

- According to the best data available to the Japanese Government, under constant revision through the return of repatriates, there were at the time of the surrender in 1945 a total of 2,723,000 Japanese, including both civilians and troops, in the areas under Soviet control Euriles and Sakhalin, Korea north of 38° lat., Kanaharia, and Ruentung territory. Of this number, 900,000 were nombers of the army and 14,000 numbers of the navy. These figures do not include 30,000 estimated combet fatalities preceding the cossation of all hostilities.
- 2. Subsequently, as is well known, large numbers of these captured Japanese were removed by the Soviet authorities to Siberia and other areas of the Soviet Union, but we have never received any official information as to the number so transferred. There have also been indications of some retransfers of Japanese, especially sick persons, from Siberia to Manchuria and North Korea. Statistically however these undeclared transfers are not of immediate importance, as such transfers did not change the number of Japanese who fell into Soviet hands.
- 3. To date, out of the above-mentioned captives, about 2,254,000 have been repatriated, leaving 469,000 Japanese taken captive by the Soviet Union unrepatriated. Details are as follows:

4. Our best current estimate is that, of this total, approximately 60,000 are in Manchuria, and the rest in territories of the Soviet Union, including Sakhalin and the Kurilea.

5. The above figures do not take into account double in interment, as the Japanese Government has not received any information from the capturing power as to any such double. It is however evident that deaths have been very mesercus. There have been forwarded to the Japanese Liaison, G-2 Section, GHQ, SCAP, by the Demobilization Bureau, Repairietion Relief Agency, restors containing the messe, date and place of death, of 57,355 members of the former Japanese array and navy who died efter the conclusion of heatilities, in interment; 17,416 of them died in Manchuria and the Kwantang Tarritory, and 39,927 in the Seviet Union, Sakhalin, Kuriles and Morth Rosse. In these restors are included the messe of only such persons whose death was reported to the competent Japanese authorities with conclusive and edequate evidences, and whose official death notice has already been issued by the appropriate Japanese government agencies. Such evidence in all cases consists of testimony by a minimum of two eye-vitnesses (repairietse) whose reports tally as to date, place, cause and circumstences of danth.

- 6. There have been reports of memorus additional deaths, but evidence as to those is not adequate under this criterion. The Desolutionation fureau estimates that in Deviat areas excluding Manchuria and the Avantung territory, a total of 90,000 residers of the furear Japanese array slows have died in interment.
- 7. The Describination Eurosu has also furnished to Jepanese Lisian, G-2 Section, CHQ, SCAP, resters containing the runes of 129,571 army and new intersecs in Soviet areas (excluding Manchuris and Eventury territory) whose presents there after the surrender, at time and place specifically indicated, has been verified, but the have neither been repetriated nor varified dead up to this time. - 1. During the war years, there were a great number of foreign students in Japan who received assistance of the Japanese Government in some form or other in the course of their studies in schools and colleges. The number of such students fluctuated year in and year out. In the peak year there were about 1,500 Chinese students and 300 other foreign students including Indonesian, Siamese and French Indo-Chinese. The situation in Japan, however, changed a great deal after after the war's end. Many of these students have since then left Japan for their countries, taking advantage of the facilities of repatriation provided by the General Headquarters, SCAP, and the Japanese Government
- 2. Since the war's end, as the number of foreign students decreased. the Japanese organizations through which Government assistance had been given to foreign students were reorganized into two associations, namely, Yurin Gakkai (Neighborhood Association) and Kokusai Gakuyukai (International Education Association); the former engaged in the work of assistance to Chinese students and the latter to the students of other nations alities.

The Yurin Gakkai has operated 15 dormitories in various places in this country, for the benefit of Chinese students, three of which are buildings which it owns while the rest are rented.

The Kokusai Gakuyukai has operated two dormitories, both of which are rented buildings.

3. During the war years, only such foreign students as were invited to Japan by the Japanese Government or the organizations concerned were given monetary assistance and admitted into these dormitories, free of rent and other charges.

After the war's end, as the number of such students decreased and the number of vacant rooms in the dormitories correspondingly increased, such foreign students as had been originally considered not qualified or eligible for admission into these dormitories moved into the buildings and occupied rooms without the consent of the associations concerned. There were many such cases in the Cormitories operated by Yurin Gakkai.

