


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

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SUBJECT:

Proposed SCAP-Japanese Mission to Southeast Asia

1. The Japanese Government has designated the below Japanese representatives as members of a Joint SCAP-Japanese Mission to visit Bangkok, Thailand, and other countries in the Southeast Asia area, on or about 1 July 1951 for approximately 45 days, to determine ways and measure of increasing the flow of essential raw materials to and finished products from Japan:

Toshio Ito, Standards Division, Industrial Technical Agency, Ministry of International Trade and Imustry

Tatsuc Futamura, General Affairs Section, General Affairs Bureau, Japan Export Bank

2. Countries other than Thailand, which may be visited, are:

French Indochina, Malaya, Indonesia, Formosa, Hong-Kong, Sarawak, Brunei, British North Borneo, the Philippine Republic, Burma, India, Pakistan Ceylong.

3. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs is requested to expedite the issuance of passports and to offer such assistance as may be necessary to obtain visas for the countries listed above.

ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR ASIA AND THE FAR EAST

Terms of Reference as adopted at the Fourth Session of the Economic and Social Council, and amended at the Fifth, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Sessions of the Council.

THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

HAVING CONSIDERED the Resolution adopted at the Fifty-fifth Plenary session of the General Assembly on 11 December 1946, namely, that the General Assembly "recommends that, in order to give effective aid to the countries devastated by war, the Economic and Social Council, at its next session, give prompt and favourable consideration to the establishment of an Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East, " and

HAVING NOTED the Report of the Working Group for Asia and the Far East of the Temporary Sub-Commission on Economic Reconstruction of Devastated Areas,

ESTABLISHES AN ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR ASIA AND THE FAR EAST with terms of reference as follows:

- 1. The Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East, acting within the framework of the policies of the United Nations and subject to the general supervision of the Council, shall, provided that the Commission takes no action in respect to any country without the agreement of the Government of that country:
  - (a) initiate and participate in measures for facilitating concerted action for the economic reconstruction of Asia and the Far East, / for raising

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for raising the level of economic activity in Asia and the Far East and for maintaining and strengthening the economic relations of these areas both among themselves and with other countries of the world:

- (b) make or sponsor such investigations and studies of economic and technological problems and development within territories of Asia and the Far East as the Commission deems appropriate;
- (c) undertake or sponsor the collection, evaluation and dissemination of such economic, technological and statistical information as the Commission deems appropriate.
- 2. The territories of Asia and the Far East referred to in paragraph 1 shall include, in the first instance, British North Borneo, Brunei and Sarawak Burma, Ceylon, China, India, Indo-Chinese Federation, Hong Kong, Korea, Federation of Malaya and Singapore, Nepal, Netherlands Indies (now Indonesia) Pakistan, Philippine Republic and Siam. (1)
- 3. The members of the Commission shall, in the first instance, consist of Australia, China, France, India, Netherlands, Philippine Republic, Siam, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom and United States of america, provided that any state in the area which may hereafter become a member of the United Nations shall be thereupon admitted as a member of the Commission

/3A.(i) Any

(1) Nepal and Korea were included in the territory by resolutions of the Economic and Social Council at its seventh and eighth sessions respectively. With the partition of India, Pakistan became a territory within the scope of this

paragraph.
(2) New Zealand was admitted as a member of the Commission by the Economic and Social Council at its sixth session. Under this proviso Pakistan and Burma became members of the Commission when they were admitted into the United Nations.

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34.(i) Any of the following territories, namely North Borneo, Brunei and Sarawak, Burma, Ceylon, the Indo-Chinese Federation, Hong Kong, Korea, Federation of Malaya and Singapore, Nepal and Netherlands Indies, or any part or group of such territories, (3) may on presentation of its application to the Commission by the member responsible for the international relations of such territory, part or group of territories, be admitted by the Commission as an associate member of the Commission. (4) If it has become responsible for its own international relations, such territory, part or group of territories may be admitted as an associate member of the Commission on itself presenting its application to the Commission.

