while they were being examined at the  
police station. Details follow:

(1) About one p.m. on the same day, Ko En-sen, together  
with more than ten others, forced their way into the room  
of chief of the police station and threatened the chief,  
Kotaro Yamaguchi, by shouting such intimidatory words as  
"Let off the arrested men at once, or the police station  
shall be burned down". "Now that you have put our friends

to shame, you shall be handcuffed too, and taken out into  
the market", etc. etc.

(2) Ko En-sen, accompanied by more than thirty persons,  
rushed into the police chief's room about at three p.m.,  
and demanded him to discharge the arrested compatriots  
forthwith. The chief refusing it flatly, they went into  
the next room and, seizing by the collar Toshiichi Takada,  
chief of the Crime Prevention Section, who happened to be  
there, struck him on the cheek. Several others surrounded  
Tatsujiro Yamane, policeman in charge of search affairs,  
and violently twisted his arm.

(3) To take back the arrested by the force of a mob, the  
six suspects, combined with hundreds of companions, besieged  
the police station once again about at five p.m. and Ko  
En-sen, who stood at the head of the mob, rushed into the  
police chief's room with several others and tried to scare  
him, pressing hard upon him in encirclement, each shouting  
threats. Kanamoto Ichiro and Cho Ten-tei, other suspects,  
getting into the police station together with scores of  
comrades, made such riots as to throw books on the table  
at the policemen thereabout and cut off telephone lines.  
Go Ten-fuku, Ri Ei-fu and Rin Ken-so, still other suspects,  
hurled stones at the police station from outside in con-  
junction with hundreds of others, and caused damage to  
window panes and fixtures.

c. Other informations.

(1) Immediately after the occurrence of the incident, mem-  
bers of the Sonezaki Police Station arrested more than  
fifty suspects with the cooperation of MPs, and their  
examination was carried out by the public procurator who  
arrived there without delay.

(2) Chief rioters being presumed to be the above six, the  
other people were all discharged.

(3) Chin Bai-ha and Tan Sui-ro, Formosans, who are alleged  
to be prime movers of the case, ran away from the spot to-  
gether with some two hundred companions, and their arrest  
is deemed difficult.
