was succeeded by the late Mr. Max Wachter, who was sent from
the head office in Germany. The business was operated by him
until his death in May 1941. After that he was succeeded by
Mrs. Ida Wachter who is in charge up to the present.

Memorandum on Harry W. Hamacher in Japan

1. Origin and business of firm

Harry W. Hamacher formerly Messrs. Brasch & Rothenstein, Berlin was ordered by the German Government before the outbreak of the German/Russian War, to handle as forwarding agents all cargoes moving via Siberia and destined for Germany. For approximately ten year prior to the commencement of World War II, Messrs. Yuasa Bros. & Co., Ltd., and Messrs. Kokusai Unyu K.K., of Japan and Manchuria respectively, were handling the Siberian traffic. After the outbreak of hostilities in Europe, Mr. Hans Umbhau organized his offices here in Japan as Representative of Harry W. Hamacher, Spediteur, Berlin, whereas branch offices of Messrs. Harry W. Hamacher were opened in Manchuli, Harbin & Dairen, the whole organization being under the authority of the late Mr. Ernst Wolf stationed in Harbin. In China the FRAKO organization (combined offices of the Shipping Agencies of Hamburg Amerika Line and North German Lloyd, China) was designated and Buero Werner Dittberner (Shipping Department of Messrs. C. Illies & Co., Dairen) was appointed to assist the Harry W. Hamacher office in Dairen.

As after the outbreak of the German/Russian War in June, 1941 Buero Hans Umbhau in Japan, the Harry W. Hamacher organization in Manchuria, and the FRAKO organization in China were duly appointed by Mr. H. Wahlthat, Head of the German Trade Delegation in Japan as designated forwarding agents (Vertrauens-Spediteure) to handle the movement of all cargo bought by the German Government and stored in the respective spheres. The greater part of these goods were taken over by ROGES. For these cargoes held in trust, ROGES supplied and furnished all charges in connection with their storage, shipping expenses etc... The necessary funds in this connection were provided upon request in round sums periodically by Dr. H. H. Woldt in Tokyo, as representative of Messrs. Roges G. m. b. H. Berlin. The accounting thereof was made through Harry W. Hamacher, Berlin.

In like manner one duly appointed German was engaged in similar work with the German Navy in Singapore, Surabaya and Batavia.

2. Returned Cargo

As after the beginning of the German/Russian War cargoes called "Returned Cargoes" came into appearance viz:- goods which were already shipped via Tsuruga to Vladivostock and which were brought back to Japan.

3. Transit Goods

Further to the above the firm was handling a certain amount of cargo called "Transit Goods" viz:- goods which were destined for third countries via Germany. However, the movement of cargo from Germany via Japan for third countries were not handled by the firm. This latter business was in the hands of Messrs. Yuasa Bros. & Co., Ltd., in Japan, and Messrs. Kokusai Unyu K. K. in Manchuria.

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4. Resale of goods back to the Japanese Government

With the gradual progress of the war becoming more and more unfavorable to Germany, and the decrease of cargo by shipments to Germany on orders received through the Wohlthat Delegation and made through the German Navy, the work of the designated forwarding agents decreased accordingly, and the business of resale of goods back to the Japanese Government followed therewith. The larger part of the various oils in hand were sold through Messrs. Carlowitz & Co., Tokyo to the Mitsui Bussan Kaisha, Ltd., Tokyo whereas all the other goods in hand were sold by Dr. H. H. Woidt to Messrs. Koeki Eidan, Tokyo. Thereto a certain portion of goods were sold to the German Navy, the German Embassy, and the German Association in Japan called the Reichsdeutsche Gemeinschaft, Japan. All payments heretofore were wired to Messrs. Roges G. m. b. H. Berlin, until such time as this also became impossible due to the developments in Germany. Hereafter, all settlement of sales prices were paid into a special "Rueckverkaufs- Konto Roges" to Dr. H. H. Woidt with the Deutsche Bank fuer Ostasien, Tokyo. Full particulars of the various sales contracts are attached.

All sales contracts have been completed and full settlement received with the exception of the following:-

in spite of the fact that all the necessary delivery orders and/or other documents have been already delivered, no settlement has as yet been received for the above. As regards Contract VIII an agreement regarding loss in weight has as yet to be determined. A copy of the contract, both originals of which (English and Japanese) having been burned is attached herewith for reference.

