1. In drafting a new Civil Aeronautics Act of Japan to be put into effect at the date of the coming into force of the Treaty of Peace with Japan which provides inter alia in Article 13 c : "Pending its becoming a party to the Convention on International Civil Aviation in accordance with Article 93 thereof, Japan will give effect to the provisions of that Convention applicable to the international navigation of aircraft, and will give effect to the standards, practices and procedures adopted as annexes to the Convention in accordance with the terms of the Convention", the Civil Aeronautics Agency of the Ministry of Transportation has requested the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to ask for the views of Secretary-General of the International Civil Aviation Organization regarding inclusion in the Act a provision prescribing the use of "J" as the nationality mark to be borne by the aircraft having Japanese nationality.

2. It would be much appreciated if the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers be good enough to make an inquiry of the views of Secretary-General of the Organization on the matter.

3. It is added that the Aerial Navigation Act of Japan of 1921 prescribed for the aircraft having Japanese nationality the nationality mark "J" which was allocated by the Annex 1 of the Convention relating to the Regulation of Aerial Navigation signed at Paris on October 13, 1919, but the Act was abrogated last year.

On inquiry, it has been ascertained that the petitioner had been a commander in Iwo Jima before the war ended, and was prompted to file the petition by his irresistible desire to console the souls of those who fought under his command. If anybody is to be sent to the island for the stated purposes, Rev. Jushoan Koami is regarded as the best qualified person. It is respectfully requested, in the circumstances, that the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, be good enough to give permission for the requested passage to the island and to give proper facilities for his activities on the spot.

2. In the above connection, the Japanese Government has long been making inquiries into the problems of maintaining the graves of the Japanese who were killed in the war not only in Iwo Jima but also on other islands scattered in the Southern Pacific, and of collecting their remains and relics for burial or delivery to the bereaved families. In view of the established Japanese custom, no small importance is attached to those problems, as demonstrated by the fact that of late the bereaved families in Japan are demanding the delivery of the remains and relics of their kinsfolk who were killed over there. (cf. Annex 2). The Government, therefore, has been contemplating on a measure to meet the demand, and intending to apply for the assistance of the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, when a plan is concretely established. Assuming Rev. Jushoan Koami's visit to Iwo Jima as mentioned in 3. below would be approved, the

Japanese Government considers it opportune to send one or two of its officials with him in order to make them inquire into the possible measures for conducting burial services and taking delivery of the remains or relics of those who were killed on the island. It is hoped that the request for sending Japanese Government officials along with the petitioner be also favorably considered.

3. If the visit is approved, Rev. Jushoan Koami will take a passage on a boat of the Nippon Suisan K. K. from Japan, and stay on Iwo Jima for about ten days, receiving logistic facilities from the Takano Kansen K. K. established on the island (head office: 5 Edogawa-cho, Bunkyo-ku, Tokyo), with the Japanese Government and the Byakurenshu paying the cost in Japanese currency. But, if the passage could be taken on one of the U. S. military planes, and the use of the U. S. military facilities on the island could be allowed, to be repayable in Japanese currency, that would of course be more convenient. It is requested that the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, be kind enough to give favorable consideration to such an arrangement.

that the applicant is well aware of the fact that reentry permit is  
required in addition to the entry permit to Japan.

3. In as much as the Japanese Government Overseas Agency at Honolulu  
will be instructed that the indorsement on the applicant's travel  
document will not be made or will the approved application be re-  
turned to the applicant until presentation of the reentry permit, it  
is requested that the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for  
the Allied Powers grant favourable consideration to the application.