- (ii) Representatives of associate members shall be entitled to participate without vote in all meetings of the Commission, whether sitting as Commission or as Committee of the Whole.
- (iii) Representatives of associate members shall be eligible to be appointed as members of any committee, or other subordinate body, which may be set up by the Commission and shall be eligible to hold office in such body.

/ (iv) Any

by the Economic and Social Council at its eighth session.

(4) The Economic and Social Council at its fifth session passed a resolution

requesting members of the Commission concerned to forward such applications to the Commission.

Associate Members so far admitted are Ceylon, Hong Kong, Malaya and British Borneo Group, the Kingdom of Cambodia and the Kingdom of Laos, Nepal, the Republic of Indonesia, and the "rest of Indonesia."

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- (iv) Any territory or part or group of territories mentioned in paragraph 3A (i) which is not a member or an associate member. of the Commission may, with the concurrence of the member responsible for its international relations, be invited by the Commission to participate in a consultative capacity in the consideration of any matter of particular concern to that territory, part or group of territories.
- 4. The Commission is empowered to make recommendations on any matters within its competence directly to the governments of members or associate members concerned, governments admitted in consultative capacity, and the specialized agencies concerned. The Commission shall submit for the Council's prior consideration any of its proposals for activities that would have important effects on the economy of the world as a whole.
- 5. The Commission shall invite any member of the United Nations not a member of the Commission to participate in a consultative capacity in its consideration of any matter of particular concern to that non-member.
- 6. The Commission may consult with the representatives of the control authority in Japan and may be consulted by such representatives for the purpose of mutual information and advice on matters concerning the economy of Japan in relation to the rest of the economy of Asia and the Far East.
- 7. The Commission shall invite representatives of specialized agencies and may invite representatives of any inter-governmental organisations to participate in a consultative capacity in its consideration of any matter of particular concern to that agency or organization, following the practice of the Economic and Social Council.

/ 8. The Commission

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- 8. The Commission shall take measures to ensure that the necessary liaison is maintained with other organs of the United Nations and with the specialized agencies.
- 9. The Commission may, after discussion with any specialized agency functioning in the same general field, and with the approval of the Council, establish such subsidiary bodies as it deems appropriate, for facilitating the carrying out of its responsibilities.
- 10. The Commission shall adopt its own rules of procedure, including the method of selecting its Chairman.
- 11. The Commission shall submit to the Council a full report on its activities and plans, including those of any subsidiary bodies, once a year. (5)
- 12. The administrative budget of the Commission shall be financed from the funds of the United Nations.
- 13. The Secretary-General of the United Nations shall appoint the staff of the Commission, which shall form part of the Secretariat of the United Nations.
- 14. The headquarters of the Commission shall be located at the seat of the office of the United Nations in Asia and the Far East. Until such time as the sign of the office of the United Nations in Asia and the Far East shall be determined, the temporary headquarters of the Commission shall remain in Shanghai.
- 15. Not later than 1951 the Council shall make a special review of the work of the Commission with a view to determining whether the Commission should be the continued, and if continued what modification if any should be made in its terms of reference.

ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR ASIA AND THE FAR EAST

#### RULES OF PROCEDURE

As drawn up at the first session, confirmed and adopted at the second session, and amended at the third, fifth, sixth and seventh sessions of the Commission

#### CHAPTER I - SESSIONS

#### Rule 1

Sessions of the Commission shall be held

- (a) on dates fixed by the Commission, after consultation with the Executive Secretary, at previous meetings;
- (b) within forty-five days of the communication to the Executive Secretary of a request to that effect by the Economic and Social Council;
- (c) at the request of the majority of the members of the Commission, after consultation with the Executive Secretary;
- (d) on such other occasions as the Chairman, in consultation with the Vice-Chairman and the Executive Secretary, deems necessary.

#### Rule 2

Sessions shall ordinarily be held at the Office of the United Nations in Asia and the Far East. The Commission may, with the concurrence of the Secretary-General, decide to hold a particular session elsewhere.

