

- (c) Did she ever assert her claim to American citizenship in connection with her employment? If so, to whom, and with what results? Was any coercion used to force her to accept this employment, or is there evidence that she entered into it voluntarily?
- (d) Has she taken an oath of allegiance to Japan in connection with her employment?