5. Remaining Cargo in Japan

After completion of the various sales contracts for the resale of goods back to the Japanese Government, a certain portion of goods still remained unsold as can be seen from the attached statement. Upon request of Mr. Wohlthat, (after his consultations with the Gaimusho-Imperial Japanese Foreign Ministry) deliveries were made to Koeki Eidan (the Official Japanese Buying and Selling Organization) against receipts for these remaining cargoes in Japan, with the understanding that a settlement should be made at a later date. No acknowledgment has been received from Koeki Eidan regarding some of these cargoes. On the other hand, deliveries have as yet not been completed in full, in consequence of which the said cargo is still under the administration of Mr. Hans Umbhau. (Refer statement showing position of total cargo held in Japan by Hans Umbhau, value unknown, as at 20th September, 1945)

The items given on the attached statement under the caption of "Transit Goods - Property of Third Nationals" are still to be found in Japan. In certain instances the consignees of the respective goods are unknown, nor the shipper of same, or in other words the owner of the cargo in question.

One lot of Auto Tyres & Tubes property of Messrs. Contcomin, Bucharest, Rumania, has, at the request of the Gaimusho (Foreign Ministry Imperial Japanese Government) been delivered to Messrs. Mitsui Bussan Kaisha Ltd., Tokyo in 1943 against letter of guarantee copy of which is attached.

Buero Hans Umbhau has as on 26th September, 1945 filed an assets report with the Finance Ministry of the Imperial Japanese Government, with an additional report dated 6th October, 1945. From the aforementioned it can clearly be seen what unspent funds of ROGES are still carried by Mr. Hans Umbhau. A clear distinction can also be immediately made as to what monies belong to Harry W. Hamacher, Berlin, and what to ROGES. Again, outstandings still due and collectable for and on behalf of ROGES from Messrs. Koeki Eidan, the former German Embassy and the Reichsdeutsche Gemeinschaft can also be seen from the aforementioned reports dated 26th September, 1945 and 6th October, 1945 respectively.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29. --Rep. Dondero, Michigan Republican, said today that a document ~~xxxx~~ removed from secret government files last Spring detailed disposition of Chinese nationalist forces.

He said "it is easy to visualize the consequences of this information in the hands of communist forces in China then and now."

The government in early June charged Philip J. Jaffee of New York, Editor of Amerasia magazine and five others with ~~xxxx~~ conspiring ~~xxxx~~ unlawfully to remove files and records from the state, war and navy departments.

Dondero said Jaffee who later paid a \$2500 fine, conferred prior to his arrest with a representative of the Chinese communists and Earl Browder, former head of the communist party in the United States, and a representative of the Chinese communists at the United Nations conference in San Francisco.

Dondero asked "is there any doubt in anybody's mind what became of the military secrets which Jaffee then possessed as stolen property of our ~~government~~ government."

Our society was founded 1873 (Meiji 6) in Tokyo by German scientists and is a Japanese legal person (shadan hojin) registered with the Ministry of Education. The Society's name translated into English is: „German Society for East-Asiatic Natural History and Ethnography." The place of the organization is Tokyo, Kojimachi-ku, Hirakawa-cho, 2-chome 7, but as the building at this address has been destroyed by the airraid of May 25th 1945, communications should be addressed to the president, Mr. K. Meissner, c/o Leybold K.K., Tokyo, Nihonbashi-ku, Gofukubashi, Tokyo-Tatemono-Building.

The names and addresses of the Society's officers

are:

President : Mr. K. Meissner, address as above.

Messrs. Meissner, Barth and Dr. von Weegmann were not „appointed" but were regularly elected by the members meeting in accordance with the Society bye laws. They have been in office since 1920, 1922 and 1923 respectively.

The society's activities during the 73 years of its existence are described in the attached paper. The most important part of the society's work is the publishing of scientific papers on things Japanese, Chinese and Indonesian.

The Society owes Yen 3,410.75 to the Printing department of the Catholic Salesian Professional School, Tokyo-to, Sugunami-ku, Yasaka-machi, No.90. This is a debt for printing 800 copies of Dr. D. Seckel's paper „Grundzuege der buddhistischen Malerei" (fundamentals of Buddhist Painting.) A specimen of this book is attached to this letter.