### Rule 3

The Executive Secretary shall, at least thirty-five days before the commencement of a session, distribute a notice of the opening date of the / session,

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session, together with three copies of the provisional agenda and of the basic documents relating to each item appearing on the provisional agenda. Distribution shall be similar to that under Rule 45.

#### Rule 4

The Commission shall invite any Member of the United Nations not a member of the Commission to participate in a consultative capacity in its consideration of any matter of particular concern to that Member.

CHAPTER II - AGENDA

#### Rule 5

The provisional agenda for each session shall be drawn up by the Executive Secretary in consultation with the Chairman.

#### Rule 6

The provisional agenda for any session shall include:

- (a) Items arising from previous sessions of the Commission;
- (b) Items proposed by the Economic and Social Council;
- (c) Items proposed by any member of the Commission;
- (d) Items proposed by a specialized agency in accordance with the agreements of relationship concluded between the United Nations and such agencies;
- (e) Items proposed by non-governmental organizations in Category A, subject to the provisions of Clause 6A; and
- (f) Any other items which the Chairman or the Executive Secretary sees fit to include

#### Rule 6A

Non-governmental organizations in Category  $\Lambda$  may propose items on matters within their competence for the provisional agenda of the Commission subject to the following conditions:

/ (a) An organization

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- (a) an organization which intends to propose such an item shall inform the Executive Secretary at least sixty-three days before the commencement of the session, and before formally proposing an item shall give due consideration to any comments he may make;
- (b) The proposal shall be formally submitted with the relevant basic documentation not less than forty-nine days before the commencement of the session.

#### Rule 7

The first item upon the provisional agenda for each session shall . See the adoption of the agenda.

#### Rule 8

The Commission may amend the agenda at any time.

CHAPTER III - REPRESENTATION AND CREDENTIALS

#### Rule 9

Each member shall be represented on the Commission by an accredited representative.

#### Rule 10

A representative may be accompanied to the sessions of the Commission by alternate representatives and advisers and, when absent, he may be replaced by an alternate representative.

#### Rule 11

The credentials of each representative appointed to the Commission, together with a designation of alternate representatives, shall be submitted to the Executive Secretary without delay.

#### Rule 12

The Chairman and the Vice-Chairman shall examine the credentials and report upon them to the Commission.

/ CHAPTER IV

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#### CHAPTER IV - OFFICERS

#### Rule 13

The Commission shall, at its first meeting of each year, elect from among its representatives a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman who shall hold office until their successors are elected. They shall be eligible for re-election. Rule 14

If the Chairman is absent from a meeting, or any part thereof, the Vice-Chairman shall preside.

#### Rule 15

If the Chairman ceases to represent a member of the Commission, or is so incapacitated that he can no longer hold office, the Vice-Chairman shall become Chairman for the unexpired parties of the term. In that case, or if the Vice-Chairman ceases to represent a member of the Commission, or is so incapacitated that he can no longer hold office, the Commission shall elect another Vice-Chairman for the unexpired portion of the term.

#### Rule 16

The Vice-Chairman acting as Chairman shall have the same powers and duties as the Chairman.

#### Rule 17

The Chairman or the Vice-Chairman acting as Chairman shall participate in the meetings of the Commission as such and not as the representative of the member by whom he was accredited. The Commission shall admit an alternate representative to represent that member in the meetings of the Commission and to exercise its right to vote.

/ CHAPTER V

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#### CHAPTER V - SECRETARIAT

#### Rule 18

The Executive Secretary shall act in that capacity at all meetings of the Commission and of its sub-commissions, other subsidiary bodies and committees. He may appoint another member of the staff to take his place at any meeting.

#### Rule 19

The Executive Secretary or his representative may at any meeting make either oral or written statements concerning any question under consideration.

Rule 20

The Executive Secretary shall direct the staff provided by the Secretary-General and required by the Commission, its sub-commissions, and any other subsidiary bodies and committees.

### Rule 21

The Executive Secretary shall be responsible for the necessary arrangements being made for meetings.

#### Rule 22

The Executive Secretary in carrying out his functions shall act on behalf of the Secretary-General.

