1. Reference is made to the following;

- a. Memorandum from the Japanese Government, C.L.O. No. 6217 (PWC), 22 November 1946, subject as above.
- b. Memorandum from Diplomatic Section to the Japanese Government, AG 000.5 (2 June 47) DS, dated 2 June 1947, subject as above.

2. With reference to paragraph (a) of reference "a" above, the Chinese Mission in Japan has informed this Headquarters that the Chinese Government has already issued orders to the effect that all Japanese war criminal suspects and war criminals are to be accorded the same treatment as regular Chinese soldiers. The Mission states further that the Japanese Liaison Office in China is still functioning.

3. With reference to paragraph (b) of reference "a" above, the Chinese Mission has informed this Headquarters that the Chinese Authorities are expediting the investigations and trials of Japanese war criminal suspects, that two groups of those acquitted have already been repatriated, and that those newly acquitted will be repatriated as soon as transportation facilities are available.

2. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has received from the National Rural Police Headquarters a report to the following effect, concerning the progress of search for the subject person:

- a. The subject person was found by the Osaka Prefectural Police Department neither at the designated address nor in Higashinari-ku, Nakahama-cho, where he is said to have removed in 1940 or 1941. In spite of their efforts, they have so far failed in locating the required person.

Description of unnaturally deceased person:

Kunihiko Hashida, age 64,
of 159 Ogikubo Ichome; Suginamiku, Tokyo-to.

Date and time of examination:

4:25 p.m., 14 September, 1945.

Whole body of the deceased:

The deceased body to be examined was laid with his back
downside on a bed cushion in a room of the said Mr. Hashida's
residence, his body from its middle part downward being cov-
ered with a covering cushion. He put on a national uniform
and his both hands were placed on the front part of the sto-
mach, crossed each other. He looked as if he were sleeping.

A pale-whitish colour was shown all over the face, both
eyes closed, pupils dilated. Both pulsation and breathing
were imperceptible. No sign of particular change was seen
on the lips, nostrils, and neck.

But some degree of temperature still existed (though
not examined with the thermometer) and the corneas were not
turbid. No other special features were present.

A little before 4 p.m., 14 September, 1945.

The following inspection was done on the 14th September, 1945, of the unnaturally deceased person, Kunihiko Hashida, under direction of Prosecutor Obata, of Tokyo Criminal District Court.

Descriptions of the finder:

Assistant-Inspector of Metropolitan Police Tanetomo Hayashi, of Ogikubo Police Station, reports that while he was on guard of the person, the deceased swallowed a poison about 3:45 p.m., the 14th September, 1945.

Descriptions of the unnaturally deceased person:

Domiciled place: 92 Komagome Oiwakecho, Hongo-ku.
(Head of the family)

Present Address: 59 Ogikubo Ichome, Suginami-ku.

Name : Kunihiko Hashida, age 64, Formerly Minister of Education and Head of the Central Training Institute.

Date and time of unnatural death:

About 4:15 p.m., 14th September, 1945.

Place and condition of unnatural death occurring:

It seems that the person swallowed a poison at his studying room of his residence at 159 Ogikubo Ichome, Suginami-ku, Tokyo-to, and when, coming to the porch, he tried to put on shoes, he fell down backward with his limbs stretching and became unconscious.

State and cause of unnatural death:

There is no surface injury on any part of his body.

Nor are there any vomiting and excretion. The face shows pale-whitish colour all over. Both eyes are shut, the pupils dilated, and the lips, nostrils and neck show no particular change. It is presumed that he committed suicide by drinking a poisonous matter (most probably potassium cyanide).

Time passing after death:

Opinion of the inspecting officer:

From the report of the person finding the death who was at that time at the place and from the words and actions of the deceased person towards his kins, during his life, it is found that he has purposely taken a poison to kill himself.

No testaments are found.

Disposition of the body of the deceased and his personal effects:

These shall be disposed of by his family.

The above inspection commenced at 6 p.m. and ended at 6:30 p.m. this date.

Disease: Glycosuria and Intestinal Catarrh with Vertigo.

Date of Attack: According to the patient's statement, he has been kept quiet under medical care, since Dec. 9, 1945, while suffering from intestinal catarrh and a cold, but as his condition showed some improvement he took a stroll in his garden to exercise walking, when he had a sudden attack of vertigo and fell to the ground, whereupon he was put to bed by his family, and ever since that time he has been complaining of the same trouble.

Present Condition: No fever. Result of examination, temperature 36°, respiration 18, pulse 90. Slight inflammation of the pharynx and a feeling of heaviness in the head. Appetite dull, but no retching or vomiting. Diarrhoea has also set in, and on Dec. 20 he had two scanty movements of a muddy consistency: no defecation today. Pressure on the left side of the abdomen causes pain, but palpation reveals no resistance or swelling.

Although a stethoscopic examination has disclosed no abnormal symptoms, he sometimes suffers from coughing with expectoration.

