### Your Expellency,

I have the honor to inform Your Excellency that the Japanese Government, in view of the country's inadequate supply of indigenous foodstuffs for demetic consumption, and its dependence upon a large-scale importation, is desirous of seceding, subject to approval by the Japanese National Diet, to the International Wheat Agreement which came into force as of July 1, 1949. If admitted as a number, the Japanese Government will be ready to assume the duties and obligations imposed upon all signatories and also to guarantee the sumual importation of wheat and/or flour to the amount of 1,200,000 tons for the duration of the Agreement, namely until July 31, 1953.

It is respectfully requested that Your Excellency will be good enough to submit this desire of the Japanese Government to the Secretary-General of the International Sheat Council, which, it is carnestly hoped, will give it invorable consideration and approve Japan's accession to the International Wheat Agreement.

 JAPANESE NATIONAL RAILWAYS

SUBJECT: Baggage Destined for, but Prevented from being Shipped to, Korea or China.

1. Immediately before the end of the Pacific War — to be more precise, from April to July, 1945 — the then Ministry of Transportation accepted, for free conveyance, baggage destined for Korea, Manchuria and China. But the rigorous air raids prevailing at the time prevented railway ferries from carrying such baggage out of Japan proper. As a natural consequence, they were held at various stations, such as Niigata, Shimonoseki and Hakata-ko. Meanwhile, the war came to an end, After the war's end some of the baggage were shipped back to their despatching stations and to their owners. There were also about 1,000 pieces of baggage, belonging mainly to Koreans, which were stored in some transfer stations, as there was little prospect of their being returned to their owners.

League demanded more than once that these pieces of baggage be delivered to that organization. Now the League was no doubt an organization of Koreans, but it could not very well be acknowledged as a representative body beneficial to the baggage owners resident in Korea. So the rail authorities replied to the League that they could not possibly see their way clear to deliver them as a whole to the League, but that they had no objection to delivering such baggage as were legitimately claimed by power of attorney, if not by League members who happened to be their owners.

Thereupon the League requested that a list of baggage be submitted, so that it might get in contact with their legitimate owners in Japan or in Korea.

This request was promptly complied with. But at the same time the rail authorities informed the League of their intention to deliver the baggage in question to the Korean Government as soon as a peace treaty was signed.

3. Time went on. The rail authorities came to see no wisdom in waiting for the conclusion of a peace treaty, thereby lessening the value of the baggage through possible damage or deterioration and increasing the storage cost involved. They asked for GHQ advice and suggestions through the Repatriation Section of the Central Liaison Office of the Japanese Government. The verbal suggestion from the GHQ was that such baggage be regarded as repatriates baggage and be disposed

of accordingly under the directions of the 8th Army, USA. In consequence the rail authorities wrote a note to the 8th Army Headquarters, submitting the list of the baggage at the same time. But no settlement was reached. The Korean Diplomatic Mission was later called upon to give their cooperation on this question, but nothing was done to solve the problem.

4. A considerable number of such baggage were delivered to their consignors whom it was possible to identify, which was indeed a task of both great expense and conscience to the NRC. The rest are still kept in warehouses of the NRC. But, on the contrary, most of the parcels, baggage or goods shipped for Japan from Korea immediately before the war ended were, it was then acknowledged, kept at Pusan and other stations for the same reason. It seems, however, that all of them have already been disposed of in Korea as it thinks fit. Therefore to send back those in the NRC custody to Korea and other countries will become a burden quite unbearable to the NRC.

With respect to the parcels, baggage or goods which it is impossible to deliver, or which require much expenses to be kept in custody or are liable to become lower in value due to rotting, change in quality, etc., the railway will, according to the Japanese laws and regulations, convert their value and pay consignors their price. In this case, the right of ownership of them will be transferred to the railway after the expiration of the period of six month public notification, if it is impossible to deliver them or their converted price to their owners owing to the fact that heir consignors are not ascertainable or to other causes for which the railway is not responsible. Therefore, the simplest and most economic way to dispose of the said baggage is to convert their value in the presence of the representatives of the Korean Government and deliver them their price converted.

For the baggage for China and North Korea, it is also deemed reasonable to treat them in the same way to deliver their price to their respective Governments.

5. A considerable number of the baggage in the NRC custody have already been delivered to their legitimate claimants in Japan. As for the quantity of those not yet delivered and still in the custody of the NRC, it is requested that the accompanying table be referred to.