CHAPTER VI - CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

#### Rule 23

 $\boldsymbol{A}$  majority of the members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum.

#### Rule 24

In addition to exercising the powers conferred upon him elsewhere / by these rules,

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by these rules, the Chairman shall declare the opening and closing of each meeting of the Commission, shall direct the discussion, ensure the observance of these rules, and shall accord the right to speak, put questions to the vote and announce decisions. The Chairman may also call a speaker to order if his remarks are not relevant to the subject under discussion.

#### Rule 25

During the discussion of any matter a representative may raise a point of order. In this case the Chairman shall immediately state his ruling. If it is challenged, the Chairman shall forthwith submit his ruling to the Commission for decision and it shall stand unless overruled. Rule 26

During the discussion of any matter a representative may move the adjournment of the debate. Any such motion shall have priority. In addition to the proposer of the motion, one representative shall be allowed to speak in favour of, and one representative against the motion. Rule 27

A representative may at any time move the closure of the debate whether or not any other representative has signified his wish to speak.

Not more than two representatives may be granted permission to speak against the closure.

#### Rule 28

The Chairman shall take the sense of the Commission on a motion for closure. If the Commission is in favour of the closure, the Chairman shall declare the debate closed.

#### Rule 29

The Commission may limit the time allowed to each speaker.

Rule 29/1

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#### Rule 29A

Upon the request of any member, any motion and amendment thereto made by any speaker shall be given to the Chairman in writing and shall be read by him before any further speaker is called upon and also immediately before a vote is taken on such motion or amendment. The Chairman may direct that any motion or amendment be circulated to the members present before a vote is taken.

This rule shall not apply to formal motions such as one for closure or adjournment.

#### Rule 30

Principal motions and resolutions shall be put to the vote in the order of their submission unless the Commission decides otherwise. Rule 31

When an amendment revises, adds to or deletes from a proposal, the amendment shall be put to the vote first, and if it is adopted, the amended proposal shall then be put to the vote.

#### Rule 32

If two or more amendments are moved to a proposal, the Commission shall vote first on the amendment furthest removed in substance from the original proposal, then, if necessary, on the amendment next furthest removed and so on, until all the amendments have been put to the vote.

#### Rule 33

The Commission may, at the request of a representative, decide to put a motion or resolution to the vote in parts. If this is done, the text resulting from the series of votes shall be put to the vote as a whole.

/ CHAPTER VII

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#### CHAPTER VII - VOTING

#### Rule 34

Each member of the Commission shall have one vote.

#### Rule 35

Decisions of the Commission shall be made by a majority of the numbers present and voting.

#### Rule 36

The Commission shall take no action in respect of any country without the agreement of the government of that country.

#### Rule 37

The Commission shall normally vote by show of hands. If any representative requests a roll call, a roll call shall be taken in the English alphabetical order of the names of the members.

#### Rule 38

All elections shall be decided by secret ballot.

### Rulo 39

If a vote is equally divided upon matters other than elections, a secon vote shall be taken at the next meeting. If this vote also results in equality the proposal shall be regarded as rejected.

CHAPTER VIII - LANGUAGES

#### Rule 40

English and French shall be the working languages of the Commission.

#### Rule 41

Specches made in one of the working languages shall be interpreted / into the

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into the other working language.

CHAPTER IX - RECORD

#### Rule 42

Summary records of the nectings of the Commission shall be kept by the Secretariat. They shall be sent as soon as possible to the representatives of members and to the representatives of any other government agency or organization which participated in the neeting concerned. Such representatives she inform the Secretariat not later than seventy-two hours after the circulation of any summary of any changes they wish to have made. Any disagreement concerning such changes shall be referred to the Chairman whose decision shall be fine Rule 43.

The corrected version of the surmary records of public meetings shall be distributed as soon as possible in accordance with the usual practice of the United Nations. This shall include distribution to non-governmental organizations in Category A and to the appropriate non-governmental organizations in Category B and on the Register, and on appropriate occasions to consultative members.