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According to recent figures, as is shown in the Inclosure No. 1, there are now 333 Chinese occupants of the dormitory rooms, out of which only 156 are students who were originally admitted into the dormitories with the approval of Yurin Gakkai.

4. As of 31 March 1949, the occupants of the dormitories as are known to the associations concerned are as follows:

* There are in addition 48 dependents occupying the floor space of the Manchukuo Student Hall which was earmarked as dormitory space for students.

Further breakdown is shown in Inclosures No.2 and No. 3. It must be noted that the 27 Chinese students who came to this country on the invitation of either the Japanese Government or Japanese educational organizations in 1942 or 1943, have already spent 6 to 7 years in schools and colleges to date - a span of time long enough to finish any regular educational course. These students are, however, still registered at some schools or colleges as students, probably because they have found it convenient to do so for some reason, or because they have entered some other school after finishing the one they had originally chosen.

As is evident from the foregoing, the dormitories operated by both Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai have been losing their original status as dormitories established solely for the benefit of the bona fide students and have been fast becoming nothing more than rent-free appartments supported by government subsidy.

5. Since the war's end, the financial situation of the Japanese Government has become very difficult and subsidies of almost all kinds have had to be

either stopped or reduced to the bare minimus, with the result that monetary assistance to the individual foreign student has actually been cut down to a negligible sum while the rest of the money appropriated for the assistance of foreign students is now barely enough to keep the dormitories running on the lowest level.

For the fiscal year from April 1948 to March 1949, the total sum of money appropriated as subsidy to foreign students was 3,850,000 yen.

If the assistance to foreign students were to be continued on the same baiss, taking into account the increase of prices and cost of living, about 6,650,000 yen would be needed for the fiscal year beginning April 1949. This is more than the Japanese Government can afford under the "austerity" budget.

It was, therefore, agreed by the authorities concerned that only 2,000,000 yen would be appropriated as subsidy to Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai for the first three month of the current fiscal year during which the two associations would make preparations to wind up their work and would be ready, as of 1 July 1949, to liquidate their affairs.

6. Prior to and immediately after the beinning of the current fiscal year, measures were taken to notify the occupants of the formitories of the decision of the authorities concerned that a) the government subsidy such as had been given to foreign students would be stopped entirely from the beginning of the current fiscal year (April 1), b) the dormitories would be operated nearly in the same way as had been done previously, but only for a period of three months from April through June this year, c) both Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai would be dissolved in due course and their rented dormitories would be returned to the proper owners while the associations own property would be sold and liquidated, the proceeds of which would be donated to another similar educational essociation which is planned to be organized in the near future.

In order to avoid any misunderstanding on the part of the occupants of the dormitories, notice was again served to them at the beginning of June, especially reminding them of the matter that the dormitories would have to be closed at the end of June 1949 and that the occupants would have to move out by that date.

On these measures taken by the Japanese Government and the Japanese associations concerned, verbal report has respectively been made to the authorities of the Diplomatic Section, General Headquarters, SCAP.

7. Up to now, when there are only 10 days left towards the end of June, no cooperative action or move has been made on the part of the occupants of the dormitories.

The legal status of the occupants of dormitories, no matter whether they are registered as student or not, is considered as that of persons who have so far been allowed by the associations concerned to make use of the space of dormitories without paying rent. In case, therefore, such occupants are notified by the associations of the termination of such use, then the occupants are required to move out of the dormitories without delay. In case they do not move out of the buildings, we regret that it will be necessary to bring suit against them under the Article 597 of the Civil Code.

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If it is at all possible, however, the Japanese Government wishes to avoid recourse to legal eviction, since in taking such action it will unfortunately be impossible to make a distinction between bona fide students and those who are not students or who merely have a fictitious student status.

We regret to think that such action may create hardships for the bona fide students and engender ill-feeling on their part. It was never contemplated that such measures would be necessary when the Japanese Government was originally prompted to give assistance to foreign students.