The financial means of the Society at present consist of:

- 1) Yen 784.71 deposit in the Yokohama Specie Bank, Tokyo.
- 2) " 2,330.49 Post Cheque Account.
- 3) " 65.12 deposit in the Sumitomo Bank, Tokyo.
- 4) " 1,649.69 deposit in the Deutsche Bank fuer Ostasien, Tokyo.
- 5) "257,750.-- deposit in the Yokohama Specie Bank, Tokyo, due October 31st, 1950 (this is the amount received from the Fire Insurance Company for the Society's buildings destroyed by bombardment and fire)

The Society now asks for permission to withdraw the above deposits from 1) the Yokohama Specie Bank, 2) the Post Cheque Account and 3) the Sumitomo Bank in order to be enabled to pay the invoice of the Printing dept. of the Catholic Salesian Prof. School. The total of these three deposits is not great enough for paying the above debts, but the rest of Yen 330.43 will be covered privately by the Society's officers.

The German Society for East-Asiatic

Natural History and Ethnography

(Die deutsche Gesellschaft fuer Natur- und
Voelkerkunde Ostasiens)

(usual abbreviation "O.A.G." = Ostasiatische Gesellschaft)

The German Society for East-Asiatic Natural History and Ethnography (a Japanese "legal person" (shadan hōjin) registered with the Ministry of Education) retains among the German-created institutions in Japan a unique position in the sense that it has been from the beginning an organization sponsored by scientists and other scientifically inclined private individuals.

In 1873, the society was founded by German scientists who lived at that time in Tokyo. Ever since it has served as a center where Germans, Japanese and citizens of other nations, who were interested in widening and deepening their knowledge of East-Asiatic science, could find contact with resident international Japanologists and take part in their research-work. In the course of the past 73 years the society, besides holding numerous meetings and arranging a great number of lectures, has published 36 volumes of "Mitteilungen" (research-transactions) and 69 small volumes of "Nachrichten" (news-bulletins for members) in addition to 20 supplementary volumes which contain more elaborate and voluminous research-work. The numbers of copies of the society's publications reached 1800. While most of them were destined for its individual members, many were sent in exchange to more than 200 universities, scientific societies and institutions all over the world.

Besides the main office of the society in Tokyo, Kojimachiku, Hirakawacho 2-chome 7, branch-offices existed in Kobe, Batavia (up to 1939), Mukden, Shanghai and Hamburg. The number of members amounted during the last years to more than 1500.

An essential part of the society's activities consisted in the compilation of its library. Unfortunately the greater part fell victim to the nocturnal airraid of May 25th, because it had not been possible to evacuate more than a small portion (the most valuable rarities) of the library. Aside from art-publications, that were difficult to transport, the society lost mainly those publications, that had been acquired, as mentioned above, through exchange with similar scientific international institutions, such as:

Akademie van Wetenschappen, Amsterdam,
Bataviaasch Genootschap van Kunsten en Wetenschappen,
Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago,
Ecole Francaise d'Extreme Orient, Hanoi,
R. Anthropological Society, London (Journal "Man"),
Musee Guimet, Paris,
Academy of Sciences, Philadelphia,
California Academy of Sciences, San Francisco,
North China Branch, R.A.S., Shanghai,
Smithonian Institute, Washington.

Among the Japanese and foreign institutes for cultural research in Tokyo the "Asiatic Society of Japan" stood nearest to us. This found its outward expression in the fact that the latter held its lectures and council meetings in our rooms and in that its library was installed in a special building on our compound. In consequence of the existing cordial relations the leading personalities in either society were simultaneously members of both institutes as shown by the mutual membership of Messrs. J. Barth, K. Meissner, Dr. van Weegmann on our side and Messrs. R.H. van Gulik, Sir George B. Sanson, J.B. Snellen on the part of the Asiatic Society of Japan. The late Prof. Basil Hall Chamberlain was an honorary member of our society.

Whereas world-wide cooperation established the German society's international reputation as a cultural research center its character as a purely scientific institution was recognised also by the Japanese side during the first world-war by the release of its property that had been temporarily impounded.

In order to give those unfamiliar with our publications an idea of their character, some titles of typical publications are given below:
