The Japanese Government has received a petition from the family of SATO, Katsumi, the above-named, for his repatriation from Germany. The facts as ascertained regarding him are as follows:

SATO left Japan for Germany in November 1943, in company with over ten others, as a staff member of the Naval Attache to the Japanese Embassy at Berlin, and arrived at his post early in 1944. About February 1945, as the Allied forces closed in on Berlin, the personnel of the Japanese Embassy began to disperse around the city, and were eventually returned to Japan via Allied countries. But SATO was left alone in Germany, because he had been in a German military hospital at Goppingen, Wurttemberg, as a mental patient since the middle of 1944.

In February 1948, the hospital at Goppingen sent a letter to Mr. Fritz Braun, a priest at Stolzestr. 1a, Koln, who was going to visit Japan, requesting him to take SATO to this country along with him (cf. the enclosed copy). Although he could not comply with the request, he told the matter to SATO's father when he arrived in Japan. (He is now back in Germany.)

2. In view of the above, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs desires to obtain information as to the condition of SATO after February 1948, and, if his health permits, to have him repatriated at an early occasion. The Ministry will, therefore, be grateful if the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be good enough to use its good offices for the attainment of the above wishes, and inform the Ministry of the result of any action taken by it.

2. The Japanese who desire to make travel to and from the Nansei Shoto
south of 30° north latitude are experiencing much inconvenience because
of the fact that according to the procedure now in force for securing
the permit for the travel long time is required, in most cases 3-4
months at least, in order to obtain the permit.

As the Japanese Government has received many petitions for the
improvement of procedure of the travel, it desires to submit hereunder
three plans for the consideration of the General Headquarters.

Plan a:

No restriction except the ones for security reasons will be placed
on such travel. Those who desire to travel to and from the Nansei Shoto
may travel freely whenever they desire, by giving notice to the General
Headquarters through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in case of travel
from Japan to the Nansei Shoto or to the nearest U.S. authorities con-
cerned in the Nansei Shoto in case of travel from the Nansei Shoto to
Japan several days prior to their departure.

Plan b:

The applicant for the travel to the Nansei Shoto will make appli-
cation to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs submitting at the same time
a guarantee letter obtained from the host at the destination (in an
urgent case a cablegram received from the host). Upon receipt of the
application, the Ministry will consider it carefully and submit the
matter to the General Headquarters requesting the latter's decision
in one way or another. The General Headquarters will decide whether
or not the travel is permissible from the security point of view,
without making any inquiry as to the host, and communicate its deci-
sion to the Ministry.

With regard to the application for the travel from the Nansei
Shoto to Japan, it is desirable likewise to discontinue the practice
of making investigations concerning the host in Japan by substituting
the host's guarantee letter or cable for such investigation.

Plan c:

The procedure will be similar to that under Plan b, but the ap-
plication will be accompanied by a guarantee letter attested by the
mayor of the city, or the headman of the town or village where the
host is residing. In an urgent case a telegram received from the
mayor of the city or the headman of the town or village concerned
will be attached to the application.

3. The Japanese Government would be grateful if any one of these
plans could be favorably considered by the General Headquarters.

Kanaori NORIMATSU, who served as policeman in charge of the special service of the Shizuoka Police Station, has testified that he told Hide NISHIMURA, subject's mother, that if the subject person would not recover Japanese nationality, she should have to be interned or repatriated to the United States of America, and that her mother, taking cognizance of the circumstances, recovered Japanese nationality on behalf of the subject person.
4. The Ministry has received a report each from the Demobilization Bureau (in charge of the affairs concerning the former Japanese Army) and the Second Demobilization Bureau Liquidation Division (in charge of the affairs concerning the former Japanese Navy) of the Repatriation Relief Agency to the effect that no record has been found concerning her service in the former Japanese armed forces.
5. The Ministry has received a report from the Nagano Prefectural Office to the effect that the subject person has neither served in the Japanese Government, nor has she conducted any activities inimical to the interests of the United States of America.

- (2) The village election administration commission positively conducted an educational campaign through various organs in the village with the object of preventing abstention from voting and insuring a high rate of voting. The said commission conducted checking up of the persons who had not appeared at the polling place, and called on them from door to door and advised them not to abstain from voting.
- (3) It is considered that she was forced by Seiji TAKEMURA, her foster father, and Kikusaku TAKEMURA, her cousin, to vote as stated in the attached statements of the above mentioned persons.

Former condition: The above-mentioned person who was sentenced to life imprisonment at the U.S. Military Court in Manila as war criminal and transferred to Sugamo Prison was placed in the Matsuzawa Lunatic Asylum on 30 June 1947, because of his persistent conducts of self-destruction and suicide attempt. On the night he was hospitalized there, he attempted to kill himself by running a nail into his tongue. He was suffering from auditory hallucination and that of electric influence. Later, he was getting better through medical treatment, but he became gloomy from May 1949 and, on the early morning of 5 June the same year, suddenly attempted suicide by disembowelment. Discovered instantly and undergone more careful treatment, he was considerably improved in his condition.

e. Present conditions: Since then he has been in normal condition physically and given a light work in the asylum as part of medical treatment. He seems to maintain mental balance at present, but it is not clear whether his disease itself has been cured. Complete recovery is considered hardly possible throughout his life.

At a meeting of officials in charge of passport affairs of seven prefectures in the Tohoku District held at Sendai in September last under the auspices of the Tohoku Liaison and Coordination Office, the inconvenience experienced in this district concerning the extremely limited number of physicians approved by the American Consular Service was pointed out and a desire was expressed for a remedy. It was then made clear that, as approved physicians were available only in Sendai and no prefectures other than Miyagi had such physicians, those residing outside Miyagi Prefecture, who desire to obtain the medical certificate necessary for passport visa, had to go all the way to Sendai. It would become convenient for those residing outside Miyagi Prefecture to obtain such medical certificate if each prefecture in the said district could have one approved physician or more, and therefore, a resolution was adopted at the meeting for taking necessary measures to have the number of such physicians increased. After the meeting the Ministry's official in charge of the matter conveyed the purport of the resolution verbally to a competent official of the American Consulate General in Tokyo and he was advised by the latter to recommend suitable physicians for consideration by the authorities concerned. Consequently, the Ministry asked the prefectures to recommend the qualified physicians within their respective jurisdictions.

The Ministry has now received from various prefectures recommendations of physicians as attached, and in transmitting these herewith, the Ministry wishes to request the General Headquarters to give favorable consideration to this matter.