- It is, therefore, the sincere desire of the Japanese Government that, by the assistance and good offices of the authorities of the General Head-quarters, SCAP, an amicable solution can be found along such lines and stated in the following.
- 8. a) The Japanese Government is now planning to organize a new educational association which will receive a sizable amount of funds upon completion of the liquidation of Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai, and will thereby be able to continue part of the work which was formerly done by the two liquidated associations, including the operation of one or two dormitories for the benefit of bona fide students to be selected on a new basis. The number of such students will, of necessity, have to be limited for the present time, giving perhaps priority in selection to such students as were originally invited to Japan by the Japanese Government or Japanese educational associations. The conditions upon which such students can be admitted to dormitories will also have to be changed from the former conditions; the immates of new dormitories will probably be requested to pay some operational fees of the dormitory, including charges for running water and electricity.
 - b) It is evident that such a new arrangement will become possible only when the liquidation of Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai has been successfully carried out. This liquidation in turn depends upon how soon the occupants of the dormitories will move out and such buildings as are owned by the two associations can be sold in regular business transactions

It is accordingly the sincere hope of the Japanese Government that, by the good offices of the General Headquarters, SCAP, the import and implications of the liquidation of the two educational associations will be brought to the attention of the authorities of the countries concerned, stationed in Tokyo, and that they will use their good offices to bring about the orderly evacuation of the occupants of the formitories, thus paving the way to the smooth and quick opening of new dormitories for the benefit of the bona fide students of their nationality.

c) In the course of the liquidation, the dormitories will have to be either returned to their rightful owners in the case of those which are rented, or sold to the highest bidder in open bidding in the case of the buildings owned by the liquidating educational associations.

There may be cases, however, that when the building of a dormitory is returned to the owner by the liquidating associations, the former

occupants of the building may be able to come to an agreement with the owner to reoccupy it on a new contract. This will most likely be so in the cases of dormitories located in cities other than Tokyo and

In the case of the four dormitories operated by Yurin Gakkai in Tokyo, the buildings will be placed on sale in due course and any one, including the former occupants of the buildings, will be able to buy them at fair prices.

- d) The Manchukuo Student Hall is treated in the same manner with other dormitories so far as such space of the building as is reserved as a dormitory for Chinese students is concerned. The occupants of the dormitory space of this building were requested to move out by 30 June 1949.
- 9. The Japanese Government will be deeply grateful if the authorities of the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be so kind as to take measures to cause the authorities of the foreign missions concerned to cooperate with the Japanese Government for winding up the work of Yurin Gakkai and Kokusai Gakuyukai in order to reestablish on appractical basis as soon as possible the assistance program to bona fide foreign students.

Check sheets is presumed to be the list of the "Nisei" born in the United States who were related to the Japanese Army, in which it is registered that NISHIKAWA, Tadayoshi entered the 2nd Independent Reilroad Battalion ("Sen 13352 Butai") on 28 July 1945. The name of NISHIKAWA, Tadayoshi was registered in the said list upon report of the Assistance Section of the Mie Prefectural Office.
 - b. In reply to the enquiry made of the said Assistance Section, it has been reported that Suzuka City Office had made enquiry regarding the military history of the subject individual about June 1946. The said Assistance Section further reports that no military record can be found at present among the documents kept by the Suzuka City Office, adding that it is

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conceivable that a Mie Prefectural official entered his record in the list on the basis of the memory of a city official in Suzuka.

- d. It has been disclosed that the subject's aunt, UEMURA, Shin neither met nor corresponded with him during the war, and according to the said UEMURA, when she met him after the end of the war, he said it had been a hot day when he had been called into military service. It is, therefore, possible that the referenced list is not reliable in so far as NISHIKAWA's name is concerned. The statement of UEMURA may be in error in view of the fact that the 61st Regiment was not stationed in the Mic Prefecture, but was in the Wakayama Prefecture despite her allegation.
- d. On the other hand it is the statement of his family, as mentioned in reference d. letter, which has been comfirmed by the Mayor of Susuka that although the said NISHIKAWA was conscripted by the Japanese Army about the end of July 1945, he was discharged and ordered to return home on the same day because of his illness.
- e. No addingentary evidence verifying the two statements of his family and sunt has been secured at the demobilization agencies and the other offices concerned.
- 3. The Second Demobilization Bureau Liquidation Division reports that despite subsequent investigations no official record concerning his service in the Japanese Navy has been found at the said Division and any District Demobilization Liquidation Division.
