The Japanese Covernment is ready to bear the cost of his return: As the Anglo-Saxon Petroleum Company mentioned in the reference Memorandum is not represented in Japan, the Japanese Government asked the Shell Company, a sister concern (No.58, Yamashita-cho, Naka-ku, Yokohama) for OKADA's passage on board one of its tankers, but could not secure its compliance.
- 4. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will, therefore, be grateful if the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be good enough to approach the Netherlands authorities in New Guinea in order that arrangements may be made by them for the transportation of OKADA aboard a ship calling at a Japanese port.

The Honourable Bernabe Africa retired from his post in about February of this year, and the Honourable Jose P. Malencia arrived to succeed him. And finding that the Philippine and Japanese employees who have been in service since his predecessor's days are in collusion and acting in an overbearing way, the new Ambassador, with the object of enforcing discipline, has requested the Kojimachi Police Station through Mr. Ryu Akiyama, Vice-Minister of Transportation, (who called at the Kojimachi Police Station at the request of Mrs. Melencia) to investigate crimes in which the above-mentioned employees are involved, and to cooperate in keeping watch over the official residence. The Police Station, therefore, has decided to take the following measures:

- 1. Content of the Request made by Ambassador Melencion through
 Mr. Akiyama, Vice-Minister of Transportation.
 - nisdeeds, LFUTERIO S. GAVINO, born in 1919, a Philippine manager of the official residence, living at Daikanyama.

The Kojimachi Police Station, to which the request was made, deemed it necessary to comply with (1) and (2) of the request. and after contacting the sections of the M.P.B. concerned, sent a police inspector to the official residence. He met Mrs. Melencio and explained her that the Japanese police would take feasible measures if the Occupation authorities concerned would give a special directive. Mrs. Melencio appreciated the reply, and changing the content of the request, asked for patrol policemen keeping watch, and cancelled the request for investigation of criminal acts committed at the official residence. There were some proposals which could not be accepted by the Japanese police, but the Kojimachi Police Station decided

(1) to order its patrol policemen to make a list of the dismissal employees, keep close contact with the guarded of the official residence and prevent them from entering the building illegally or arrest them if necessary;

(2) to have the manager of the official residence contact the police inspector of the K.P.S. in order to keep the place safe.

 - b. This notification document is, in accordance with the Enforcement Regulation of the Law of Family Registration, kept by the ward or town office for fifteen years from the next year after the notification is made.
 - c. Therefore, even if a notification of the birth of Mrs. Larissa Michaelovna Kostenko Gunter was made to the competent ward office in Tokyo in 1918, it is legally impossible to ascertain her birth in Tokyo.
- 3. Upon enquiry with the Russian Orthodox Church in Tokyo, where most of the Russians were baptized, it has been ascertained that all the records relating to their christening in those days were burnt down by fire ensuing from an air-raid.
- 4. An investigation on the part of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has revealed that the name of Mr. Michael M. Kostenko is not on those lists of the staff of the Russian Embassy in Tokyo in those days which the Ministry received from the Embassy and has preserved ever since.

5. Since no data certifying the birth of Mrs. L. M. Kostenko Gunter are available, the competent organ of the Japanese Government is not in a position to issue her birth certificate.