#### Rule 44

The corrected version of the surmary records of private meetings shall be distributed as soon as possible to the members of the Commission, to any consultative member participating in the meeting concerned, and to the specialized agencies. They shall be distributed to all the Members of the United Nations if and when the Commission so decides.

#### Rule 45

As soon as possible the text of all reports, resolutions,

/ recommendations and

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recommendations and other formal decisions made by the Commission, its subcommissions or other subsidiary bodies and its committees shall be communica
to the members of the Commission, to the consultative members concerned, to
all other Members of the United Nations, to the specialized agencies, and to the
non-governmental organizations in Category A and to the appropriate nongovernmental organizations in Category B and on the Register.

CHAPTER X - PUBLICITY OF MEETINGS

#### Rule 46

The meetings of the Commission shall ordinarily be held in public. The Commission may decide that a particular meeting or meetings shall be held in private.

CHAPTER XI - RELATIONS WITH NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS

#### Rule 47

Non-governmental organizations in categories A and B and on the Register may designate authorized representatives to sit as observers at public meetin of the Commission. The Executive Secretary will circulate to the members are associate members of the Commission written statements and suggestions submitted by Category A organizations on matters within their competence. Non-governmental organizations in Category B and on the Register may submit such statements and suggestions to the Executive Secretary, who will prepare and distribute at each session of the Commission a list of such communications briefly indicating the substance of each. Upon the request of any member or associate member of the Commission, the Executive Secretary will distribute the full text of any such communication.

Rule 48

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#### Rule 48

The Commission may consult with non-governmental organizations in Categories A and B and on the Register on matters in which the Commission regards these organizations as having special competence or knowledge. Such consultations may be arranged either on the invitation of the Commission or upon the request of the organization. In the case of non-governmental organizations in category A, consultations should normally be held with the Commissic itself. The Commission may consult with organizations in Category B and on the Register either directly or through a committee or committees established for that purpose.

CHAPTER XII - SUB-COMMISSIONS, OTHER SUBSIDIARY BODIES AND COMMITTEES

#### Rulo 49

After discussion with any specialized agency functioning in the same general field, and with the approval of the Economic and Social Council, the Commission may establish such continually acting sub-commissions or other subsidiary bodies as it does necessary for the performance of its functions and shall define the powers and composition of each of them. Such autonomy as may be necessary for the effective discharge of the technical responsibilities laid upon them may be delegated to them.

#### Rule 50

The Commission may establish such committees and sub-committees as it deems necessary to assist it in carrying out its tasks.

#### Rule 51

Sub-cormissions or other subsidiary bodies and committees and

/ sub-committees shall

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sub-committees shall adopt their own rules of procedure unless otherwise decide by the Commission.

#### CHAPTER XIII - REPORTS

#### Rule 52

The Commission shall submit to the Economic and Social Council a full report on its activities and plans, including those of any subsidiary bodies, (once a year.

### CHAPTER XIV - AMENDMENTS AND SUSPENSIONS

#### Rulc 53

Any of these rules of procedure may be amended or suspended by the ... Commission provided that the proposed amendments or suspensions do not attem, to set aside the terms of reference laid down by the Economic and Social Council.

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#### CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM NO.36 REV. 2

To: All Members of the Staff

Subject: INFORMATION ON COMMUNICATIONS TO GOVERNMENTS

Attached is a revised list of member and associate member countries, with other related information concerning the despatch of official correspondence (e.g. invitations to conferences) and other communications to the governments. (N.B.- not to individual departments).

- 1) The first column shows the names of member and associate member countries as well as non-member participating governments.
- 2) The second column shows the address of the government at its seat, which is to be typed on each communication addressed to the government.
- 3) The third column shows the Liaison Officer, or acting Liaison Officer, who is to receive copies (number indicated in brackets) of the communications. In some cases, the Liaison Officer also acts as a channel for such communications, i.e. communications addressed to the government at its seat are sent to the Liaison Officer for forwarding (see column five).
- 4) The fourth column shows the official at the Embassy, Consulate or Legation in Bangkok who receives copies of communications and, in some cases, acts as a channel for them in the same manner as indicated in the above paragraph (see column five).
- 5) The fifth column shows the method of despatch of correspondence and documents (e.g. in the case of India, the original communication addressed to the Hon. Minister for External Affairs, the two copies for Mr. T.J. Natarajan and the one copy for Mr. S.K. Roy, all go to Mr. S.K. Roy at the Indian Legation in Bangkok for onward transmittal).

The Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East,

- 1. Recommends the Economic and Social Council to amend the terms of reference of the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East as adopted at the Fourth Session of the Economic and Social Council on 28 March 1947 and amended finally at the Session of the Council on ...... 1951 so as to include Japan in the territories referred to in section 2 of the said terms of reference, and to insert the word "Japan" between Ceylon and the Indo-Chinese Federation referred to in section 3A (i) thereof,
- 2. My dear Mr. Togo,

You will recall that when I was in Japan the question was put to me as to whether it would be possible for the Commission to consider the admission of Japan as associate member at the eighth session itself after the proposal of the Pakistan Government recommending to the Economic and Social Council the amendment of Paragraph 2 and 3(a)(i) as approved by the Commission.

I am now in a position to state that the suggested procedure is not impossible. In other words, if the Pakistan resolution is adopted in the Commission asking the Economic and Social Council to amend Paragraph 2 of the terms of reference, another resolution might be adopted stating that should the Council adopt a resolution approving the Commission's resolution on the terms of reference Japan will be admitted as of the date of the Council's resolution as an associate member of the Commission.

For this procedure to be adopted, however, it would be essential for the Commission to have an application signed by the Minister for Foreign Affairs, requesting the Commission to admit Japan as an associate member, so that immediately after the Pakistan resolution is adopted this application might be presented to the Commission for action. The resolution referred to here is the resolution contained in document E/CN.11/328, a copy of which is herewith enclosed.

I need hardly add that all these are entirely for the Commission to decide and my letter is intended to clarify the procedure but in no way to anticipate the decisions of the Commission.

### AMENDMENT TO ECAFE'S TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR CLOSER ASSOCIATION OF JAPAN WITH THE COMMISSION.

The ECOSOC at its fifth session held in July, 1947, amended the terms of reference of the ECAFE to permit mutual consultation between the representatives of the control authorities in Japan and the Commission on matters of mutual interest. The Commission's Secretariat in the fourth and subsequent sessions of the Commission and its Committee had submitted several reports on Japan's economic potentialities, and had stressed the need for the realisation of the objective of mutual co-operation between Japan and the countries of the region for the expansion of Japan's potential in the production or capital goods for export in exchange for raw materials available from the countries of the region. The member governments of the ECAFE have paid continued attention to the possibilities of maximising trade with Japan, as the importance of Japan's industrial potential in relation to the economic development of the Asian countries is patent as is also Japan's need of raw materials for the rehabilitation of its own economy. The change in the international status of Japan arising from the recent Peace Treaty with this country make it necessary to reconsider the question of future consultations between the ECAFE and Japan. It is indispensible that the mutual co-operation, which has been established between Japan and the countries of the region by consultations referred to above, should be continued and intensified. Pakistan is confident that the governments, which are represented on the Commission, would welcome Japan's closer association and active co-operation in efforts to achieve the economic advancement of the countries in Asia and the Far East. To attain such association and co-operation, Pakistan recommends that the Commission do approve an amendment to paragraph 2 of the terms of reference of the Commission to include Japan in the list of territories mentioned in this

paragraph, and to effect any other consequential changes arising and necessary to bring Japan within the geographical scope of the Commission and to request the ECOSOC to approve the amendments effected in the terms of reference of the Commission. One of the consequential changes that may arise would be the need to delete para 10 of the terms of reference adopted at the Seventh Session of the Commission to enable Japan to associate and achieve membership of the Commission. in due course in its own right and in keeping with its sovereign position attained with the signing of the Peace Treaty at San Francisco on 8th September, 1951.