In addition to the 25 persons who were designated two or three times as already reported, one more person was found to have been designated two times. As for the remaining suspects they are yet to be apprehended as their whereabouts are unknown or because they are stationed abroad or have died. As of 20 November there are 50 yet to be apprehended as enumerated in the attached list. The Japanese Government is at present making every effort to ascertain the whereabouts of the missing suspects by keeping close connection with all quarters concerned.

I have so far had to apply twice in succession for grace and twice I have been granted it. I am truly grateful for this kindness of the authorities- so much so, that I cannot bear the possible misunderstanding the present repetition of this sort of application may entail, that I am only trying to abuse their generosity and to evade my duty of response to the call.

But for my physical unfitness, therefore, which I feel as shown in the enclosed letter of medical diagnosis, certainly would I not resort to the present third application.

Under these circumstances, I would esteem it a great favour, and would surely make the best of it with every sense of gratitude, so as to present myself to the directed place even before expiration of the granted period, as soon as the cause for the present application leaves.

It is always easy to suspect, but hard to believe, whatever is stated in a petition like this from one placed in my own position. This is why I have done my best and have prepared the present humble letter for a direct appeal from sickbed to Your Excellency, hoping and trusting that I have not done so in vain.

With reference to the Memorandum AG 312.4 (7 Jan 46) CIS and the Note C.L.O. No. 189 (1.23) dated 14 January 1946, regarding apprehension of Japanese Personnel, the Central Liaison Office wishes to inform the General Headquarters that Judicial Major Hata died on 20 January 1946 at the National Konodai Hospital.

As soon as the report of his death reached this office, it was reported orally to the General headquarters and an inspection by Allied authorities was made. This office submits herewith the death certificate by the medical officer of the hospital and its English translation.

for the Allied Powers.

As a representative of our Labor Union, the Ashibetsu Labor Union, I wish to inform you of the conduct, during his association with our Union, of Yoshimi Hirano, an employee of the Mitsui Mining Office at Ashibetsu, who has been apprehended by order of the General Headquarters.

He obtained employment at the said Mining Office in March, 1944, and on the termination of the war he realized that the present misery of Japan have been brought about all through our militaristic and financial cliques and that the formation of a democratic Japan would be the only means by which the long-desired world peace could be attained. Impatient for its realization, he, in cooperation with Tsunejuro Oshima, the present head of the Ashibetsu Labor Union and other comrades, made every effort to form a purely democratic labor union, and the first of its kind in the Hokkaido was established at Ashibetsu on 21 Oct. 1945. Following up his success he evinced great activity in guiding the still unawakened masses, and such was his preoccupation in this work that he had hardly time enough to eat or sleep. This fact has been fully recognized by the local authorities and our Company, as well as its employees, and his exploits as a pioneer of the times have been remarkable.

All the members of this Union profoundly regret his apprehension, and undoubtedly this will greatly affect the future development of our Union.

Although we are not appealing for a light penalty for our comrade, we cannot but respectfully request that the General Headquarters will be good enough to give special consideration to what really he is.

 - a. Tadayuki NISHIKAWA is considered to have served in the Japanese Army on the basis of the records kept at the said Bureau.
 - b. According to the above records, he was called into the Field Motor Depot, 14th Regional Army in the Philippines on 15 December 1944. His fate became unknown for some time since 10 June 1945, but was found alive by the subsequent investigation. At the time when he was missing, he still belonged to the said Depot and his rank was 1st Class Private.
 - c. The fact that he was called up in 1938 and again in 1940, but each time was discharged from the call and ordered to return home on the same date, is not confirmed on the basis of the records kept at the said Bureau, the Prefectural Assistance Section, and the City Office of his permanent domicile.
 - d. It is presumed that the fact that he was called into the Japanese Army in the Philippines in 1944 was informed neither to the Prefectural Assistance Section (formerly Regimental District Headquarters) of his permanent domicile nor to the City Office of his permanent domicile due to communication difficulties in those days.
3. The Second Demobilization Bureau Liquidation Division reports that no official record concerning his service on the Japanese Navy has been found, despite investigations made by the said Division and by every District Demobilization Liquidation Division.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Custody and Maintenance of War Criminals

1. Reference is made to Article 11 of the Treaty of Peace with Japan signed at San Francisco on the 6th day of September, 1951.
2. The Japanese Government is directed to provide sufficient personnel to administer Sugamo Prison and the war criminals therein confined from and after 15 February 1952.
3. The Japanese Government is directed to provide all necessary housing, equipment, services and supplies for the operation of the said prison and the maintenance of the war criminals therein confined from and after the 31st day of March, 1952, or the date the Treaty comes into force as between the United States and Japan, whichever comes first.
4. The Supreme Commander retains the supervision of the said prison and of the war criminals therein confined until the date the Peace Treaty comes into force as between the United States and Japan.
5. The Supreme Commander retains the power to grant clemency, to reduce sentences, and to parole war criminals until his said power is superseded pursuant to the provisions of the said Treaty.
