On April 1, 1948 his rank of Shokutaku was changed to Rinjishokuin (non-regular official). On June 1, 1949 he was appointed Sankyukan (third class official) of the Ministry of Postal Services and on August 19, 1950 he retired from the above office.
 - (2) The position of either Shokutaku or Ringishokuin did not require that the holder have Japanese nationality.

Those persons have lately had their designation as persons falling under reference Memorandum b. above cancelled with SCAP approval, after careful examination by the Japanese Government according to certain standards laid down also with SCAP approval, and its is believed that they should not now be considered as amenable to reference Memorandum a. above, if the only cause for their removal from public office was their designation as persons falling under reference Memorandum b. above.
- 4. It is therefore proposed that they should be treated in the following manner, in regard to their right or qualification to receive public or private pensions or other emoluments or benefits.
 - (1) Any public or private pensions or other emoluments or benefits of any kind granted or conferred to any person by reasons enumerated in paragraph 1, items a and b, of reference Memorandum a. above, namely, "by reason of military service, including severance or retirement pay

or similar bonus or allowance, except compensation for physical disability" and "by reason of membership in or services to any association, society, or other organization dissolved or suspended as a result of any order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers", shall not be paid.

- (2) Any public or private pensions, etc. shall not be paid to any person falling under paragraph 1, item d, of the same Memorandum, namely, any person "who has been interned or arrested as a result of any order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, during the term of internment or arrest, or permanently, in case of subsequent conviction".
- (3) Any public or private pensions, etc. shall not be paid to any person falling under paragraph 1, item c, of the same Memorandum, namely, any person "who has been removed from any office or position as a result of any order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers", for any other cause than his designation as a person falling under reference Memorandum b. above.

- 5. In addition to the foregoing stipulations, the following conditions shall be prescribed for the respective cases mentioned below:
 - (1) In cases where a person has been released from the designation under reference Memorandum b. but has not been released from the designation under reference Memorandums c. and d., he shall receive no pensions, etc. (Article 2, paragraph 1, item (1) of the attached draft Cabinet Order)
 - (2) In cases where a person removed from public office was already receiving an annuity pension at the time of his designation, he shall begin to receive it again from the time of his release from the designation.

The amount of the annuity pension in these cases shall be in terms of the pay base effective at the time of his release from the designation, and it shall not be paid for the period from his designation to his release therefrom. (Article 2, paragraph 1, item (4), and Article 3 of the same draft Cabinet Order)

(3) In cases where a person removed from public office had already been qualified to receive an annuity pension but had not yet received it at the time of his designation, he shall receive it from the time of his

Cabinet Order concerning Right or Qualification to Receive Pensions, Annuities, Etc. to Be Acquired by the Person who has been granted Cancellation of or Release from the Designation as falling under the Memorandum or as Unacceptable to Educational Service

In accordance with the provisions of Article 5 paragraph 3 of the Imperial Ordinance relating to the Exclusion, Retirement, Etc. in respect to Public Office (Imperial Ordinance No.1 of 1947) and of Article 5 paragraph 3 of the Cabinet Order concerning Exclusion, Removal and Reinstatement, Etc. of Member of the Educational Service (Cabinet Order No.62 of 1947), the Cabinet establishes this Cabinet Order.

(Purpose of this Cabinet Order)

Article 1. Matters necessary for the acquisition of the right or qualification to receive private or public pensions, annuities, or other allowances or benefits (hereinafter referred to as "the allowances or benefits") under the provisions of Article 5 paragraph 3 of the Imperial Ordinance relating to Exclusion, Removal, Etc. in respect to Public Office (hereinafter referred to as "Imperial Ordinance No.1") or of

Article 5 paragraph 3 of the Cabinet Order concerning Exclusion, Removal and Reinstatement of Member of the Educational Service (hereinafter referred to as "Cabinet Order No.62"), by the person who has been granted cancellation of or release (hereinafter referred to as "the person released from the designation") from the designation as person falling under the Memorandum or as person unacceptable to educational service (hereinafter referred to as "the designation") in accordance with the provisions of Article 4-(2) paragraph 1 of Imperial Ordinance No.1 or of Article 4-(3) paragraph 1 of Cabinet Order No.62 shall be provided for by this Cabinet Order.

(Right or Qualification to Receive Pensions to Be Acquired by the Person Released from the Designation)

Article 2. With regard to the right or qualification to receive pensions under the Pension Law (Law No.48 of 1923) to be acquired by the person released from the designation (hereinafter referred to as "the Pension") in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 paragraph 3 of Imperial Ordinance No.1 or of Article 5 paragraph 3 of Cabinet Order No.62, if he comes under any of the following items, it shall be in accordance with the provisions of each item concerned:

(1) In case the person released from the designation is a person who received the designation as one falling under the Memorandum and as one unacceptable to educational service, he shall, only when he has been granted cancellation of and release from both these designations, be deemed to have been granted cancellation of or release from the designation on the day of his cancellation of or release from the designation whichever the later, and the provisions of Article 5 paragraph 3 of Imperial Ordinance No.1 or of Article 5 paragraph 3 of Cabinet Order No.62 shall apply;
